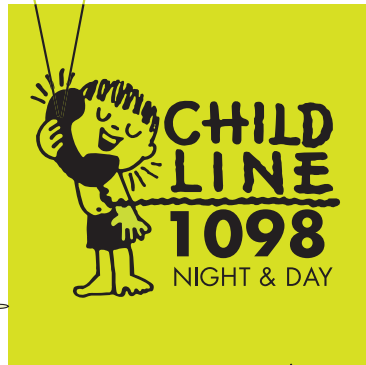

The truth is that even as of 2011, a little more than 4% is allocated towards children. What is CHILDLINE?

CHILDLINE is a national, 24-hour, free, emergency telephone helpline and outreach service for children in need of care and protection. CHILDLINE number 1098 is a toll free number that is common in all the cities of India. Initially started in Mumbai in June 1996, CHILDLINE is currently operational in 194 cities. CHILDLINE aims to reach out to the most marginalised children and provides interventions of shelter, medical, repatriation, rescue, death related, sponsorships, emotional support and guidance.

No to Child Marriage

Mary, a sixteen year old girl who had scored really well in her standard 12th exams, had expressed her desire to study further, but her parents wanted her to get married.

On July 13, 2011, an anonymous call was received by **CHILDLINE Trichy** informing that a minor girl is engaged to a 30 year old man in Vaiyampatti, Trichy.

Acting on the tip-off, the CHILDLINE Trichy team along with District Administration swung into action in time. Subsequently CHILDLINE team along CWC member, District Welfare Officer rushed to Vaiyampatti and ensured that the wedding ceremony did not take place.



The team with the help of the police stopped the marriage and saved the girl. CHILDLINE team counseled both families and cautioned against proceeding with marriage violating the law. Jayashree Muralidharan, District Collector asked the child, whether she was willing to study further, to which Mary readily expressed her interest.

The District Collector instructed Child Welfare Committee (CWC) to make necessary arrangements and support to the girl with immediate effect and her upkeep. It was then collectively decided that CHILDLINE along with District administration will jointly contribute the expenses Mary's education along with CWC.

Mother Turns her back on Motherhood, Abandoning her own son

A staff member of Sriram Chandra Bhanj (S.C.B) Hospital called **CHILDLINE Cuttack** asking for immediate assistance. They had found a three-month-old boy, abandoned in the hospital.

The baby was brought by the mother to the outpatient department of the hospital who requested another lady, to hold her baby five minutes while she went to purchase medicines. The woman patiently waited with the baby for around four hours, but the mother did not turn up. At last, she informed the police outpost about the entire incident.



CHILDLINE Cuttack team reached the hospital and intervened. Necessary arrangements were made, support was provided by CHILDLINE team. Meanwhile, child was produced before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) who then requested CHILDLINE to shift the child to the Children's home. CHILDLINE then started a search operation to trace the child's parents.....

Innocence Lost

When Saif, (13), left home for a better life but fate had other plans. He ended up working for a contractor at the railway tracks. He would wake up at 6 a.m. daily to start work. After a brutal 16-hour day work, a couple of chapattis and salt was all he got for dinner. Saif was just one of the many children who were made to work for long hours but received a meager pay and brutally beaten up.

CHILDLINE Ahmednagar received information that children were being brought to work as child labourers, under a contractor, on railway tracks. After receiving the



information, CHLDLINE team rushed to the spot. The team spoke to the children to gather more information. The team met Superintendent of Police, Ahmednagar to discuss further intervention.

The team along with Police, Labour Department officials rescued the children. Meanwhile an FIR was lodged and contractor was booked under the Indian Penal Code, Child Labor Act, Juvenile Justice Act and the Bonded Labor Act. The matter was also brought to the notice of Child Welfare Committee (CWC). A large scale networking exercise between CHLDLINE, Labour Department and the Superintendent of Ahmednagar, resulted in children being restored to their homes.

CHLDLINE Jaipur rescues 150 Innocent Children

In a massive raid and rescue operation by CHLDLINE Jaipur along with Police, 150 child labourers working in zari (embroidery) units were rescued. Children were found working in small dingy rooms, with no light or ventilation. These small rooms were homes as well as workplaces for children trafficked from West Bengal, Bihar and Uttar Pradesh.



The rescue team found 30-50 boys found working in each of these Zari units in the most appalling conditions which were hard to find and even harder to monitor and control. The children were working more than 12-14hrs a day without break for a meager Rs. 200 per month, these little children have not only lost out on their childhood but also have lost their sense of freedom and liberty.

