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
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### **Executive summary**

"CHILDLINE Calling is India Listening", presents an analysis of ChildNET data for the year 2007-08. This publication aims to showcase the nature of calls, the type of intervention, the profile of callers and the status of the CHILDLINE service in India.

Although the data analyses the performance of CHILDLINE on a few basic parameters, it offers important feedback about the impact of the service, users of the service, the reasons for calling CHILDLINE, experiences of abuse faced by children and the nature of intervention provided by CHILDLINE. It provides the building blocks for more in-depth research and analysis on the status of children in India, particularly in the area of child protection.

**INTERVENTION CASES:** Intervetion involves reaching out to children and providing SOS assistance of linking children to services available for long term care.



Some of the key observations regarding the data based on ChildNET for the period 2007-08 are outlined below.

#### The data reveals the type of assistance provided by CHILDLINE Nationally

- **Medical 7389 (16%):** Out of the total 7389 medical calls, OPD 48%, first aid 37%, hospitalisation 9%, casualty/accident 4% and other medical assistance.
- Shelter 5466 (12%): 31% were abandoned children, who were provided shelter, 29% children had left home and, hence required a place to stay, 25% children had their parents/guardians of the children seeking assistance for shelter of their children. While the remaining 5% of the children needed shelter because they had left their previous shelter.
- Restoration 6320 (14%): Children living outside their own city, who knew their address and wanted to return home, accounted for 55% of the total cases. 23% of the children lived in their city and knew their residential address and wanted CHILDLINE help to return home.
- **Missing Children 5023 (11%):** Parents who contacted the CHILDLINE team, to report their child missing made up 65%, while children who were found and identified themselves as missing comprised of 34%.
- **Protection from abuse 2978 (6%):** Of the total intervention cases for protection from abuse, 91% of children were provided protection from physical abuse, as compared to 6% from sexual abuse and 2% from financial abuse.

- **Death Related 39 (<1%):** 43% of the total cases were death due to natural causes, 35% were death due to accidents and 22% deaths were recorded under suspicious circumstances. These were mainly of street children
- Sponsorship 3054 (7%): 63% cases were for sponsorship of education and 24% for sponsorship of health.
- Emotional Support and Guidance 14196 (30%): CHILDLINE received the most number of calls from children asking for counselling were maximum number of calls were from children themselves (36%), concerning problems related to studies (27%), family (21%), love relationship (9%).
- Other Child Related Issues 2172 (5%): CHILDLINE also received calls concerning other child rights
  violations such as calls related to paedophilia, trafficking, child marriages and children affected by natural
  disasters.
- Information Calls(305806): These are calls seeking information on variety of issues as well as contact details. CHILDLINE team uses our extensive Resource Directory to answer. These calls are not "Cases" and no cases form are filled up in ChildNET for these calls. The intervention for these calls is closed over the telephone.

#### Profile of the child assisted:

- The data highlights that CHILDLINE reaches out to
  - Maximum number of children in the age group of 11-15 years (46%)
  - 68% Males and 32% Females
  - 84% Children who are living with their families.

### Caller to the helpline

- Profile of the caller: As an emergency helpline and outreach service CHILDLINE receives calls from various types of callers. The data highlights that 30% of calls are made by children either for themselves or to refer a friend, while 70% of the calls come from concerned adults
- **Time of calls**: The data indicates that one-fourth of the calls are made between 06:00 pm to 10:00 am (evening hours), emphasising the importance of a 24-hour phone service. However majority of the calls come during office morning hours and only a sixth of all calls come after midnight.
- **Place of calls**: The places from where calls were made mainly include Residential areas 24%, Slum/Chawls 16%, and Railway Stations and telephone booths 15% each.

## The data reveals the type of assistance provided by CHILDLINE in each of the zones

• North: 30% of the total intervention cases are for counselling, while medical and missing account for 20% each.

• South: 45% of the total intervention cases are for counselling, while shelter and restoration account for 15% each.

• East : 50% of the intervention cases are for counselling and medical assistance, while missing and restoration account for 16% each.

• West : 60% of the total calls are for counselling with 12% of medical cases.

As each city attempts to reach the most marginalised groups within the city, the nature of calls differ across the country. The second outlines the calls received by each city operating the 1098 service.

### 1. OVERVIEW OF CHILDLINE

#### 1.1 What is CHILDLINE?

CHILDLINE 1098 evolved from a need expressed by street children in Mumbai for a service that would be accessible to them whenever they needed it and one that they could be partners in. A service which not only responded to their needs but also advocated for their rights. This paved the way for CHILDLINE, the 24-hour emergency outreach service for children in need of care and protection in India. Any child/concerned adult can dial 1098 to access this service.

This model of service was initiated as a field action project of the Department of Family and Child Welfare, Tata Institute of Social Sciences Mumbai, in June 1996. This was in response to a situation marked by lack of an emergency service for children, restricted outreach of existing organisation and adhoc role of allied systems in child protection.

CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF) was founded in 1999 after initiating and running this service for Mumbai city from inception. Based on the partnership model, CIF is the nodal organisation for CHILDLINE service across the country. The goal of CIF is to reach out to marginalised children in need of care and protection, through telephones, outreach in the community.

Currently operational in 82 cities of India spread across 25 states, CHILDLINE 1098 receives over 2 million calls each year. CHILDLINE 1098 is one of the world's single largest children's helpline service and receives 20% of all children's calls on helplines working worldwide. As of October end, 2008, CHILDLINE has responded to over 14 million calls, and has the long term goal of reaching out to every child in distress in each city/district of India.

## 1.2 Target audience

CHILDLINE works with marginalised children from various cities/districts. This includes

- Street children and youth living alone on the street
- Emotionally disturbed child,
- · Child labourers especially in the unorganised sector
- Children who have been abused
- Child victims of the flesh trade
- Differently able children
- Child addicts, children in conflicts with the law,
- Children in institutions
- Mentally ill children,
- Children affected by HIV/AIDS
- Children affected by conflicts or disasters
- Child political refugees and
- Children whose families are in crisis.

## 1.3 Structure of CHILDLINE at the city level


Every city, where the CHILDLINE service is running, has a similar structure, as well as a uniform process in which it assesses the needs of the children, develops a resource directory of organisations in the city, ensures the phones are ringing and provides training to the new team. CHILDLINE functions through a network of NGOs, academic institutions, the corporate sector and the allied systems.

- CHILDLINE Advisory Board (CAB), comprises of senior level functionaries from the allied systems, NGOs, concerned individuals, media etc. It is the policy making body for CHILDLINE at the city level and it undertakes periodic review of the CHILDLINE service.
- The Nodal Organisation, is essentially an academic institution which ensures coordination, training, research, documentation, awareness and advocacy.
- The Collaborative Organisation, is the 24-hour service for children, which responds to the calls on 1098, provides emergency intervention if required, links the children to the services for ultimate rehabilitation, conducts awareness and outreach programmes and documents every call that comes into CHILDLINE and the intervention or follow up done.

- The Support Organisation, responds to calls referred by the collaborative organisation, conducts awareness and outreach programmes,.
- Resource Organisations, act as referral centres for CHILDLINE. They also participate in outreach and awareness programmes for CHILDLINE.

CHILDLINE has thus evolved into a partnership between children, the Government, NGOs academic organisations and the community, at the city and national levels, to respond to the concerns of marginalised groups of children.

CHILDLINE's comprehensive strategy to bring about systemic change by creating child friendly systems has yielded astonishing results. CHILDLINE works with the system and its processes on behalf of the child to reach the goal of a safe child friendly environment. Hence, impact and change are processes that take a considerable amount of time and call for perseverance. It is the surest way to ensure a long-term solution.



## 1.4 CHILDLINE 1098 - How it works

## The intervention methodology

A call coming into a CHILDLINE centre, is attended to, by one of the team members who work in shifts. This ensures that the calls are attended for all the 24 hours. Depending on the nature of the call, be it by a child or an adult, the team member will respond to it, either by going to meet the child first and then linking him or her to medical help, shelter, restoration, protection from abuse or providing intensive counselling as required.

If the team member feels that he will not be able to reach the child soon then assistance from a support organisation that is located in the vicinity of the caller, is sought. After the emergency is addressed the next step is to link the child with long-term rehabilitation. This involves referral and networking with other organisations providing specialised services. The children's participation is an integral component in this process from response to rehabilitation.

CHILDLINE India plays the role of a link between service providers (government, non-government) and children in need of care and protection. All CHILDLINE intervention aims to bring children out of emergency situations, provide options for long term rehabilitation and then link them to appropriate agencies to ensure the same. The period of CHILDLINE intervention may vary from a few hours to a few days, and in the case of some children may stretch to years.

CHILDLINE shares a vibrant and dynamic relationship with the children it works with, Ingrained in its daily functioning, is grassroot outreach and interaction with children. Monthly Open House, an open forum for children to share feedback about the functioning of the service, as well as share their issues and concerns for themselves, is critical to the functioning of CHILDLNE. City mapping,

an extensive exercise to highlight high risk areas where children are prone to abuse, and child protection resources, enables CHILDLINE to prioritise and reach out more effectively. Children and youth identify with CHILDLINE and often offer their services as volunteers. They play a critical large role in creating awareness about the CHILDLINE service and work as informers who inform CHILDLINE about children in need of assistance. Many of these children and youth grow into the CHILDLINE system and find themselves a space in the CHILDLINE centres as paid volunteers or team members. Some success stories have been annexed. A publication, "Voices of the Street", highlights some CHILDLINE interventions.

CHILDLINE works at three levels, functioning as a catalyst to effect systemic change.

At the micro level it responds to children on the 1098 helpline, providing them emergency assistance and then linking them to agencies/family for long term rehabilitation.

At the mezzo level, CHILDLINE works with the local system comprising state governments, municipal corporations, district administrative units, village panchayats, community groups voluntary agencies and academic institutions to create child friendly systems.

At the macro level, CHILDLINE works as a catalyst bringing the government, the corporate sector and voluntary agencies together to bridge gaps in the services, address policy gaps, increase budgetary allocations and explore the adaptation of technology for child protection mechanism in India. It envisages a cohesive child protection force comprising the state, corporate sector, voluntary agencies and the community working together to ensure each child his/her right to protection.



# 2. CHILDLINE Calling... Is India Listening

## 2.1 About the publication

CHILDLINE Calling... Is India Listening, April 2007- March 2008, is CHILDLINE India Foundation's third annual compilation of data from CHILDLINE partners across 76 cities in India. This publication, presents comprehensive data voicing the concerns of children that can enable CHILDLINE to advocate before policy makers for ensuring child rights. This publication provides valuable information about: child helplines and the children who contact them, the profile of the caller and/or the concerned child and the reasons why children call. This document demonstrates the effectiveness of CHILDLINE as a strategy towards child protection and demonstrates the various methods used to reach out to children, especially the most marginalised children.

