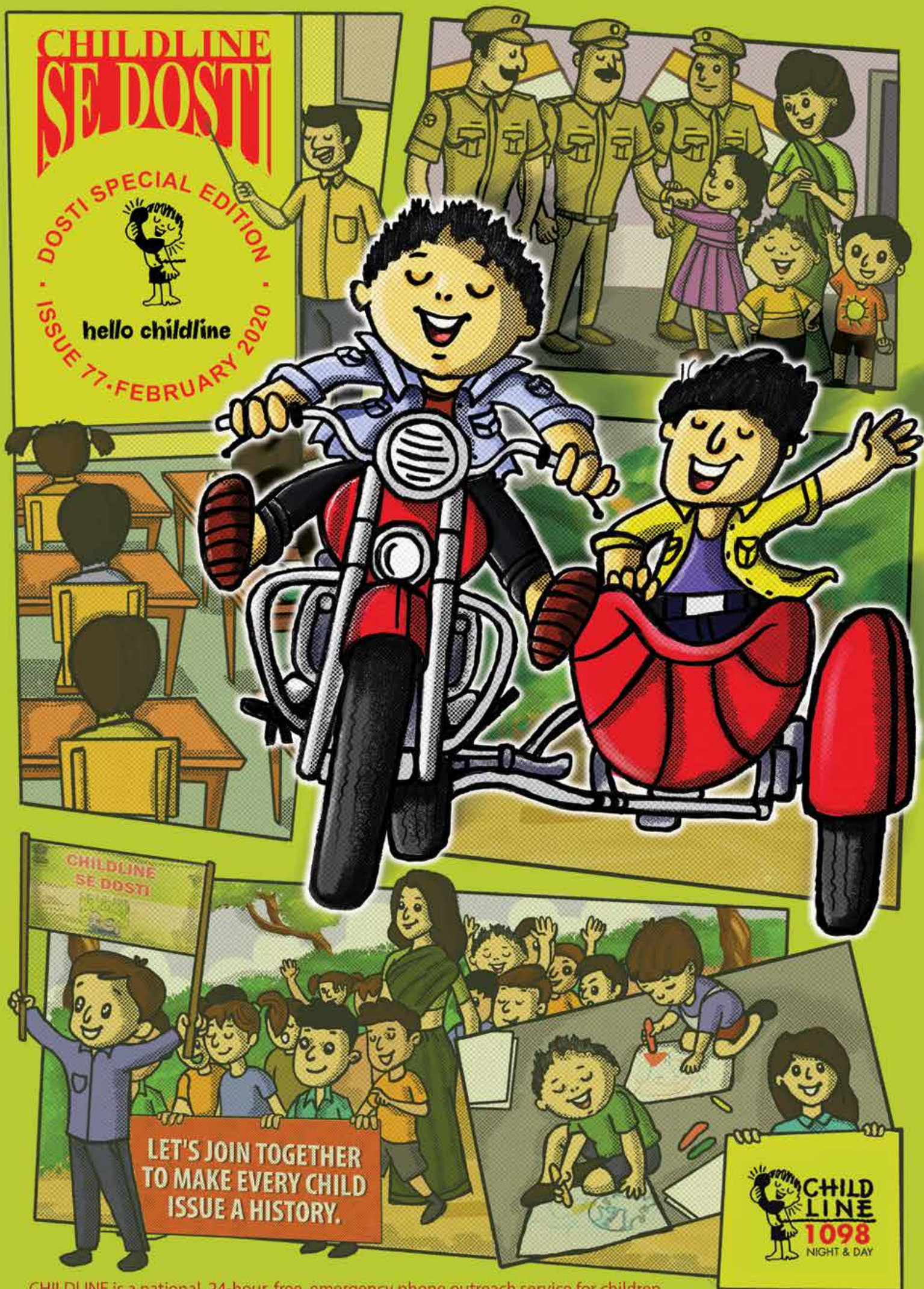

CHILDLINE is now operational in 570+ cities, 35 states and UTs across India, which was initiated in 1996 as a pilot project in Mumbai. With the aim to provide rehabilitation and care for the children hailing from unsafe situations, CHILDLINE reaches out to the most marginalized children.

CHILDLINE provides them relief in the form of shelter, medical aid, repatriation, rescue, emotional support and guidance, etc. So, if you see any child in distress or in crisis, Call 1098.

As CHILDLINE approaches the silver jubilee milestone, it has been ensuring the responsibilities by stepping up its sustained efforts to enhance awareness level among Indians regarding child protection.

‘CHILDLINE Se Dosti’, a week-long national campaign was organised recently by pledging that we could be true friends of every child in need of help with the aim to encourage ordinary citizens to be the stakeholders of CHILDLINE.

Sensitizing people from all sections of the society for the cause of child safety by initiating a plan of action that propels them towards a much-needed change in thoughts and deeds, was the focus of the special initiative.

The ‘CHILDLINE Se Dosti’ 2019 celebrations with a wide range of activities convey important messages. From tying Dosti bands to stakeholders and distributing eco-friendly surgical masks for child protection, the implementation facilitated a direct connection with far-reaching implications.