Ten people have been arrested and booked under Juvenile Justice Act (JJBA). Zari making and work has been classified

as hazardous form of child labor in the Child Labor (Prohibition and Regulation) Act 1986 in India.

In Safe Hands

5 boys, aged below 18 were on their way to Tirupur in search of jobs were rescued by CHLDLINE Salem. The children were from remote villages in Patna; they had been working at a biscuit firm in Bangalore till recently as coolies. But since the firm's management did not disperse their wages for the last two months, they got in touch with someone to help them find other odd jobs at Tirupur.



Children boarded a train from Bangalore to Tirupur and when the train made a brief halt at Salem Junction, they alighted to have tea. CHLDLINE team member saw the group of boys, alerted CHLDLINE Salem, who then contacted the police seeking assistance. The Police and the CHLDLINE team together rescued the Children from a potentially harmful labour-related trafficking situation.....

After the rescue, all the children were brought to the CHLDLINE centre and they were provided with immediate care and protection. They were produced before the Chairperson along with Member's of Child Welfare Committee. The children were shifted to the temporary shelter care home . CHLDLINE is following up to trace the address of children and to get in touch with their families in Patna.

Justice at last for Shafiya!

Shafiya comes from a poor family. She lives in Mumbai with her mother, stepfather, five sisters and two brothers. She was the eldest in the family. Shafiya studied up to fifth standard and had to drop out eventually to help look after her siblings and help in the household chores. Her stepfather used to work but later lost his job and gradually began to seek solace in alcohol.



Shafiya's mother was duped by her friend Reshma Mohammad into believing her daughter would get to work better in Kolhapur. But on reaching Kolhapur, Reshma sold her for Rs.5000/- to, two other women who took her to the red light district where she was forced to become a part of the flesh trade. When Shafiya's mother couldn't contact her, she began a frantic search and called **CHILDLINE Mumbai** for help.



Shafiya was brought back to Mumbai on March 1, 2008 and was convinced to file an FIR against the perpetrators in order to receive the justice she truly deserved. On March 02, 2008, Reshma, was arrested by the Investigating Officer later she was taken (shafiya) was taken to Kolhapur where she assisted in getting the other two ladies arrested too.

Shafiya has given her 10th std. board exams. She seems well-placed and happy at the home, and enjoys what she is doing currently.

CHILDLINE Cuttack saves Shubra

Shubra was the sole eye witness of the murder of eight year old child; the accused had threatened to kill him. Even as he was sent by his parents to his maternal uncle's house, the accused persistently threatened him. **CHILDLINE Puri** approached Committee for Legal Aid for Poor (CLAP) seeking legal assistance. Consequently, the CLAP collected and examined all the documents regarding the case, interacted with the parents of the deceased and the child to ascertain the situation.

CLAP wrote to D.G. Police, S.P, Khurda and the I.I.C.Chandanpur Police Station seeking protection for the child and his family members. When all these attempts failed, a writ petition was filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa seeking protection for the child. Following the order of High Court, the child had been provided with police protection to give his deposition before the Court of

Session Judge, Puri in each fixed date.

At the final hearing the High Court found the accused being guilty of commission of offence u/s 302/341 IPC direct each of the convict and to undergo rigorous imprisonment for life and to pay a fine of Rs.15,000/-. In default of giving this fine, convict has to suffer simple imprisonment for 6 months. 50% of the fine amount shall be paid to the father of the deceased to a compensation for the murder of his only son.

Pure Evil: Victims of Forced Begging

Anjali and Athira, six and eight years respectively were living with their father, Shivaji Narayan in Kakkur village in Calicut since they lost their mother. Their father was an alcoholic. **CHILDLINE Calicut** team found that children were taken early in the mornings by their father to the streets to beg. They sat on the pavements to beg for money and gave all the money to him. It was not until late night that both children were taken home by their father.



"We have been given only two meals per day: one at 2 p.m and the other at 11.p.m. We are very hungry now. We begged him to leave us but he refused," revealed the children to **CHILDLINE** team.

CHILDLINE team notified Police about the situation. Meanwhile, the team along with Police rescued the children and sent them to shelter home. An FIR was being filed against the father. The timely intervention helped release two girls from their father, who had forced them into begging.

CHILDLINE rescues Merrin from Job racket

Merrin, a 14-year-old-girl a native of West Bengal, was lured to Delhi on the pretext of a lucrative job by a placement agency. Merrin had dreams of a better life but she landed up working as a domestic maid. She was tortured mentally and physically by her employer, Merrin ran away to escape



the torture. During an outreach, **CHILDLINE Gurgaon** team found the girl wandering on the streets. The team took the girl to the CHILDLINE centre and provided her with immediate care and protection.

