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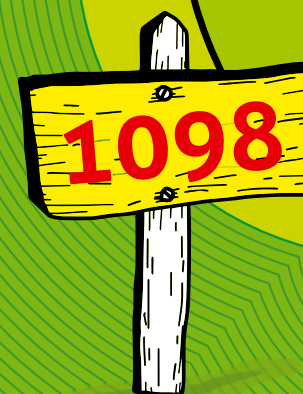

CHILDLINE's nationwide campaign clicks with children

Nelson Mandela once said that there can be no keener revelation of a society's soul than the way in which it treats its children. When it comes to India, this aspect is reflected in CHILDLINE 1098, the national, 24-hour, free, emergency phone and outreach service for children in need of care and protection. Initiated in 1996 as a pilot project in Mumbai, CHILDLINE is currently operational in 503 cities across 35 states and union territories across the country.

As it approaches the silver jubilee milestone, CHILDLINE has been stepping up its sustained efforts to enhance awareness levels among Indians regarding child protection and their responsibilities towards ensuring the same.

'CHILDLINE Se Dosti', a weeklong national campaign was organised recently, as part of this endeavour, with the aim to make ordinary citizens stakeholders in CHILDLINE by pledging that they will be true friends of every child in need of help.

Conceptualised to be in sync with the spirit of CHILDLINE, this special initiative focused on reaching out to people from all sections of the society, sensitising them to the cause of children safety and initiating a plan of action that propels them towards a much-needed change in thoughts and deeds.

The 'CHILDLINE Se Dosti' 2018 celebrations were planned in a manner that enabled important messages to be conveyed through a wide range of activities. From tying friendship bands to stakeholders to distributing eco-friendly surgical masks for child protection, the implementation facilitated a direct connect with far reaching implications. Clearly, the message conveyed via these activities would remain ingrained in the minds of stakeholders going forward as well.

Signature campaigns were held in order to provide safe neighbourhoods for all children and the betterment of their lives, with the pledge being 'Every child's well-being is my responsibility too'. In addition, awareness programmes on child

marriage and corporal punishment or physical abuse were conducted at various locations.

The week witnessed a series of relevant theme-based events that CHILDLINE organized across cities and towns. Programmes were arranged during this period ranging from signature campaigns to rail yatras, street plays to rallies, games to competitions for children and more.

Notable among these was 'Suraksha Bandhan,' an activity conducted in association with the police and Railway Protection Force (RPF) at various places. Other memorable activities included the Hausla event celebrations at New Delhi, rally by children at Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh, street plays organized at Shillong, poster releasing at Andhra Pradesh, press meet in Visakhapatnam, video screening at Chennai railway station, signature campaign in Gaya (Bihar) and awareness sessions conducted in Barwani (Madhya Pradesh).

CHILDLINE Se Dosti was conceptualized back in 2007

John F. Kennedy once described children as the living messages we send to a time we will not see. Woodrow T. Wilson termed friendship as the only cement that will ever hold the world together. These perspectives shared by two former US Presidents underscore the importance of friendship or 'Dosti', a simple yet far reaching concept and its relevance for children. Embodying this is the 'CHILDLINE Se Dosti' concept, which represents a close, true relationship, one that can be nurtured over the years.

Its origin can be traced back to the year 2007, when CHILDLINE was undergoing one of the largest expansions in the history of the organization. The Government of India had set a deadline for the CHILDLINE team to create a path-breaking awareness campaign that would highlight the significance of child protection and CHILDLINE 1098 in 160 cities and 25 states. It led to the creation of a unique property for CHILDLINE that would be etched in the minds of people for years to come. After weeks of exploration, the 'CHILDLINE Se Dosti' campaign title was finalised.

Since then, 'CHILDLINE Se Dosti' has gone on to become an established nationwide awareness campaign in the process

of making ordinary citizens key stakeholders in the child protection process. The issue of child protection began to resonate with people across all walks of life.

Citizens from across the country were invited to take the pledge and commit themselves to be a CHILDLINE Dost and participate in a multitude of exciting events organised throughout the country on Children's Day. What began as an experimental drive with the distribution of Dosti coupons is now a pan-India awareness and fundraising campaign.

Year after year, the much anticipated event, 'CHILDLINE Se Dosti' is celebrated all over the country with unmatched vigour and enthusiasm. A week-long, nationwide campaign is held from November 14th to 20th every year. It aims at creating friends for CHILDLINE and is envisaged as a warm and inviting initiative to create awareness about CHILDLINE 1098.