## 2.2 Objectives of this publication

#### • Compile the data available on the calls to 1098:

The primary objective of this publication is to compile the data received by CHILDLINE across the country. At times our CHILDLINE partners have faced problems in documenting calls on the ChildNET software, and hence there has been variation in actual calls received and the data entered into the software. This publication aims to present an overview of the status of CHILDLINE in India by examining the nature of calls and the profile of caller to the service.

## Identify trends in calls at the National, Zonal and City level:

This publication seeks to continue the process of analysing the data by identifying and highlighting trends in the calls to the services. This data would also provide the inputs for helplines and organisations working with the children to advocate for services and for the Governments at the centre and states to identify the information needs for policy formulation and programme development. ChildNET brings out the regional variations and is able to identify specific problems and interventions related to specific cities. In the past few years additional comparative data are available as CHILD Helpline International that compiles information on use of child helplines across the globe also uses the information compiled by ChildNET.

#### Assist in evaluating the impact of the service

The publication also aims to provide data to assist in assessing the impact of the service and to identify strategies to strengthen the functioning of the service. It must be noted that CHILDLINE is an emergency response helpline and therefore, records of calls from children in distress reflect immediate action taken to link children to other organisations for long term assistance and rehabilitation. Upon such referrals, children move out of the purview of CHILDLINE service. CHILDLINE India Foundation aims to publish CHILDLINE Calling... Is India Listening annually to provide a comprehensive and more topical data which can be used by the individual CHILDLINES to look at the emerging issues and interventions required. This can provide direction to programme planning for partner organisations.

## 2.3 Features of ChildNET

ChildNET is a java based software package developed by Tata Consultance Services (TCS) for CHILDLINE, which classifies, records and allows for the follow-up of calls received on 1098. The written documentation is then translated onto the computer software package. The software is installed in CHILDLINE call centre. The CHILDLINE teams follow a series of drop-down menus, and pictures to record and track every call received. At regular intervals, each centre uploads their data via the Internet to the central server based at CIF in Mumbai. The local data is aggregated into national statistics; analysed, and feedback given to cities as value added information that could inform local and national policy. ChildNET makes it possible to study the patterns of calls: trends in child protection, hot spots of abuse and exploitation in the country, the quality and timelines of response and action by the various stakeholders of child care and protection.

### 2.4 The process of compiling this publication

In 2008, CIF had requested CHILDLINE partners to send photocopies of Intervention forms (documentation forms for Intervention cases) so that a national trend analysis on calls could be compiled for the year 2007-08. Data were used from two sources, namely

- a) Data sent in the Monthly reports: Each city compiles a monthly report of the calls received and emails this to CIF. This data consists of a break up of calls and highlight significant case studies of calls which were responded to by the respective CHILDLINEs.
- b) Data entered into ChildNET software: Significant calls, which are recorded in the monthly report, are then entered into the ChildNET package by the cities and is uploaded

at regular intervals by them. However, some cities, where the software is not installed, photocopy of the intervention cases sheets were send to CIF, who then appoint and trained data entry operators who entered the data in the package. On completion of the data entry, reports were sent to the respective cities for their perusal.

## 2.5 The data used in compiling the publication

The total number of calls received is always much larger than the intervention calls. However, for trend analysis only intervention calls are taken into account.

The intervention calls documented from the monthly reports received by 76 CHILDLINE Nationally amounted to 86,019 calls in 2007-08, whereas, the total number of calls reported by ChildNET were 46637 for the same period, representing approximately over 60% of the total intervention calls documented in ChildNET as compared to monthly report. Veriation in figures reported in Monthly reports and ChildNET is due to a variety of factors: The team member expressed difficulty in getting information from the caller especially in cases where counselling was provided hence the basic details were noted in the register whereas information captured in ChildNET requires complete case file to be filled for each intervetion case.


This publication is based on the analysis of this sample of calls captured by ChildNET for the period April 2007-08.

A comparison of the total calls to CHILDLINE and the sample from ChildNET is outlined below.


As indicated in table the ChildNET data are largely representative of the total calls received during the period with almost 35-40% difference in the category of medical, shelter, restoration and missing.



It is important to note that this publication analyses only the intervention related calls recorded in ChildNET.

In addition to intervention calls, CHILDLINE nationally has received 3,05,806 calls in 2007-08, as pointed out in table 1.2, caller's seeking information about CHILDLINE and services for children such as adoption services, vocational training courses, boarding homes, child guidance clinic's and this information is passed on to callers over the telephone.

CHILDLINE has received 3,93,952 calls in 2007-08 classified as silent calls. These are calls where the caller has chosen not to speak. The CHILDLINE team member plays an active role in providing information about the service as well as assuring and encouraging the caller to speak whenever she/he feels comfortable. Similarly in the past few years, the number of black calls gave gone up due to the technical connectivity problems. CHILDLINE has received 51,199 calls for follow-up of cases.

### 2.6 Limitations of this publication

This publication has some limitations largely due to some inadequacy in the data, since all data have not been captured onto the package. Several fields in the documentation form have been left blank and hence a large number shows as not documented. In certain cases, the child or caller has not disclosed enough information and hence these details could not be documented. Additionally the teams give greater priority to responding to calls than rather documenting each case in detail.

**Note**: Calls received by CHILDLINE cities are compiled and sent to CIF in a monthly report, along with other activities and tasks undertaken is then sent by CIF with comments and suggestion.

#### 2.7 The way forward

Feedback from the CHILDLINE teams and analysis of data over the past few years, brought to our notice that certain problems and vulnerabilities amongst children like trafficking of children where CHILDLINEs intervene need to be highlighted. The first intervention format documented the problem for which child called and the first intervention provided by the CHILDLINE. However, the successive interventions provided to the same child were often not reflected in the aggregate call classification. Hence, after research and debate at various levels in CHILDLINE a modified intervention form has been introduced from January 2009.

The process changes included using simpler term, capturing multiple interventions and other issues related to child protection are addressed.

Experts from statistical field were appointed who studied the whole process of documentation at CHILDLINE and along with CIF, designed the new intervention form which was first piloted in selected cities. The data base was compiled and analysed by CIF and need for further improvisation was felt, it was then discussed at the various CHILDLINE regional meets where CHILDLINE coordinators and team members meet at a common forum, before a second pilot was successfully conducted in cities.


CIF approached TCS, who had developed the original ChildNET-I software. TCS agreed to develop the phase two of the software, which would incorporate the features of the revised intervention form. Under the guidance of Mr. Behram Sethna, Vice President, TCS, a team of software professionals in corporated the changes in addition to providing more advanced features. The software will be piloted in cities for the period April to May 2009 and CIF plans to install the new software in all cities from mid June 2009 at all CHILDLINE centres.



## 3. CHILDLINE RESPONSE TO CALLS

## 3.1 Nature of intervention provided by CHILDLINE Nationally

This part presents the data regarding CHILDLINE'S intervention calls to the 1098, helpline namely in providing medical assistance, linking children to shelter, restoration children home, tracking missing children, intervening with children who have been physically and/or sexually abused, providing sponsorship, counselling the children and other interventions related to child rights violations.

Intervention call data are used for analysis of the services. While calls are classified often the nature of interventions is varied and/or multiple. For example after providing shelter, the child may be provided counselling and then repatriated. However the call is classified according to the first intervention provided by them.

The nature of assistance by CHILDLINE nationally show that major intervention are for medical assistance, shelter and restoration covering 40% of the cases followed by missing children cases which together constitute 50% of cases of intervention.

NOTE: In table that show "not documented" -the specific information is not reported in the case form.

#### **MAJOR CATEGORIES OF INTERVENTION**

Children contact CHILDLINE for different reasons and seek different types of assistance. Some of the main reasons why children contact CHILDLINE are listed below.

CHILDLINE reaches out to marginalised children, out of which many are street children or children who live with their parents, or come from a family in crisis or who are living alone, their dependency on CHILDLINE for assisting them with medical problems is hence considerably high.

#### 3.2 Medical Assistance

Most number of calls where CHILDLINE teams physically go out and meet the child to provide assistance is for medical emergencies.






CHILDLINE receives 16% of all intervention calls for medical assistance, which is the maximum number of calls related to direct intervention.

The nature of CHILDLINE's response to calls for medical assistance, range from taking the child to out-patient department (OPD) (walk-in), or providing first aid or assisting children who require to be hospitalised. Cases which require OPD and first aid together constitute 85%. As a large number of children to whom CHILDLINE's cater to the poorest section whether are street children or children living with their families, the assistance provided either emergency or routine – becomes very critical.

#### 3.2.1: Taking Children to OPD




Public hospital are open to all. However, children belonging to poorer section find even these inaccessible because they cannot offe of the nominal registration fees or because of their physical appearance, they feel discouraged to walk into big institutions. This is when CHILDLINE team's supportive role becomes very imperative.

The pie diagram above shows the details of cases where the child has to be taken by CHILDLINE team to the nearest public health care centre/ hospital for treatment and but does not require to be hospitalised.

The problems for which children were taken to OPD included fever/viral 36%, ENT problems 10%, boil 14%, aches 7%, diarrhea 6%. 17% of the cases reasons were not documented.

#### 3.2.2: Providing First Aid


Generally, first aid calls are from children themselves. CHILDLINE team members as most of them have received first aid training and have been provided with first aid kits which are useful for medical intervention during outreach. The figure below indicates where first aid was required.



More than 40% of the cases were for injuries or wounds, fever/viral 24%, headache 9% and stomach ache 10%, not documented accounted for 13% of the total cases.

### 3.2.3: Hosptialisation of the child


These are calls where children have been hospitalised by CHILDLINE and require further treatment. CHILDLINE arranges for volunteers to be with the child, especially at night, specialised medical treatment, etc.



Burns accounted for 3%, wound 15%, fever and viral 8%, diarrhea 3%, malnutrition 3%, food poisoning 2%, TB related 2%, cancer 2%. However a major portion has been reported as not documented (61%), which is a loss as inputs of human and material resources are higher then in cases of OPD.


#### 3.2.4: Accident

Accidental injuries in resulting cut/wounds accounted for 17%, accidents by rail 10%, accidents on road 9%, head injury 6% and not documented for 47% of the cases.