During the counseling, the girl revealed to the team that, there were 15-20 girls along with her and all of them who were given to the placement agency. She however wasn't sure of their whereabouts. With the help of the CHILDLINE team, she was produced before Child Welfare Committee (CWC), Gurgaon who directed to send the child to a temporary shelter. CHILDLINE is currently following up with the case.

CHILDLINE Delhi rescues 11 children

This case is still under review and CHILDLINE is following up on any further cases of child labour.

Children aged between 12-17 years from Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Assam and West Bengal were found working in the slaughter house run by a private contractor in the Ghazipur area. They were brought to Delhi, from Assam, to Delhi by the contractor.

CHILDLINE Delhi received an anonymous call informing them that children are working in a slaughter house. Accordingly a plan was prepared; the CHILDLINE team along with Police rescued the children from slaughter house. The rescue team found the children working in a very bad condition.

Children were sent to children's home in Alipur area in Delhi. Two contractors were arrested by Police on charges of child labour.

Little Ajay reunited with father

CHILDLINE Gwalior received a call from the Railway Protection Force (RPF) personnel in Gwalior station about a child wandering at Gwalior Railway Station. CHILDLINE team visited the station and found the child.



Through the interactions with the child, the team found that Ajay ran away from Sonagir and boarded a train, which

brought him to Gwalior. CHILDLINE team took Ajay to CHILDLINE centre and provided him with immediate care and protection. He was produced before Child Welfare Committee (CWC) who then directed to send him to a temporary shelter home. CHILDLINE officials contacted boy's father. On seeing his nephew safe and sound; Ajay's father couldn't hold back his tears and thanked CHILDLINE for this happy reunion.

CHILDLINE Ahmednagar rescues Deepika from rapist father

Deepika, 13 year old girl was living with her father and elder sister. She was studying in 8th standard. Deepika was raped by her father, using chloroform to make her unconscious. This was known to Deepika's elder sister, Disha. She was also physically tortured and threatened by her father, who had burnt her hand and legs and warned her not to reveal this to anyone.

Deepika gradually gathered enough courage to inform her uncle about her plight it was her uncle who contacted **CHILDLINE Ahmednagar** who immediately rescued both the children.

CHILDLINE team brought the children to CHILDLINE centre. After examining the facts and medical checkup, children were presented to members of CWC. The accused was arrested under Indian Penal code (IPC) section 376.

DID YOU KNOW?

CHILDLINE does not believe in duplication of existing facilities but linking the children to existing services - Health care, Shelters, Education, Nutrition and so on.

Before becoming an independent NGO, **CHILDLINE** was born as a field project of Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS). It was incubated at TISS for 2 years before taking off as an independent NGO founded by Jerro Billimoria at TISS.

Child Protection is an adjunct to Child Rights and requires protocols and mechanisms on the ground to ensure its effectiveness. **CHILDLINE** is recognised as one of the foremost mechanisms/services in Child Protection.

CHILDLINE's service delivery for 1098 in partnership with local organizations forms the Intervention component of Child Protection services.

The XIth Five Year plan specifically asks that the **CHILDLINE** service be extended to all of India's 640+ districts as part of Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS).

Child Labour & India's Growth Story

Child labourers have considerable stake in India's GDP with near to eleven per cent of the total workforce being the children finds Nishit kumar, Head, Communication and Strategic Initiatives, CHILDLINE India Foundation.

Over the past ten years of about eight per cent per annum GDP growth, there has been widespread talk of India's Demographic Dividend (share of population in 15-60 age group) arising out of the young average age of India's population.

The theory is that the smaller the share of population in the below 15 and above 60, the greater the contribution of the productive population to GDP growth. Among the propagators of the India Demographic Dividend story are Dr. Manmohan Singh, Hon'ble Prime Minister and many notable figures around the world. Many present the story as though the demographic contours of India have been carefully sculpted through policy, management and governance. Far from it, India has a history of ignoring demographic trends and not preparing for it.

The 2001 census threw up the figures that children under 18 accounted for almost 43% of India's population of about 450 million. Yet, in spite of the first UPA government manifesto of a commitment of nine per cent of annual Union budget for children, even as of 2011, a little more than four per cent is allocated towards children. In this gap between the needs of the world's largest children's population and (amongst) the world's lowest per child budgets that is allocated in India is the story of Indian Children's contribution to the GDP. The story of Child Labour in India.