'Dosti Week' is synonymous with fun, excitement and aims at driving change at a local and national level. Reaching out to the old and young from all walks of life and bringing together children with their protectors in the form of police officials, allied systems, educational institutions, the youth, working adults, CHILDLINE Se Dosti is not just another campaign but a medium to strengthen the rights of children in India.

The campaign involves a range of events, activities across the country like rickshaw and bus outreach programmes, signature campaigns, walkathons, rallies, tying of the suraksha bandhan to police personnel to nukkad natak etc. Be it a student, a taxi driver, an IT professional, a rickshaw puller or a housewife, the objective is to reach out to people from different walks of life and initiate action towards change.

The basic purpose of this campaign is to involve the community by understanding and recognizing child protection issues and being proactive in reducing vulnerability of children to risks. This initiative has been conceptualised with the hope to generate a million 'Dosts' for CHILDLINE and acquaint people with the CHILDLINE 1098 phone helpline and services for children in distress.

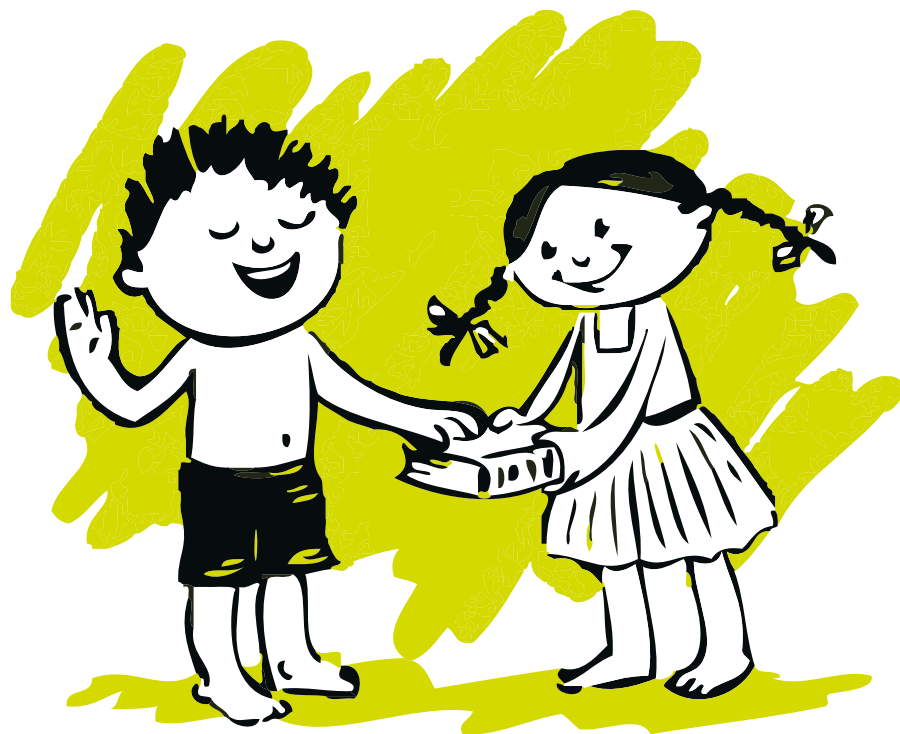

Hausla, 2018

Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India with the support of CHILDLINE India Foundation, NIPCCD and CARA hosted a four-day celebration named Hausla 2018 from 26th November to 29th November for the children residing in Child Care Institutions (CCIs) across the country. The event aimed for inspiring and mainstreaming these children by providing a national platform to showcase their sporting skills and other talents. During the week-long celebration, different activities apart from sports were also organized like debate competition, free expression (Abhivyakti), painting competition, athletics meet, football, chess competition and CHILDLINE birthday celebrations. The event was held at NIPCCD Campus and was felicitated by NIPCCD, CHILDLINE India Foundation and MWCD. More than 700 children from Child Care Institutions (CCIs) across the country participated in the event. CHILDLINE India Foundation played an active role right from the initial stages of planning including logistics, facilitation and provided voluntary support throughout the event.