#### 3.2.5: Mental illness

Mental retardation 28%, learning disorder 4%, dissociation disorders (lack of confidence) 4%, schizophrenia 2%, post traumatic stress disorder and anxiety disorder at 2% each. In 58% of the cases details were not documented. This may be also because often it is difficult to diagnose the illness.




#### 3.2.6 Addiction

Addiction of alcohol accounted for 14%, solution 14%, children addicted to drugs accounted for 57% of the cases, cigarettes and gutka at 3% each. 9% of the cases were not documented. We see here a fair reporting of problems shows by street children.



#### 3.3 Assistance for Shelter

In the last year 5,466 children were assisted for shelter accounting for 12% of the total number of intervention cases. On receiving such calls, the CHILDLINE team meets the child and dialogues with him or her to ascertain the reason for the child seeking shelter. Based on an assessment of the child's need as well as the preference of the child, the CHILDLINE contacts appropriate shelters that can provide accommodation.



The data indicates that the main reasons for children seeking shelter are either because they have been abandoned or have left home or parents have sought shelter for their children. This is due to abject poverty, and especially in cases of single parents, who find it difficult to work and look after children.



The other instances where CHILDLINE intervene to locate a shelter is when a child who was in a shelter is looking for an alternative, due to adjustment problem in the existing shelter home. The most challenging task CHILDLINEs come across is finding shelter for children who are mentally challenged or suffer from a mental illness.

#### 3.3.1 The Abandoned Child

The above figure highlights some of the reasons why children were abandoned prominent among them were death of parents 17%, financial crisis in the family 8%, unwed mother 4%, illness in the family 2%, girl child 1%, while 66% of cases the reasons are not documented.




#### 3.3.2 The Runaway Child

This category includes children who have left home, come to the city and are now seeking shelter


The below figure suggests that some of these children need shelter because of a quarrel with family member (19%), other due to attraction to city (15%), abuse in the family (16%), employment (17%).

Both pull and push factors have contributed to child leaving home. However, on close observation it is more the push factor like abuse within the family or vulnerability due to loss of parents, that form a sizable number.



#### 3.3.3 : Parents/Guardians seek shelter for the child


CHILDLINE also receives calls from parents who wish to place their children temporarily in a shelter facility. CHILDLINE assesses the family situation of the child before linking the child to a shelter. Reasons why parents in need of seek shelter are as follows: Financial crisis in the



family (21%), death of parents (11%), single parents (12%) and illness of parents (7%). In 36% of the cases reasons were unknown.


#### 3.3.4 : Child has left shelter

More than 16% of the children leave the shelter, because they are not happy with the environment, 10% just left without giving reasons, 7% left the shelter after they felt they were medically fit, 4% were restored back home, while not documented cases accounted for 63%.




#### 3.3.5 : Child is medically ill

Children call CHILDLINE seeking shelter, if they are unwell and require rest (40%). Most of these calls are from street children, who manage living on the street, but when they are unwell they seek assistances to recover and access these basic needs like food and shelter. They are also cases where child becomes ill within the shelter (29%) and calls CHILDLINEs for the special attention that they need for recovering. Some cases were not able to be documented accounted (31%).



#### 3.4 Restoration

Restoration is one service for which the allied systems and other NGO's working in the field, find CHILDLINE's contribution most useful. Calls for restoration account for 11% of the total direct intervention cases where children are repatriated back to their home. Most of the calls come to seek assistance like shelter, medical or protection from abuse. Which over a period of time, turn into one for restoration. The police very often refer children



to CHILDLINE and in some cases even the Child Welfare Committees (CWC) direct CHILDLINE to undertake restoration. However, there is need for greater coordination between the police and CHILDLINE while undertaking restoration. CHILDLINE'S strong network across 83 cities (as on March 2009) and dedication of CHILDLINE teams, have helped in tromendously successful restoration of such a large number of children.


The data reveals that, out of the total 6,320 cases for restoration, 55% of the children who were repatriated knew their address but had left their house and were living in another city and 23% of the children knew their address but lived elsewhere in their city.


#### 3.4.1: Child knows address, lives outside the city

The below figure shows some of the main reasons for which the children left home and ran away to other city. Attraction to the city amounted to 11%, children coming in search for employment accounted for 7%, quarrel with family member 6%, abuse in the family 3%, alcoholic mother/father 3%, not documented cases were at 64%.




#### 3.4.2 : Child knows address, lives within the city

Some of the prominent reasons included attraction to the city (20%), quarrel with family (9%), employment (6%), abuse in the family (6%), but not documented were more than 50%.



#### 3.4.3 Child does not know address, lives within the city

The details of cases as children within the city were as follows around 6% of the cases of living home were due to attraction to the city, 1% for employment, more than 80% of the cases were not documented.



The analysis of reasons for which the child has left home in both types of restoration cases shows that cases where the child knew the address, but did not go home is over 20%. There could have been some form of abuse in the family. Around 2-3% left home because of factors at school-abuse, stress, failure. A similar percentage of children left their homes in search of better prospect - attraction to city or for employment. Most of these restoration cases are found in large cities like Mumbai or Kolkata, where a major attraction is to meet a film star or other celebraties. Unfortunatly in large number of cases reasons are not documented. Hence valuable data about dynamic processes like urbanisation and migration is lost.

### 3.5 Missing Children


CHILDLINEs come across missing children cases from two sources: from children who are lost and reported to the CHILDLINE and parents who're looking for their lost children.

Missing children accounts for 12 % of the intervention cases. Missing children with no support system are very vulnerable to neglect, exploitation, abuse and especially girls.

Cases where parents/relatives asking for help from CHILDLINE, to trace children accounted for 65%, while in 34% of the cases the child was found and identified as lost by CHILDLINE or concerned adult who, in turn informed CHILDLINE.




#### 3.6 Protection from abuse

Child abuse is a state of emotional, physical, economic and sexual maltreatment meted out to a person below the age of eighteen and is a globally prevalent phenomenon. However, in India, as in many other countries, there has been no understanding of the extent, magnitude and trends of the problem. The growing complexities of life and the dramatic changes brought about by socio-economic transitions in India have played a major role in increasing the vulnerability of children to various and newer forms of abuse.

7% of calls are reported for protection against physical, sexual or financial abuse of children. In such calls CHILDLINE meets with the caller/child to assess the situation. In many cases children have to be rescued with the aid of the police and other releveant departments of governement such as Labour and women and child. The intervention is done taking into consideration the child's wishes.

Out of the total calls received for abuse approximately, 91% constitute cases of physical abuse, 6% constitutes sexual abuse and 3% of cases are for financial abuse.





#### 3.6.1.1: Physical Abuse And Gender

Out of the total number of cases of physical abuse was reported by girls, abuse within the family was as high as 50%, followed by abuse at workplace 30%, abuse in institutional care accounted for 11%, and physical abuse by neighbours was 8%.

Physical abuse of male children was reported high at workplace, almost 60%, followed by abuse in the family 30%, and abuse in institutional care 6%.

#### 3.6.1.2: Physical abuse in the workplace

A large number of physical abuse are cases of abuse as child labourers. Out of the total number of cases where CHILDLINE intervened for protection against abuse, the workplace accounted for 50%. As this is the largest category, the physical abuse are further classified




Abuse in the form of financial problems or economic exploitation at workplace accounted for 26%. Abuse in the form of beating accounted for 19%, while abuse using an object accounted for 15%. Cases where no data were available accounted for 40%.

It is very common that children are not paid their due wages. Wages they have been promised are not paid for long period of time. Many times when they demand wages they get into trouble, as the employes see this as a sign of rebellion, and they handle this by physically abusing the child.


#### 3.6.1.3: Physical abuse in the family

Physical abuse in the family was mainly due to financial problems which accounted for 32%, abuse by beating accounted for 19%, due to alcoholism 9%, using object for beating 5%, cases which were not documented 35%.




#### 3.6.1.4: Physical abuse in institution care

Physical abuse due to financial problem accounted for 32 %, educational problems were at 11%, while 57% of the cases were not documented.




#### 3.6.1.5: Physical abuse by neighbours

Abuse by beating was reported more than 39%, abuse using object was around 14%, due to financial problem 10% and not documented 39%.



#### 3.6.1.6: Protection from abuse by police

Cases where CHILDLINE intervened in protecting the child from abuse by the police, 67% of the cases were reported for protection against police, while child roaming/loitering 11% compressed of the cases, police harassing the child for money was 2% and not documented accounted for 20%.



In most cases physically abused by beating or using an object especially by those supposed to be care givers such as family and institutional personnel including the police. This points a very sad picture of the environment in which these children are reared.

#### 3.6.2 : SEXUAL ABUSE

The number of sexual abuse cases currently reported both to CHILDLINE's and with the police are the tip of the ice berg, due to multiple emotions like fear, guilt, emotional trauma of the abused.




The child is at high risk to sexual abuse in his/her family and in the immediate neighbourhood. More surprisignly more cases are abused in the family then elsewhere, which raises many social concerns for child protection. Sexual abuse at workplace also forms a substantial category with 22% of cases.

#### 3.6.2.1. Sexual Abuse Gender-Wise Distribution

**Female :** Out of total females who reported sexual abuse 33% reported sexual abuse in the family, 28% reported

that they were abused by neighbours, 25% reported sexual abuse at work place while the remaining 14% reported sexual abuse in institutional care.


**Male**: Out of the total males who reported sexual abuse, 44% reported sexual abuse by neighbours, while 24% reported to have been sexually abused in the family, another 17% reported abuse in institutional care, while 15% reported abuse in the workplace.



As a site of abuse for boys the most common site of abuse was from neighbours, while for girls 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the causes were related to abuse within the family. This finding is very alarming as children find it most difficult to raise voice against them and find external support, when their abuse happens inside the family.


### 3.6.2.2 : Sexual abuse by neighbours

Out of the total number of cases where type of sexual abuse was sexual harassment 22%, sexual touching 23%, rape 16%, indecent exposure 2% and 37% of the cases were not documented.




#### 3.6.2.3 Sexual abuse in the Family

The nature and extent of sexual abuse takes many forms. Sexual abuse in the family mainly reported as sexual harassment (18%), while rape reported (11%), sexual touching (9%). While not documented accounted for more than 60% of the cases, which is a concern as these are very important cases for child protection.




#### 3.6.2.4 Sexual abuse in the workplace

Sexual abuse was reported as sexual harassment (26%), sexual touching and rape (11%). Organised abuse and indecent exposure to private parts 3% each and not documented accounted for 46%.