To ensure safe neighbourhoods for all children and the betterment of their lives, Signature Campaigns to rail yatras, street plays to rallies, games to competitions for children and more such activities were held with the pledge ‘Every child's well-being is my responsibility too’. In addition, awareness programs on child marriage and corporal punishment or physical abuse were also conducted at various locations.

‘Suraksha Bandhan’, an activity conducted in association with the Police and Railway Protection Force (RPF) at various places were notable among them. Several other memorable activities were also conducted.

‘CHILDLINE Se Dosti’ 2019 celebrations with the message “take the pledge and commit yourselves to become a CHILDLINE Dost in every CHILDLINE city/district in India” was bustling with such events and activities. ## CHILDLINE Se Dosti was conceptualized back in 2007

Oscar Oscar Wilde once described “The best way to make children good is to make them happy.” Baltasar Gracian once quoted “Friendship multiplies the good of life and divides the evil.” These perspectives underscored the importance of friendship or ‘Dosti’, a simple yet far-reaching concept and its relevance for children.

‘CHILDLINE Se Dosti’ embodies the same concept, which represents a close, true relationship, one that can be nurtured over the years.

‘CHILDLINE Se Dosti’ was originated in the year 2007 with the largest expansions in the history of the organisation. The Government of India did set a deadline for the CHILDLINE team to create a path-breaking awareness campaign that would highlight the significance of child protection and CHILDLINE 1098 in 160 cities and 25 states. The ‘CHILDLINE Se Dosti’ campaign title was finalised after weeks of exploration.

‘CHILDLINE Se Dosti’ then got established as a nationwide awareness campaign and the need for child protection began to resonate with people across all walks of life. On Children’s Day, a multitude of exciting events organised throughout the country in which citizens from across the country were invited to take the pledge and commit themselves to be a CHILDLINE Dost. It is now a Pan India awareness and fundraising campaign.

A week-long, nationwide campaign is held from November 14th to 20th every year. It aims at creating Dosts for CHILDLINE and is envisaged as a warm and inviting initiative to create awareness about CHILDLINE 1098. ‘Dosti Week’ is synonymous with fun, excitement and aims at driving change at local and national level.

To involve the community by understanding and recognizing child protection issues, and being proactive in reducing vulnerability of children to risks is the basic purpose of this campaign. This initiative has been conceptualised with the hope to generate a million ‘Dosts’ for CHILDLINE and acquaint people with the CHILDLINE 1098 phone helpline and services for children in distress.





## CHILDLINE Se Dosti

A CHILDLINE Dost is someone who chooses to lend a hand to CHILDLINE to help the children in distress together. To be a CHILDLINE Dost, you need to be aware of the things happening around you, take action when required and call CHILDLINE 1098 to help protect the children in need.

## DELHI

### Health session

At the end of the session, the team distributed respiratory masks to the people to protect themselves from pollution.

The team oriented the children at Kashmiri Park about the rally route and slogans on child labour. The rally started from Kashmiri Park and via Bhogal main market and at the police booth of the Bhogal market. After the rally, the children put up a dance performance and a street play on child labour. After the street play, CHILDLINE Delhi team spread awareness about child labour and also about the message which the children conveyed through the play. The team also shared information about

CHILDLINE and distributed CHILDLINE pamphlets and book stickers to the children.

### Signature Campaign

Railway CHILDLINE Delhi organised a Signature Campaign in railway station premises. The program was inaugurated by the Station Superintendent of HNRS. During the CHILDLINE Se Dosti week, the railway officials and the stakeholders participated in the Signature Campaign program.

The main theme of the Signature Campaign was to keep the station clean and to protect the children who are in need of care and protection. Most of the people joined in the Signature Campaign and took an oath to keep the station premises clean. During the Signature Campaign program, Railway CHILDLINE Delhi team also spread awareness about the CHILDLINE helpline number 1098 among the people through the distribution of pamphlets and standees.

### Workshop on Child Rights

CHILDLINE Delhi on the occasion of Children's Day organised a workshop on child rights and child protection at World Vision India Organisation for girls from Sonia Vihar. The program was inaugurated by the Senior Program Manager, World Vision India and expressed that it is a very good initiative to create awareness on CHILDLINE 1098 and its helpline number among the children. He also commented that "they are the assets of the nation, we must love and take care of our children and protect their rights". CHILDLINE Delhi team also organised an awareness campaign on children who need care and protection. The team also informed the people to call CHILDLINE



1098 immediately whenever they find a child who needs care and protection.

Around 150 to 180 students, general public, World Vision India Organisation staff members and CHILDLINE Delhi team participated in the program. The main objective of the program was to share information about child rights, child labour and child molestation. The team took a session on good and bad touch and shared the information about POCSO Act 2012.