The story is best unfolded by an examination of the Census data on child Labour. The Census data for child Labour has traditionally been presented as children up to 14 years:

The figure of 12.67 million as child labour has been widely reported. The department of Census, Government of India has just published provisional census data for the Census of 2010. (<http://censusindia.gov.in/2011-common/censusdataonline.html>).

Once again the age wise data reported by the Census is 5-9 yrs, 10-14 yrs and 15-19 years. Since the Juvenile Justice Act, 2000 has pegged the age of children, in line with

international conventions, at 18, we can no longer overlook the population of working children in the age group of 15-18. However, the Census does not show this breakup.

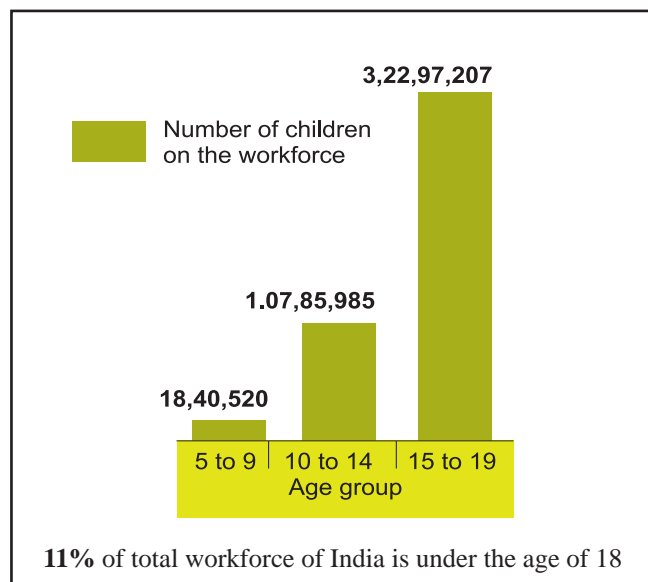

If you take the children up to 14 years, the total number of children in the workforce is **12626505**. Similar to the Census of 2001. The real picture emerges when you start adding the



child work force in the ages 15-19. One could argue that 19 year old is ought to be excluded from the calculation of child labourers. However the Census does not, as yet provide that data. However, a detailed analysis of the same shows that vast bulk of 15-19 year old have not completed 10th standard. So, they have been in the workforce before they turned 18. For the purpose of discussion, 15-19 age group in the workforce is included.

11% of the workforce of India is child labour. One in every 10 workers in India is a child! If you allocate a tenth of India's GDP to this share you can see India's Child Labour has a stake in India's GDP.



A detailed analysis of the various sectors presented in the Census data for both Main and Marginal workers clearly shows that some sectors are more prone to child labour than others.

What can be done about Child Labour? In 1979, the Government appointed Gurupadswamy Committee that studied the issue of child labour and observed that as long as poverty remains, it would be difficult to totally eliminate child labour and hence, any attempt to abolish it through legal recourse would not be a practical proposition.

The Committee recommended a ban on child labour in hazardous areas and a multiple policy to deal with the problems of working children. Based on the recommendations of Gurupadaswamy Committee, Child Labour (Prohibition & Regulation) Act was enacted in 1986. The Act prohibits employment of children in certain specified hazardous occupations and processes and regulates the working conditions in others.