### 3.6.2.5 Sexual abuse in Institutional care

Sexual abuse in institutional care where 36% were reported as rape, 7% sexual touching, sexual harassment 4%, not documented 32%.



These cases of sexual abuse strongly highlight the assault on children by caregivers and those in their immediate environment and not strangers or casual contact. This also reflects the need to empower children with self developed confidence, knowledge as body and signs of abuse, self defence.

## 3.7 : Death Related < 1%



Cases where natural deaths was reported were, 40%, 35% of the deaths were reported as accidental death, while 20% of the death reported were under suspicious circumstances. A large number of these calls are related to street children.

Further breakup of cause of death have not been recorded



#### 3.8 : Sponsorship

In a large number of cases CHILDLINE links children to other services. It also receives a large number of calls for information about services. In addition there are calls where CHILDLINE actively assists the child/family in accessing services which includes financial support. Sponsorship accounts for more than 7% of the total intervention cases.

The nature of calls for sponsorship during the period included sponsorship for education, health and foster care service as shown in the diagram below.




In sponsorship the highest number of assistance was given for education (62%), followed by health. These cases are from children or from families who are very poor and who cannot support their education. The health related sponsorship (23.97%) are mainly for cases with major health problem for which they can not get free service from general hospitals. These also include cases of organ donation or heart surgeries. Foster care (13.27%) is provided for children without parental support or even cases where parents are in an environment which is not conducive for a child's growth.


#### 3.8.1: Education

Under sponsorship for education, CHILDLINE has assisted almost 50% of the children with school uniforms, the number of children helped in seeking admission accounted for 11% and not documented accounted for almost 30% of the total cases.



#### 3.8.2 : Health

More than 20% of calls were regarding assistance for health problems which need for medicines (51%), medical materials (5%) and surgery (4%). A substantial number is not documented (40%).



## 3.9 : Calls for Emotional Support and Guidance

Emotional Support and Guidance (ES&G) contributes to, approximately 31% of the total intervention cases for the year 2007-08 forming the largest category of intervention. Children call for various problems like suicidal tendencies, depression, stress, bullying, breakdown in relationship, low self esteem, personality disorder, learning disorders, trauma due to abusive situations, sexual problems etc. Normally these cases are handled either by a social worker or team members and in case the case is too traumatic, the child is referred to a professional counsellor or psychologist. In all calls, children want someone to listen to them, to support them, or advise them on how they can address their situation. Thus even through these counselling calls CHILDLINE provides emotional support.






As the figure and table show the largest number of cases, the child where the main source of emotional trauma were related to self, academic issues and situation in the family.

#### 3.9.1 : Emotional Support and Guidance : Self


These are calls regarding issues affecting the child's self esteem, where the child identifies the cause of the problem with himself or herself.



The factors related to the child's need for emotional support were: poor performance in studies are the maximum (39%) followed by low self esteem (5%), Introverted personality (4%), negative feedback from peer group (2%), guilt and negative body image (1%), numbers where factors are not recorded accounted for 48%.

#### 3.9.2: Emotional Support and Guidance: School

These are calls where children wish to talk about problems experienced in school. The kind of problems that the children refined to were exam pressure 50%, inability to cope with studies 30%, favouritism by teacher 3%, not documented 13%.




The above two diagram show that poor performance, difficulty in coping with studies and examination pressure were the reasons for needing psychological support through the help line.

#### 3.9.3 : Emotional Support and Guidance : Family

These calls, children identify their family members as being the main cause of their problem comprising 21%.

This is further broken down into the following categories of financial problem 14%, feeling of rejection 13%, educational problems 12%, priority amongst siblings 7% and not documented 25%. Here again 12% of the cases were identified as educational problems.



ES&G highlights that maximum number of calls are related to studies, where there is pressure on the children within their families and schools, to perform better.


This section described the main reasons for which the children called CHILDLINE and the intervention provided by the CHILDLINE teams. The following chapter gives an account of profile and life situation of the children, the most common places from where children call and the intervention strategies used by the teams.

## 4. The Intervention Methodology used to contact children

CHILDLINE in India is different from helplines in many other countries where the child /client is in touch with the helpline only by phone. There is no physical contact. However, as we cater to the poorer segment of the society with a large number of children in need of specific tangible assistance, CHILDLINE is an outreach based telephone helpline. Thus in 40% of the cases, the team members respond by going to meet the child and then linking him or her to the required service.


If the team member feels that it will take time to reach out to the child (in terms of physical distance) then assistance is taken from a support organisation that is located in the vicinity of the child. In about 30% of the cases, especially ES&G, information of the service is provided on the telephone. The teams also come across a number of children in need of support when they carry out outreach in the community.

After the emergency, intervention measures are taken by the CHILDLINE agency, the next step is to link the child with long-term rehabilitation. This involves referral and networking with other organisations providing special services.



Depending on the nature of the call, be it by a child or an adult, in 50% of the cases, the team members respond by going to meet the child and then linking him or her to the required service. If the team member feels that some time will be involved in reaching out to the child, in terms of physical distance, then assistance is taken from a support organisation that is located in the vicinity of the caller. In about 40% of the cases, the service was completed on the telephone,

In more than 40% of the cases, CHILDLINE has met the child on receiving the call, while nearly 30% of the calls were responded over the phone (counselling or referral) primarily dealing with counselling calls which accounted for more than 85%.



## Assistance provided in relation to Intervention methodology

- Out of the total cases where CHILDLINE team went and met the child, 31% of the cases were for medical assistance, followed by 21% for restoration, 19% for shelter and 13% for rescue from abuse.
- Almost 85% of the children responded over the phone were related to counselling.
- From the cases where the child was called to the CHILDLINE agency, 35% were for shelter followed by 28% medical and Restoration 15%.
- The children referred to support organisation, were largely for shelter 42%, followed by 19% for sponsorship and 13% related to Restoration.
- 23% of the cases were not documented by the team

### 5. PROFILE OF CHILDREN ASSISTED BY CHILDLINE

### 5.1: Gender of children

Analysis of data on the National level shows that there is a statistically significant difference between the number of males and females that contact CHILDLINE. The majority are males. Males accounting for 2/3<sup>rds</sup> of the total number of children assisted by CHILDLINE. The gender divide is similar to the one found in the figures for street children in India.

The gender of the children assisted vis a vis the assistance provided by CHILDLINE is outlined in the table below.



### In relation to gender of children


Among males 27% were provided with ES&G and 17% were assisted with medical aid, 15% of males were restored back home, 12% were provided shelter and also an equal number of children were reported missing.

Among females 37% were provided counselling, 13% of them were provided medical assistance, 10% shelter and almost another 10% sponsorship.

More females called for counselling than males, while the need for shelter was almost equal as also protection from abuse. Fewer females were missing as compared to males and correspondingly, lesser percentage were restored back to their families.

### 5.2 : Age group of Children

Almost 50% of the children assisted by CHILDLINE are in the age group of 11 to 15 years and school going age of 6 to 15 years constitutes 70% of the children assisted by CHILDLINE.



### Age group and Gender of Children

In the adjoining figure, children in the 11 to 15 age group consist of 49% male, and 42% female.

In special cases, where assistance is provided to children above 18 the number of female beneficiaries are more than the male children. Staff reach out to their greater vulnerability.



### In relation to age group

- In the category of 11 to 15, which also forms the category with the highest number of children, 36% sought counselling, while 16% were restored back.
- The second highest age group of 6 to 10, 22% children were provided medical assistance, while 16% were given shelter and 16% were restored back.
- Children in the age group of 1 to 5, 27% of the children were provided medical assistance, while 23% of cases from this age group were reported as missing, which is an alarming number and 16% as death related.
- In the age group of 16 and above, almost 60% of the children were calling for counselling.

There is greater need to work with children in school-going age group, though all of them may not be in school. A large proportion of missing children are in the age group 1-5. This should guide strategies for tracking missing children. It also indicates that a large number of these children may be trafficked or lost rather than them being runaway children.

### 5.3 Children in difficult circumstances

The children assisted by CHILDLINE highlights that, of the total number of children, 42% were emotionally disturbed, 24% were living with their family in crisis, street children accounted for 15% and child labour accounted for 7%.




The analysis of the table reveals the main reasons why different groups of vulnerable children need CHILDLINE and thus help identify actual needs of these specific groups.

- Street children: Out of the 5429 street children, 46% called for medical assistance while 23% needed shelter.
- Child Labourers: Out of the 2498 child labourers, 53% reported abuse hence were rescued from the situation, 22% were restored, while 12% were provided shelter.
- Flesh trade Victim: Out of the 93 cases reported as flesh trade victims, 42% were protected from abuse, 15% were restored while 13% were given medical treatment and 19% were not documented.
- Child with Family in crisis: 33% were provided medical assistance, while 20% were provided with sponsorship.
- Differently abled children: Out of the total 609, 19% of the children were provided medical assistance, while 9% were provided shelter.
- Children involved in substance abuse: 57% were provided counselling, while 14% were given medical assistance.
- **Mentally ill children:** 40% of them were provided shelter, while 36% were repatriated back home.
- Children affected by HIV/AIDS: Out of the total number of children who were reported to be affected by HIV/AIDS, more than 50% of the children were provided shelter, followed by medical assistance 24%.
- Child in conflict with law: 17% of the children were restored by home, while 13% were provided shelter.
- Children affected by conflict or disaster: Out of the total 92 children, 25% were provided shelter, while 22% were repatriated back home.

### To Summarise briefly,

While in cases of child labour, abuse and flesh trade, the children needed protection, shelter and restoration. Those cases where children were mentally ill and with HIV/ AIDS, needed shelter. The children on the streets or with families in crisis or who were differently abled, needed medical assistance. Street children and differently abled needed shelter, while those from families in crisis needed sponsorship. Counselling was the need of children involved in substance abuse and those in conflict/disaster situations.

### 5.4 : Family support system of children



Out of the total cases documented into ChildNET for family details, 76% of the children are living with their families, and around 6% stay alone, 4% live in Shelter, while children who live with employer, friend and relative account for 2% each.

This means that a large proportion of the street children that call CHILDLINE may be children on the street i.e living with families on the street. However it is also likely that they have family back home, and hence implying that they are not destitute.

### Family situation and the type of assistance sought

- Children living with their families: Out of the 34,436 children who stay with their families, 38% called seeking ES&G, while 15% were given medical assistance, another 14% had to be reunited with their families.
- Children living alone: Out of the total 2,567, 41% were provided shelter and 28% were assisted for medical needs.
- Children in Shelter homes: 29% of the children were provided assistance with alternative shelter homes (those who already lived in some shelter home), 24% were restored back by CHILDLINE, while 23% were provided medical assistance.