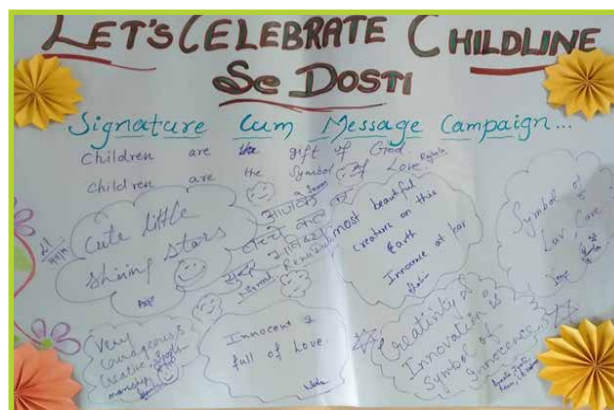
**Screening of 'Komal' Film**

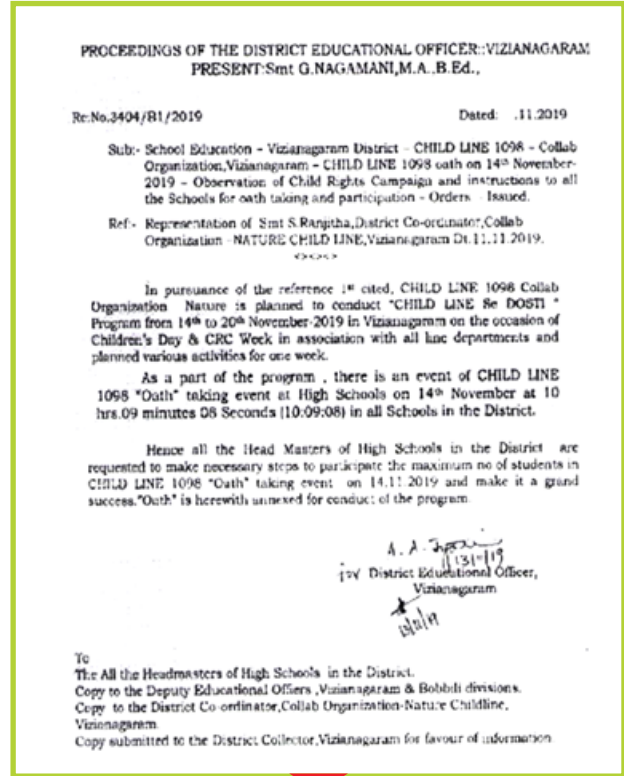

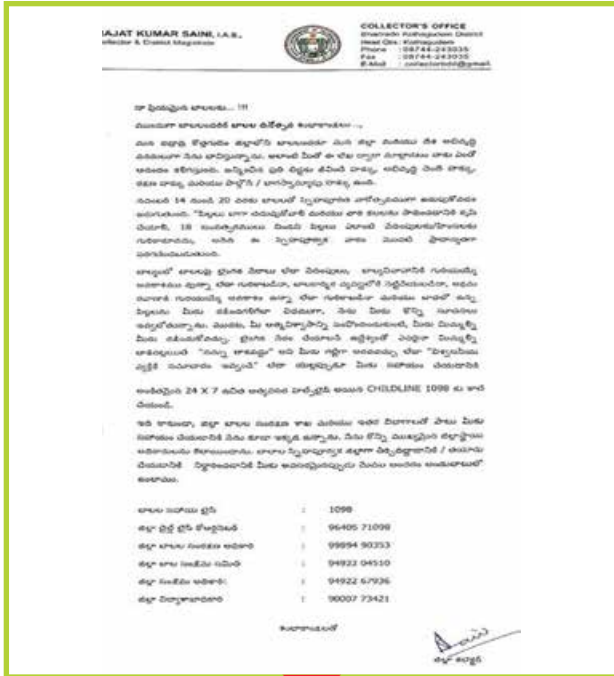

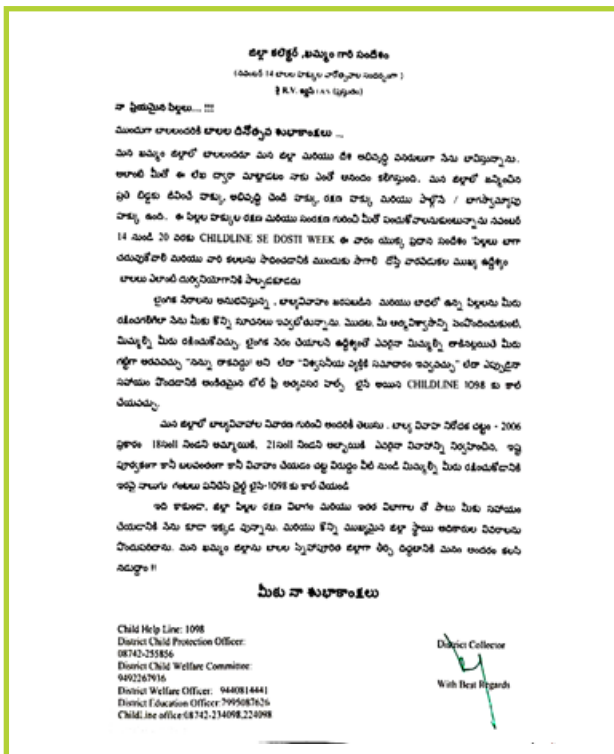