Hausla Event was inaugurated on 26th November 2018 by the MWCD Hon'ble Secretary Shri Rakesh Srivastava. Post inauguration, painting, debate and chess competitions were organized. Children participated with zest and enthusiasm in all the competitions. A painting competition was organized as paintings are considered to be the best mode for children to express their feelings through fun with colors and also helps in their creative skills development. The painting competition was judged by a panel of three judges. The debate competition forced the children to consider two perspectives, not just their own but that of others also. It encouraged the kids to anticipate objections towards their arguments and to respond to counter arguments. Hence, the debate competition was organized in two rounds - preliminary and final round.

On 27th November 2018, Abhivyakti (free expression) event was organized on the theme of safe spaces for children in family, schools, child care institutions and public places. Children were given freedom to express their ideas and

This activity gave the children an opportunity to explore and enhance their creativity as every child thinks differently and has unique ideas. State-wise teams performed on the assigned topics. Their performances were judged by a panel of three judges.

It is known that sports activities not only bring out the physical abilities in children, they also encourage their spirit to win over challenges and prepare them to accept defeat with grace. On 28th and 29th November 2018, Athletics meet was organized at Jawahar Lal Nehru Stadium. Smt Maneka Sanjay Gandhi, Union Minister for Ministry of Women and Child Development flagged off the Hausla 2018 Sports Meet in the presence of Ms. Mary Kom, Indian Olympic Boxer and Member of Parliament. 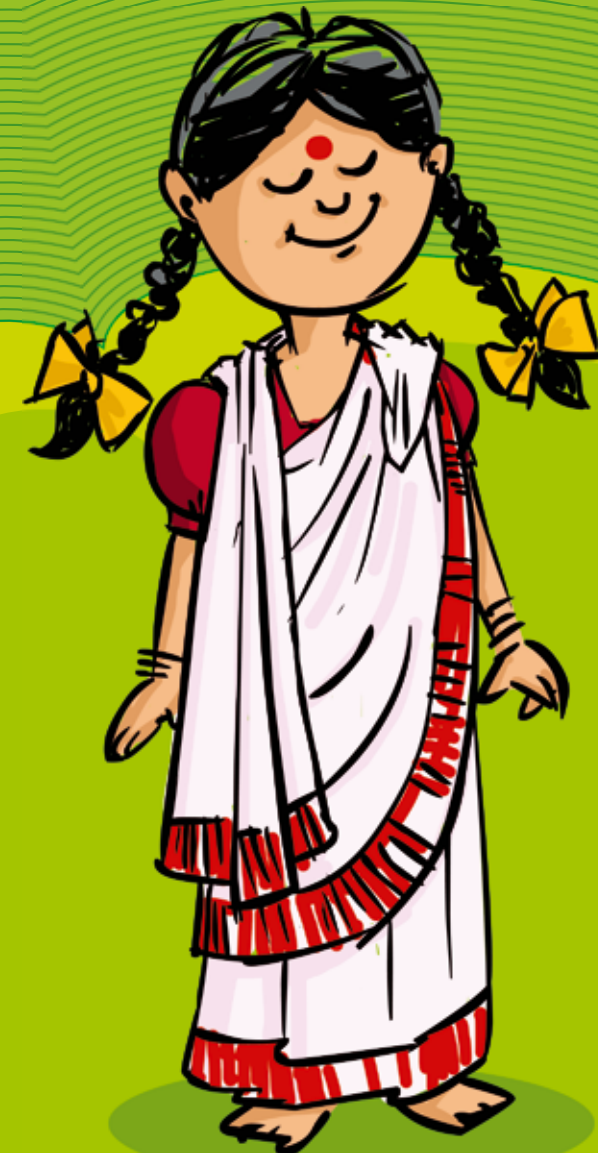

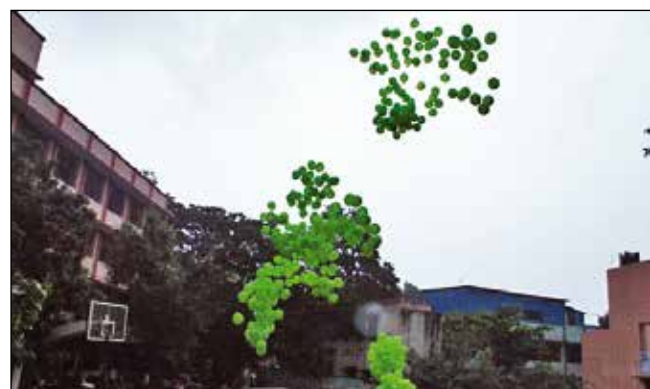
Chennai

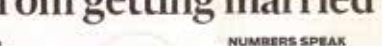