- Children who lived with employer: 65% sought CHILDLINE intervention to protect them from abuse, while 14% of these children who lived with employer were restored, 11% were provided shelter.
- Children who lived with relatives: 32% of the children asked for Shelter, while 17% desired to be sent back home.

These findings shows that shelter has been the main need for children living alone or in existing shelters where they are not happy. While counselling seems to be the highest need for children living with families, protection from abuse seems to be the most sought after assistance by child labourers.


Unfortunately the current system of documentation is not yet able to capture the range of intervention provided by the team to the child. They are indicable of the most dominant need expressed by the children.

### 5.5 Educational status of children

Maximum number of children assisted during this period, attend Government aided private school 34%, non school going and children who have never attended school accounted for 12% each. 10% of children had dropped out of primary school.



### **Educational Status and gender of children**

Number of female who attend Government aided/private school were more by 20%, There are equal number of male and female (15%) who are non school going, 16% of the male reported to have never attended school, followed by 15% who drop out at Primary level.

### In relation to educational status:

- Out of the total children who attended Government aided school, 55% of the children called for ES&G, while 10% requested for medical assistance.
- Amongst non school going children, equal percentage of children i.e. 21% seek medical assistance and shelter, each 14% of the non school going children were reported as missing.
- Attends Municipal School: 24% of the children seek for ES&G, while 20% were provided Medical assistance followed by Restoration 12%.
- Never Attended School: 37% of the total children assisted for Medical were those who never attended school, followed by Shelter 19% and Restoration 15%.
- Drop out from School: 28% of the children were repatriated, 10% of them contacted CHILDLINE for ES&G.
- Attends College: 80% of the College going children asked for ES&G

If we classify the various educational status categories, the main groups are school going and non-school going. The non-school going children clearly come out as more vulnerable category needing assistance like shelter and medical while a large number of school going children called for stress related reasons seeking emotional support and guidance. A large number of non-school going urban children are also street children.

### 6. CALLER DETAILS

### 6.1: Profile of the individual contacting CHILDLINE

CHILDLINE provides an invaluable and, often, immeasurable service to children and young people in India. As a telecommunication service for children, CHILDLINE provides a platform for children to voice their problems and concerns. However, not every child is in a position to contact a CHILDLINE. Concerned adults also call CHILDLINE on behalf of a child suspected to be in need of care and protection.

In the adjoining figure, data regarding the individual contacting the child helpline is presented. Of all contacts, 57% of the contacts were from different categories of adult callers, ranging from a stranger on the street to allied system. Nevertheless, a large number of calls -14,695, constituting 33% of calls, were from children themselves.



### In relation to profile of the caller

- Out of 14,986 calls made by children, 76% of these calls were for emotional support and guidance, followed by medical at 11%.
- Concerned adults call CHILDLINE when they see a child in need of care and protection. They are most likely to call for protection from abuse 21%, or for shelter 17%, or for medical assistance 15%.
- 17% of calls made by CHILDLINE members are made during their outreach visits when they see a child in need of medical assistance (33%).

- Family/relative were most likely to call seeking assistance to trace their missing children (34%) or for medical assistance (23%) or for sponsorship (16%).
- Allied systems account for 12% of the total callers seeking for restoration of the child (37%), shelter (25%) or if they see a missing child (11%) indicating their trust in the service.

As the above points reveal, while large number of children call for their immediate needs like emotional support while the families called mainly for location of missing children.

### 6.2 : Place of call

CHILDLINE considers it very important to record the place of calls as this reveals a lot about the probable profile of the child, types of vulnerabilities or protections risks associated with certain spaces. More importantly this also gives inputs into our outreach strategies and for designing appropriate protection nets/programmes for children.

Places from where CHILDLINE receives its calls mainly highlight that 40% of the calls are received from residential areas, 16% of calls are from railway stations, 15% of calls from telephone booth. Lower numbers from important likely places of abuse like institutions or schools may be indicative of lack of access to the telephone for this category, though a large number of children calling from residential areas may include school going children in need.



### In relation to location

- Maximum calls from street/pavements and slums are for medical assistance 22%, followed by sponsorship 21%, missing 17% and ES&G 16%.
- Maximum calls from railway stations are for shelter (27%), followed by calls for medical assistance (16%).
- It is interesting to note that almost 76% of the calls for counselling are from school.


- 40% of calls coming from telephone booth are for ES&G, while 22% are for medical.
- Children who come directly to the CHILDLINE centre for medical assistance account for 59%.
- Calls coming from a workplace, 21% calls for shelter, while 14% call for protection against abuse.

The call locations are closely connected to the type of problem e.g. Street children calling for medical assistance.

### 6.3 : Time of call

The data has been analysed in five time slots. The first two slots are from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm and 1:00 pm to 6:00 pm which is the general office time of most organisation.

The remaining three slots are 6:00 pm to 12:00 midnight, 12:00 midnight to 8:00am and 8:00 am to 10:00 am.



60% are received during the working hours.

40% of the calls are received after working hours of the organisations strengthening the need for a 24-hour service for children however, after midnight, calls are much less.

 60% of the calls were received during 10:00 am to 01:00 pm, 40% of the calls for ES&G are received during 06:00 pm to 12:00 midnight after working hours of organisation, followed by 10% for medical assistance. 9% from mid-night to 8am.

This chapter looked at the major trends in terms of problems classified and assistance provided by the CHILDLINE's. It also looked at the aggregate data on profile of caller, call location and demographic profile. The following section will examine whether there are any major regional variations in major indications. These would develop intervention strategies and guide an efficient at capacity building of CHILDLINE's teams.

Northern India lies mainly on continental India, north of peninsular India. Towards its North are the Himalayas which define the boundary between the Indian Subcontinent and the Tibetan plateau. To its west is the Thar Desert, shared between North India and Pakistan and the Aravalli Range, beyond which lies the state of Gujarat.

The Vindhya Mountains are, in some interpretations, taken to be the southern boundary of North India.

Northern India lies mainly in the North Temperate Zone of the earth. Though cool or cold winters, hot summers and moderate monsoons are the general pattern, Northern India is one of the most climatically diverse regions on Earth


The economy of northern India is predominantly agrarian like other parts of the country; culturally, socially and historically the country has always been defined by its village societies. But with the rapid growth of more than 8% GDP per annum, the economic landscape is changing fast. Several parts of North India have prospered as a consequence of the Green Revolution, including Haryana, Punjab and Western Uttar Pradesh, and experienced both economic and social development. The eastern areas of East Uttar Pradesh and Bihar, however, have lagged and the resulting disparity has, in the case of Uttar Pradesh, contributed to a demand for separate statehood in West Uttar Pradesh (the Harit Pradesh movement).

The highest per capita income states in Northern India include Punjab, Delhi, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh and the union territory of Chandigarh. Reflecting the prosperity of the western part of North India, Chandigarh has the highest percapita State Domestic Product (SDP) of any Indian state or union territory, while Delhi and Haryana rank second and third (after Goa) among the states (see main article: States of India by size of economy). On the eastern flank, Bihar has the lowest per-capita SDP of any Indian state. The region contains both Himachal Pradesh, which is one of India's most literate states (fourth after Mizoram, Kerala and Goa in decreasing rank, see main article: Indian states ranking by literacy rate) as well as Bihar, which is India's least literate state.





Comparative analysis of Monthly Report v/s ChildNET for the north zone highlights a difference of around 3000 (21%) cases which were not recorded in ChildNET, major difference has been noticed in Missing, ES&G and Shelter.

For the period under study, in the north zone CHILDLINE is present in the following states of which covers Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh & Rajasthan. CHILDLINE is operational in 16 cities

The analysis of data pertaining to different age groups and gender of children who have been assisted by CHILDLINE, indicates that male account for 70% of the children who were assisted while female at 30%. The proportion of male children is slightly higher than the national figures. The age and gender variables show that the maximum gap in the age group of 11 to 15. This age group largely compress by street children and school going children.

Thus highlights the nature of intervention calls - ES&G calls and Medical are prominent categories of direct intervention in the northern zone which have been further discussed below. Besides these missing 18% and restoration 13% are other major categories requiring direct intervention. Both categories include cases of trafficking and child labour.






Out of the total children assisted by CHILDLINE in 16 cities, 20% of the children were reported to be emotionally disturbed; 19% were street children, 14% were with family in crisis, 5% were children reported as child labourers. In 15% of the cases Life situation was not documented.

As evident, 36% of the children reported that they attended government aided/private school, 26% never attended school, 16% non school going, while 14% is heart warming to know attended municipal school. Thus over 50% are going to some school or have finished school.



### **MEDICAL ASSISTANCE**

Further break up of Medical cases reveals that first aid and OPD accounts for more than 45%, while hospitalisation, accident casualty and mental illness accounts for the remaining 4%.













Figure 7.7.1: Emotional support and guidance: Self Low self Introverted personality esteem Poor performance 6% 3% in studies 30% Negative feedback from peer group 1% Not Documented 57% Guilt n = 1320


30% of the children reported poor performance in studies as a major issue affecting their self esteem, 6% reported low self esteem, guilt and Introverted personality was reported at 3% each. In more than 50 % of the cases the reasons were not documented


# Emotional Support and Guidance : Family-1022 (35%)

Problems related to family were as follows: Financial problems 22%, Feeling of rejection 23%, Priority amongst siblings 16%, Not documented were 20%.

# Emotional Support and Guidance : School-251 (8%)

22 % of the children reported that they find difficult coping with studies, 14% reported teacher favourism, while 8% reported exam pressure. In more than 50% of the cases the reasons were not documented.





### **Case Studies**

### **Allahabad**

### **Death Related Call**

CHILDLINE performs the last rites...

The low value placed on girls subjects them to exclusion, exploitation and violence. Innumerable and unrecorded numbers of baby girls are killed within hours of being born. They are more often than not easily abandoned to fate – death or a good Samaritan.

CHILDLINE Allahabad received a call from the Station Officer of Koroan, a village in Uttar Pradesh reporting a new born baby girl found in the bushes. A villager while walking along the river heard the baby crying and informed the officer who then called CHILDLINE for assistance.

The team reached the spot to find the baby in critical condition and so needed to be brought to Allahabad. But tragically before they reached the city the baby died on the way. The matter was brought to the notice of Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Allahabad. As per the procedures, the postmortem and other legal formalities were conducted and the baby was handed over to the CHILDLINE team. A few days later, the CHILDILNE team arranged for the funeral.

### Gorakhpur

### Restoration

Anil restored home in Sitamari, Bihar ...

Poverty in families often leads to older children taking up work to add to family income. Young boys travel to towns and cities and coming into contact with new Afflictius

Drug addiction has become a large phenomenon in India in the past two decades affecting all segments of society, the use of whitener, alcohol, tobacco, hard and soft drugs is an especially wide spread phenomenon among street children, working children and trafficked children

CHILDLINE Gorakhpur was informed about a teenager who had deep wounds on his legs and was lying on the road. The team rushed to the spot to find the boy with wounds severely infected with worms. The boy was admitted for three days to hospital for treatment. Following his recovery he told CHILDLINE that he was from a poor family and was working in Bihar in a small hotel. Here he got addicted to drugs and on one occasion met with an accident and was probably unconscious for some time.

He injured his leg severely and did not get any medical attention. He was confused and unknowingly boarded a train which reached Gorakhpur.

Anil provided the team with details of family and village in Sitamarhi, Bihar. The team contacted CHILDLINE Sitamarhi. CHILDLINE Sitamarhi appraised the team about the flood situation in the area of his village and so it would be impossible for him to travel back home. In a few weeks, Anil was taken to Bihar and was soon re united with his overjoyed family. The family was cautioned that their overall negligence of their son, could have been fateful.

### Lucknow

### Restoration

Raj reunited with his family after six months...

The urban population is also rapidly growing due to largescale internal migration from rural areas to cities for a possible better life. A large proportion of this migrating population ends up residing in slums in inhuman conditions. All this has lead to a huge number of homeless children, pavement dwellers, street and working children and child beggars, who are left alone.

Himesh was from Unnao Dsitrict in Uttar Pradesh After his father passed away, his mother was remarried and he was sent to live with his grandparents. One day, he was beaten up by his uncle after which he left the house in a fury and travelled to Lucknow to earn a living. He survived in this huge city for six months without a stable income or a proper place to live.

Late one night, CHILDLINE Lucknow receives a call about an 8-year-old boy found unconscious near Hanuman Mandir. After providing immediate first aid, the CHILDLINE team shifted Himesh, who appeared malnourished to another hospital for further treatment. Here the staff were not very cooperative. The team persuaded a police officer and media crew present in the hospital to help them get the doctors attention. The tests were finally conducted and the result confirmed the team's worst fear — Lung Tuberculosis. Raj's details were put in local newspapers and his mother and grandparents were soon reunited with an overjoyed Raj! They were explained his situation and the long term treatment he required. Raj was lucky that he was able to go back home and get the love and care he required.

### Restoration

Visually impaired child restored home...

80% of persons with disabilities live in developing countries and less than 10 % of the 120 to 150 million disabled children and young people, attend school. Disability is a source of stigma for children and their families. They are ostracized and looked down upon by the community. They are especially vulnerable to neglect, physical abuse, sexual violence, exploitation and lack recognition in their communities and more appallingly in their families.

Such was the case of 16 year old Shankar who was visually impaired. He stayed with his siblings and parents in Delhi. The family could not afford to send him to any special school and so spent his days at home, often made fun off by his siblings and the children in the neighbourhood. The last straw was when his sister began teasing him. He got fed up and started beating her. After the incident he worried about the consequences, when his father found out and so, took a rickshaw to the station and got into a train. He landed in Meerut, Uttar Pradesh a new city which confused and scarred him.

A PCO owner spotted him and informed the CHILDLINE team. The team brought him to the centre where he gave details of where he lives and how he came to the city. The team members soon got in touch with his parents who were glad to know he was safe. After proper verification Shankar was accompanied back home. The team members met his parents and said how lucky Shankar was to be safe and that they should be more sensitive to his needs as a child.

### Rescue

15-year-old Shalini fights back with the support of CHILDLINE...

Violence against children includes neglect or negligent treatment, harassing behaviour like bullying; mental and physical abuse and injury; exploitation and sexual abuse. A small proportion of violence against children leads to death, but most often the violence does not even leave visible marks. Child abuse may have its roots in issues such as the power relations associated with children or gender and hence children often keep quite. But this was not the case of Shalini, a courageous girl.

Shalini lived with her father and her grandmother in Alwar, Rajasthan. After the passing away of her mother, her relatives began treating her very badly. Her father used to often beat her brutally and Shalini's aunt even tried to sell Shalini off. So one day Shalini finally decided to go the police station and register a complaint against her father. CHILDLINE had got to know about Shalini and took up the case. Shalini told the team about the continuous abuse and threat to her life she was facing while living with her father and his sister. Yet she wanted to continue staying home, as she was convinced that her grandmother could take care of her. Her aunt came to the centre and threatened the CHILDLINE team about filing a case against them if they did not hand over Shalini to them. CHILDLINE infact produced Shalini before the Child Welfare Committee who would decide what is in the best interest of Shalini.

The CWC finally came to the decision that Shalini's request to live with her grandmother would be granted provided her father would financially support her and she would contact CHILDLINE in case of further abuse.

### Gorakhpur

### Protection from abuse

CHILDLINE community awareness program with coolies at Gorakhpur railway station results in prevention of trafficking of your girls from Nepal

Every year, children are smuggled across borders or trafficked within their home countries, usually from rural to urban areas and sold like commodities. Trafficking violates the children rights guaranteed under international law and it threatens children's survival, development and clearly their protection. Children are trafficked for a number of reasons including labour, entertainment, sport, organ trade, armed conflict or the most common, sexual exploitation.

During an awareness program with porters at the railway station, CHILDLINE staff had highlighted the fact that Gorakhpur Railway Station, being on the border of Nepal and India (Bihar), was tan ideal place for traffickers to pass with their victims (women and children).

Within a week of the meeting CHILDLINE received a phone about two possible traffickers with seven young women, who were heading to Mumbai. Team members reached the station, and assessed the situation with the coolies. The Government Railway Police (GRP) was informed and they were quick to respond, apprehending

one of the traffickers. The young women were taken into custody and later released to CHILDLINE who arranged for their temporary shelter. One of the girls was a member of the trafficking group who had planned to sell these girls in Mumbai, under the pretext of finding them jobs in Dubai and Kuwait.


The CHILDLINE team met with an advocate to discuss the filing of the FIR, but the unfortunate part was that police did not comply. The Senior Superintendent of Police Gorakhpur and the Divisional Inspector General, Railway Police Force, referred the case to Superintendent of Police, by which time, the trafficker was released without an FIR, as there was no prima facie case.


The Team now began looking into repatriating the women back to Nepal. Attempts to lodge an FIR here too proved futile. The Nepal Child Welfare Foundation suggested that they hand over the young women to them for further rehabilitation in Nepal.

South India is a peninsula in the shape of a vast inverted triangle, bounded on the west by the Arabian Sea, on the east by the Bay of Bengal and on the north by the Vindhya and Satpura ranges.

The estimated population of South India is 233 million. The largest linguistic groups in South India include the Telugus, Tamils, Kannadigas, Malayalis, Tuluvas, Kodavas and Konkanis. 



Table above highlights that the maximum number of cases intervened by CHILDLINE southern zone were reported under ES&G accounting for more than 50% followed by restoration and shelter.

However there is a considerable difference of overall of almost 30% in the monthly report when compared to ChildNET. Cases which were reported under abuse, sponsorship, death related, missing and medical highlight a major difference when compared with Monthly report.



The pertaining figure 8.2 on gender of children who have been assisted by CHILDLINE, highlights that male account for 68% of the children assisted.




Figure 8.3 Children in the age group of 11 to 15 account for more than 50% while children in the age group of 11 to 18 together account for more than 75%.




Figure 8.4 categorises the children that access the service 60% of the children were emotionally disturbed children, followed by 8% of the children with family in crisis. In 13 % of the cases life situation of the children was not documented.






Figure 8.5 points out that more than 60% of the children attend government aided/private school, this is very encouraging, 9% of the children attend municipal school, 6% of the children reported drop out at primary level, while an equal percent of children reported to have never attended school. Thus 78% of children have been part of the education system, which is much than the rest of the zones or national figures.




Under counselling related to school matters accounted for 35%, followed by problems related to self at 30%, family and love relationship were reported at 14% each




### Emotional Support and Guidance : School – 3204 (35%)

Within the ES&G calls school related problems, are more than 55 % of the children reported exam pressure, while 31% reported their stress on coping with the studies.

#### Emotional Support and Guidance: Self - 2810 (31%)

Again more than 75% of the children reported poor performance in studies as a major constrain under counselling for self related problems. Thus academic performance seems to be the most significant source of stress for children in this region.




### Emotional Support and Guidance : Family -1267 (14%)

In figure 8.6.3 amongst the calls for counselling related to family matters with children, 18% of cases were related to alcoholism, 14% were related to educational problems, 11% were due to financial problems, 16% were due to stress and cases which were not documented accounted for 14%.


#### **RESTORATION**

The second highest group of direct intervention by the southern zone is for Restoration where 80% of the children knew their residential address, but lived outside the city and wanted CHILDLINE to repatriate them back home.



#### Restoration: Child Knows address lives outside the city -1714 (69%)

Almost 9% of the children reported that they were attracted to the city and hence had left their home, while 2% reported alcoholic Parents % of the children had left home reason being school pressure.12% came for Employment 3%. Cases which were not documented accounted for more than 75%



### Case Study

### Hut Bay, Andaman

#### **Protection from abuse**

CHILD Marriage stopped...

Child Marriage is a violation of human rights. It forces children to assume responsibilities and handle situations for which they are often physically and psychologically unprepared. It can have serious harmful consequences for children, including abuse, denial of education, curtailing freedom to interact with peers and community.

During an outreach to the community in Hut Bay Andaman, CHILDLINE team member were informed about a 15-year-old girl being forced into marriage by her parents. The girl belonged to a local fishing community and the neighbours of the family told them that without her knowledge, she was taken to the temple where the engagement ceremony took place. The girl was keen to study further and did not want to marry so early. But her education was soon stopped much before the wedding and was physically abused when she tried to reason with her parents.

The CHILDLINE team met her parents and informed them about the effects of an early marriage especially serious health risks like premature pregnancy, high rate of maternal and infant mortality. The parents promised to stop the abuse and not marry her off so soon, but on a follow-up visit the team realised they had not changed their mind and the abuse had continued. So the matter was brought to the notice of the local police station. The girl's parents along with the Pramukh (head man of the village) were summoned to the police station. They were warned that if they continued with their plans, legal action would be taken against them and they would be punished as per the law. The Pramukh assured the police that he will look into the matter and ensure no such marriage took place.

#### **Bangalore**

#### **Protection from abuse**

Girl freed from child labour...

Abuses against domestic workers, typically take place in private homes and hidden from the public eye. The long list of abuses committed by employers and labour agents includes physical, psychological, and sexual abuse; forced confinement in the workplace; non-payment of wages; and excessively long working hours with no rest days.

16 year old Naina, was sent to Bangalore to work for a family. From the very first days she was mal treated and constantly had wounds on her face and body. She was denied food often to the degree that she begged for food from her window at times. She had grown very weak and scarred. A neighbour made a call to CHILDLINE Bangalore about the abuse in the house which was adjacent.

The team carried out the necessary enquiry and then brought it to the notice of the local police station. Initially the owners were rude and angry with the questions of the team members abusing them for trying to imply that they were abusing the girl who they claimed was their relative from Bihar. With the help of the Sub inspector from the local police station, the child was taken away from the abusive environment for her safety. Naina told her story before the Child Welfare Committee. After ascertaining her family details, it was decided that in the best interest of Naina, she be sent back to Bihar. Her previous employers had to compensate her and sign a statement promising that no other children would be employed by them.

#### Vijaywada

### Protection from abuse

New born baby rescued...

At 11pm, CHILDLINE Vijayawada received a call from Government Railway Police about an abandoned baby found on the tracks. A rag pickers had found a bundle which had a newborn baby covered in blood and immediately informed the police. The rag picker told the team that he had infact seen a bundle of cloth being thrown from the toilet of a moving train. The crying had drawn his attention to this bundle.

The baby was given first aid treatment at a nearby hospital and then sent for further medical tests. The teams efforts to trace the parents were futile and the baby was shifted to a state government home for children

### Vishakapattanam

#### Protection from abuse

Freed from domestic work....child joins school...

After the death of her father due to Tuberculosis, Manu's mother remarried a man who was not happy with Manu living with them. He was not willing to let her stay with them, leave alone send her to school. After enduring a lot of physical abuse at home, the mother finally got her employed as a domestic worker. But things did not work out there as she was exploited by the family there. Her mother then decided to enrolled her in a residential school.

Manu used to spend the school vacations alone in the hostel because her mother had long stopped visiting her. One of the teachers suggested that she stay with her sister in law's family and help around the house there. Here again she was subjected to a load of physical work. She told a panshop owner of her ordeal. The shop owner soon handed her over to the closest police station.

The officer on duty after getting the details of the case, requested CHILDLINE in Vishakapattnam to take up the case. CHILDLINE just a little while ago had received a complaint from a neighbour of that family reporting how Mani had been seriously exploited by the family.

The team soon made arrangements for her temporary shelter and visited her ex-employer. The family denied any abuse and stated that in fact the girl used to come to spend the weekends at their home on her own accord. So they allowed her to stay with them, but made sure that she attended school regularly. This was denied by the school who said that Mani never attended regularly.

This was enough to register a complaint with the Labour Commissioner's Office and the Police. The child was referred to the department of Women and Child Development and was given admission in a government school. On a follow up visit, the child was found to be happier and adjusting well.

### **Thrissur**

### **Medical assistance**

CHILDLINE assists a child with disability...

Nyasa was born with Celebral Palsy. Her father had deserted her mother before her birth and her mother worked tirelessly to ensure good medical help for her daughter. Doctors in Bangalore diagnosed Nyasa as having Spastic Quadriplegia which makes her completely dependent on her mother for all her needs. She was in need of a particular Orthosis treatment which costs approx. Rs. 25,000/-.

Her mother was not able to afford the physiotherapy or the travel expenses to reach the hospital and so that was stopped. The mother finally approached CHILDLINE for some support. The team visited the mother and child at home which confirmed that the mother had infact had put in a lot of effort to find hospitals which would provide the treatment at a

subsidised rate or other substitute treatments. The team came to a decision that physiotherapy needed to restart immediately. The funds were arranged for her physiotherapy, a special education teacher was found to give home tuition. Once she improves and becomes more mobile, she will be admitted to a regular school. The mother was explained about various schemes and grants that she could apply for under the disability act. An upcoming Annual Medical camp organized by the Block Resource Development would also provide mobility aids free of cost.

Today Nyasa is continuing her education at home and receiving her grant regularly. She also continues her treatment in the same hospital. CHILDLINE continues to check on her from time to time.



East India was at the heart of the ancient Magadha, Maurya and kalinga empires.

India's independence movement had strong roots in East India. The feudal land system, established through the Permanent Settlement of Bengal, was unpopular. The Indian War of Independence in 1857 started in Bengal. British war propaganda asserted there were atrocities by the mutinous soldiers in the Black Hole of Calcutta. Eventually the British prevailed and Calcutta remained capital of Britain's Asian dominions until 1911. The Indian Congress was founded in Calcutta. During Mahatma Gandhi's freedom movement, the Bihari village of Champaran was an important supporter of non-violent resistance. Great poets of the stature of Rabindranath Tagore championed the movement for self-rule.

Agriculture continues to be the largest sector of the economy and employs the majority of the working population. In the 20th century Industrial development was concentrated in southern West Bengal and in Jamshedpur and Rourkela. In recent years the IT industry has developed in Orissa, with Bhubaneswar emerging as a major IT hub.

West Bengal's capital Kolkata, the capital of British India till 1911, is the biggest metropolis and economically dominant city of the region. However, the mid-sized cities of Cuttack and Puri in Orissa, and Bihar's capital Patna, were historically more prominent in the ancient and medieval periods.

In the 21st century, India's economic boom is resulting in the growth and development of towns such as Bhubaneshwar, Jamshedpur, Patna, and Ranchi.

Bengali is the dominant language of this part of the Indo-Gangetic Plain, being spoken by well over 80 million people in West Bengal plus neighbouring states.


Hindi has the largest number of speakers at over 90 million but has little cultural influence outside Bihar. Other important languages are Oriya and Assamese.




There is a difference of almost 50% in the data when compared to the monthly report, which has been mainly due to lack of documentation in ES&G calls almost by 65%, followed by Sponsorship more than 50%, 71% of the Missing children were not captured in the ChildNET software.




Figure 9.4: Children from different walks were assisted in the eastern zone. Almost 48% of the children were with their family in crisis, 19% were emotionally disturbed children, child labour and missing were around 6% each.





Figure 9.5: Educational Status of children assisted 30% of the children reported to be going to Government aided/private school, around 20% of the children reported to be non school Going while an equal number reported to have Never attended school, 10% of the children Reported to have attended municipal school.






35% of the cases reported under OPD had problems of Viral/Fever, around 20% of the children reported ENT problems.

54% of the children who were provided first aid had injuries/ wounds, while 25% were with Viral/Fever. 16% reported Headache & chest ache.








### **Emotional Support and Guidance: Self**

Calls coming for Counselling for Self were as high as 50%, while calls coming for counselling related to family matters were almost 25%. 70% of the total cases in counselling which were related to self were for poor performance in studies, while 18% were low self esteem.

Counselling related to family accounted for 21%, 19% reported feeling of rejection, while 15% reported conflict with parents, 11 % reported Financial problems



#### Case Study

#### Guwhati

#### Restoration

A run-away child accused of stealing.... restored home...

The consequences of running away from home are horrific. Children roam the streets, sleep on pavements and railway platforms, live on the edge and indulge in sweeping, begging, bottle-picking, selling tobacco at railway platforms. They are in grave dangers like medical problems, contracting HIV infections, substance abuse, physical & sexual abuse from police, railways, older street youth or getting into trouble with the law.

An Assamese 12 year old boy was accused of stealing a mobile in Dhekiajuli, Guwahati. The police officer on duty was new and called CHILDLINE to see what alternatives were available for such a case. The team assisted the case. The child had to be produced before a Juvenile Justice Board (JJB) since it was a case of a child being in conflict with the law, but this district had no JJB and so the child was handed over to CHILDLINE to follow up.

In conversation with the boy, the boy continuously pleaded that he was not guilty. He said the police were only suspicious of him and he found it difficult to convince the police since they could not understand his dialect properly. He infact had run away from his home in Bihar and come in search of his relatives in Guwahati. But now he just wanted to go back home.

The team contacted his father and informed him about his son being safe. The father was relieved and talked about how his son had done this many times before. A few days later, he came to the CHILDLINE centre to pick up his son. Following verification and consent form the Child Welfare Committee the child was handed over to his father. The team suggested that the actual cause of the child running away be dealt with.

Runaway girls are often among the most vulnerable, when familial, social or community structures collapse

and they are deprived of parental care or familial support. They are at a risk of suffering discrimination, gender-based violence, trafficking, various forms of child labour or of being affected by HIV/AIDS. They are particularly exposed to exploitation and emotional and sexual abuse.

A 15- year old girl who was from Gangtok, Sikkim, had run away from home without informing anybody and had travelled to Siliguri, West Bengal. She stayed on the streets for weeks and found work as a commercial sex worker earning upto Rs. 2300/- per month. She was rescued from a Bus Stand, by the local Siliguri police and was referred to a government girl's shelter home. The Superintendent of the home made a note of her family details and asked CHILDLINE to investigate the possibility of sending the girl back home.

CHILDLINE contacted the Police in Gangtok, Sikkim to confirm the address. The details were accurate and her family was located. In a few days, CHILDLINE teammembers along with the Superintendent of the home accompanied the girl to Gangtok. When they arrived, the front door was locked. On enquiring with the neighbours, they were informed about how her mother had remarried and left the village leaving her youngest daughter with a grandmother. After discussion with family......it was decided that the girl would live with her grandmother and sibling. So in the presence of the local police and the community, the girl was reunited with her family.

### South 24 Parganas

### Protection from abuse

A Youth groups comes to the rescue of 16-year-old girl...

CHILDLINE strongly believes that every citizen is part of the exploitative system that puts children in vulnerable situations and so CHILDLINE needs to reach out to citizens through academic institutions, parent teacher associations, corporate houses, labour unions, mahila mandals, panchayats, youth groups and others. A teenage girl had been walking around the locality in South 24 Parganas, West Bengal. The girl appeared mentally unstable and was being taken advantage of by a few drunk men. CHILDLINE had been working with the local youth groups in South 24 Parganas, West Bengal to make them aware about the CHILDLINE services and issues relating to children, especially trafficking. The youth heard the cries for help and recognised this as a potential case for CHILDLINE and called 1098 for assistance.

The CHILDLINE South 24 Parganas team rushed to the spot to find the men misbehaving with the girl and her crying out for help. The team intervened and finally with the help of police officers were able to bring the situation under control and get the girl away from the unruly men.

The traumatized girl was then brought to the CHILDLINE centre where she calmed down. She was produced before the CHILD Welfare Committee the next day, who advised that she be given temporary shelter in a home. The team's efforts on the other hand to locate her family from the details that they had managed to get earlier, proved to be futile.

As a follow up of the incident, the CHILDLINE team organized a mass awareness programme in the community. Everybody shared their concerns on children's issues and the need for better protection mechanism. The youth groups in the area are now working as volunteers for CHILDLINE.

### Cuttack

### **Protection from abuse**

Teenage girls rescued from prostitution

Various estimates have pegged a figure of 8 -10 million girl children who are trafficked into commercial sex abuse in India every year. Victims typically come from families hovering along the poverty line in remote villages.

A social worker brought two young traumatised teenaged tribal girls to CHILDLINE Cuttack (Orissa). Their narrated their stories of having large families and that some of the children were supplementing their meagre family incomes, by selling products door to door. It was a young couple who lured them with jobs in a big city, but locked them up separately and forced them to become commercial sex workers. One of the girls was brutally raped over days, in an attempt to pressurise her to submit and cooperate. In a heroic twist, one of the girls faked a stomach tumour and the pimps abandoned both the girls in favour of new young girls. The girls, in shock and badly scarred from the incident, traced their way back to the village and a social worker who was aware of CHILDLINE. Our teams worked with the police to quickly trace the pimps, arrest them, rescue more children, and finally place the girls in a long term plan for rehabilitation. They are now working with an NGO and gradually coming to terms with their experience.

### Restoration

6 escaped children reunited with their families ...

Often making use of low economic conditions, particular individuals con families into sending their children to bigger cities to earn a living.....what the actual result is quite different.

5 boys aged 10-15 years lived with their families in Gaya (Bihar), about 100 kms from Patna, The parents were daily wage earners and were just about managing to make ends meet. The children's education was out of the question.

An uncle named Sheikh, was known to work in Jaipur, Rajhasthan. The parents decided that this was an excellent opportunity for their children earn a living there. So the boys, accompanied by a cousin who also worked with Sheikh, soon reached Jaipur and settled down there. They were in regular contact with their parents who were glad to know everything was going fine. But all this soon changed.

Sheikh gradually began exploiting them, making them work long hours everyday, cutting down their meals, and physically abusing them. They were not allowed to contact their parents. One day, four of the children managed to escape. They wandered around the city for some time until a concerned adult who saw them wandering about a hotel, called the CHILDLINE team.

The team first ensured the children were admitted into a shelter, until they were able to be go back home. The boys parents were shocked to hear about the ill treatment but were relived to know their children were now safe.

In a few days the children were reunited with their families including the one who did not manage to escape. The parents of the children requested that no case be filed against him and so Sheikh was left with a warning of legal action if he ever attempted to employ children.

A week later, the children called back to let the team to share how grateful they were to be back home

# west zone



West India (Western India) or the Western region of India consists of the states of Goa, Gujarat and Maharashtra, along with the Union Territories of Daman and Diu and Dadra and Nagar Haveli. It is relatively highly industrialized, with a large urban population. Most of Western India was part of the Maratha Empire and Mughal Empire before colonization by the British. With total Population of 147,801,774 the average literacy rate of West India is around 76%, higher than the national average of 70.5%. The population density is around 290 per square km. The average fertility rate is about 2.2, while the average household size is about 4.7[5].

Overall, Western India has relatively high standards of living, although the city of Mumbai suffers from extreme overcrowding due to immigration from across the country. The region generates 20.34% of the national GDP of the country, with an annual growth rate of 14.5% as of 2006[8]. The states generate about 23 % of the tax revenues of the country. More than 85% of the households have access to electricity with about 55% owning a television. Agriculture employs most people in the region, while services have largest share in the total GDP. 
In CHILDLINE network for networking and data analysis purpose west zone includes Madhya Pradesh, which is part of central India, as a large number of cities in Madhya Pradesh, where CHILDLINE exists are in western part of the State. Thus the western zone covers, 17 cities in the states of Gujarat, Maharashtra, Goa and Madhya Pradesh. In the age group 40% of the children were in the age group of 11 to 15, while a little more than 30% were in the age group of 6 to 10.








The gender graph below highlight 65% are boys and 34% girls.






Children in the age group of 11 to 15 accounted for 40% of the total children followed by children in the age group of 6 to 10 32%.




Life situation of the children from the western zone highlights more than 35% of the children with their families in crisis, while 16% of the children expressed that they were emotionally disturbed, 14% of the children were reported as Child Labourers.

30% of the children attend Government aided private school. Overall, around 50% children were in some type of educational institutes. 18% reported to have attended municipal school, An alarming of the children reported that they have never attended school while 18% had stopped going to school, 11% of the children were drop-out from the school.



The ChildNET data reveals medical assistance to be the most frequently provided assistance followed by to be the Cases recorded under Medical assistance provided to children points that around 50% of the children were taken to the OPD, followed by First aid 27% and hospitalisation 16%.

Children who were treated with first aid, 50% had injuries/wounds, 29% were suffering form fever/viral, 15% of them had headache and chest ache.

Nearly 50% of the children were taken to OPD, cause they had viral fever, 25% had boils, while around 8% reported to have ENT problems.





Children who were provided shelter, almost 47% of the parents/guardians seek shelter boarding for the child. 23% of the children were abandoned, while around 18% of the children had left home.





38% of the parents reported to have financial crisis in the family and hence wanted shelter for their children. 13% of the single parents requested for shelter for their children. 10% of the children needed shelter due to death of their parents. 19% of the cases were not documented



Cases where child is abandoned 21% reported to have financial crisis in the family, more than 30% of the children who were abandoned parents had died. 40% of the cases were not documented

### Case Study

#### Baroda

### **Protection from abuse**

Children today face violence in the very environment entrusted to nurture, protect and educate them: the home. A single parent, especially burdened with economic conditions, difficult family relationships and lacking time and energy to give her chills turns to cruel and violent behaviour to deal with their children.

The CHILDLINE team in Baroda, Gujarat got a call from a concerned adult to report a boy being ill-treated regularly by his mother. The team visited the house and found the 14 year old boy sitting on the steps crying loudly. The boy told the team how his father was working in Dubai and he lived with his step sister and step-mother used to beat him daily and he no longer wanted to stay with them. The team tried talking to the mother but she was furious and began abusing the team for intruding.

The boy was adamant and wanted to leave immediately and go and stay with his grandmother. The team informed the local police and the boy signed a statement to this effect. The step mother by this time did not put up much of an argument. Various alternatives available to ensure the best interest of the child were discussed and finally it was mutually agreed on, that based on the request of the child that he would stay with an uncle until he completes his academic year after which he could move in with his grandmother thereafter.

### Medical sponsorship...

Many poor in India suffer from health conditions, for which there are cures / treatment. Parents often do not have access to the necessary medication, treatment, or immunisations. Parents also lack basic knowledge of nutrition, hygiene, and health care and usually cannot afford them. It is the children who loose out on an education and a healthy life they deserve.

8 year old Sushanth was in need of immediate ear surgery. His father the only bread earner, is a daily wage worker and his mother a housewife. Both were not in a position to pay for the expensive surgery, doctors fee, medicines and treatment of their son.

The CHILDLINE team explored options for financial support, with the help of the details of possible organizations/

people who might be able to support. An NGO was found who was able to pay for a large part of the expenses. CHILDLINE was able to negotiate with the medical staff at the hospital and obtain various concessions. All this resulted in the surgery being carried out quickly and the child's condition taken care of.

#### **Nasik**

### **Protection from abuse**

CHILDLINE Nashik rescues 5-year-old Salma from severe abuse at the hands of her guardians... (Protection from abuse)

Violence in he form of slapping, shaking, kicking, burning, grabbing, etc and cause cuts, burns, bruises, or fractures, amongst others, has severe implications for children's development, especially since such acts are committed mainly by adults in positions of authority and trust. It destroys children's self-confidence and can undermine their development as functional adults and good parents later in life.

Salma an orphan lived with her aunt and uncle in Jatwan Nagar Slum on the Nashik - Pune Highway. Every morning she was made to accompany them to various religious places to beg for alms. A cable operator in the area and a neighbour of the family had been noticing for some time she was often roughly handled. The couple maintained that she was mentally unstable and hence understood little. But one day when he noticed her swollen face because of abuse, his doubts were confirmed and he reported it to the police.

This was the second complaint they had received about the couple and decided to get CHILDLINE involved to address the issue. The investigations and ground work was done, statements of neighbours recorded, etc. Finally the couple was apprehended and Salma was produced before the Child welfare committee who asked that she be immediately given temporary shelter and counselled. The couple has since then tried to get back the child in their custody. The CHILDLINE team is monitoring the progress of the child.

What is the present status of the case? Where is the girl and what has happened to the uncle and aunty?

### Mumbai

#### **Protection from abuse**

Case of Sexual Abuse and Rape of Minors in Mumbai ...

Incidence of child sexual abuse has been growing very rapidly in India. In a large majority of cases, the victims fall prey to offenders amongst family members, relatives and close family friends. Such cases leave a long lasting impact on the victim child's psyche.

In this instance, a man in Bhayandar, a suburb of Mumbai, was found to be victimising his own two daughters, aged 17 and 14 years, to rape and abuse over a long period of time. The children finally found the courage to talk to the housing society committee members as their mother, who knew about it, did not stop it from happening.

An FIR was filed and CHILDLINE was informed. CIF ensured that the children underwent their medical examinations and were put in temporary shelter homes for minors. The case was presented before the Child Welfare Committee sent out an order for the arrest of both parents and to rescue the other two children living with them, the youngest daughter (11 years) and a son (9 years) who's safety was also a matter of concern.

CHILDLINE will follow through with the complicated court case.

### **Conclusion:**

The four zones together, cover 76 cities across India. CHILDLINE has heard the stories of children from various walks of life - from a student in a public school being bullied, to a child lost at a crowded railway platform to child engaged in a dangerous occupation. Each child has pushed our limits of providing him help.


The information generated from the calls documented, highlights certain bare facts. Most children call for emotional support or guidance - Advice, encouragement - a bhaiya or a didi is there to lend a listening ear and motivate a child in a tense situation.


Except cities in the south, 1/3rd of all intervention calls are for medical assistance while about 10% are shelter related. Children rescued from exploitative situations comprise of about 9% of all calls in the north and double in the West (17%)


Each zone yet remains unique - culture, social & economic backgrounds, political influence - and hence cannot be compared in any regard.