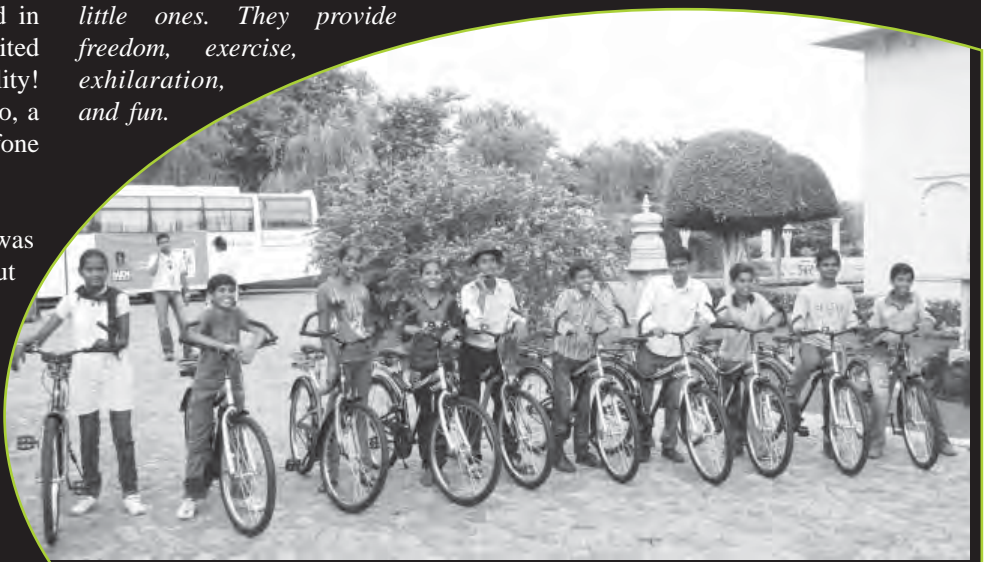

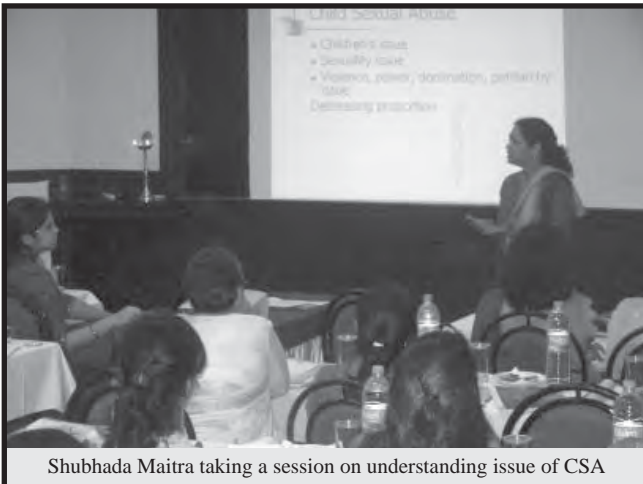
CSA Workshop for Counselors

Mumbai: The workshop for Counselors at Heritage Hotel, Byculla for debating minimum protocols for handling Child Sexual Abuse (CSA) cases; saw 36 counselors' take a day off from their busy schedules to participate.

The workshop was organised by the CSA Awareness Project team, CIF and included school counselors, psychiatrists and therapists. Resource persons from the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) and National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences (NIMHANS), Bangalore took the counselors through a refresher on the issue of CSA and counselling methods that can be employed for survivors.

It was inaugurated by lighting a lamp, by the two resource persons, Dr. Shubhada Maitra and Dr. Preeti Kandasamy and Nishit Kumar, Head- Communication and Strategic Initiatives, CIF.

Starting with the simple question of 'Why are you here today?', Dr. Shubhada Maitra, Professor at TISS helped the participants realise that though their work is with people from diverse backgrounds, whether visually impaired students, children from remand homes or adult survivors, CSA had been experienced by all, cutting across all barriers.

Discussing how CSA is not a stand alone issue but is interlinked with issues such as the economic dependence of women, as well as being a domination and power issue, Dr. Maitra took the participants through the various stages of a survivor's emotional state, starting from the abuse experience, internalisation and the resulting behaviour.

Picking up from the effect of abuse on the emotional state of a survivor, Dr. Preeti Kandasamy, Child Psychiatrist, NIMHANS held the participants interest as she took them through the basics of forensic interviewing, intervention strategies and the importance of rapport building with the

According to the last census, 12.7 million children belonging to the age group of 5-14 years were economically active and one in every eight children were working either for his/her own household or for somebody else. It also surmised that

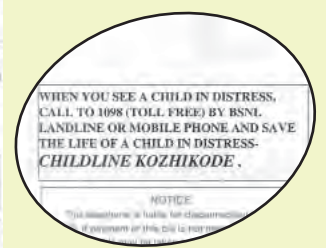

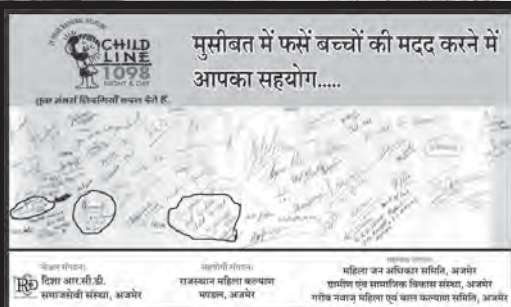

Wrong medication hospitalizes teenager for over four months

NEGLECTANCE BY A DOCTOR FROM SONARI VILLAGE OF SINNAR HAS IMMOBILIZED A THIRTEEN-YEAR-OLD, WHO IS NOW GETTING TREATED AT THE ADGAON MEDICAL COLLEGE HOSPITAL AND RESEARCH CENTRE

Amol Shinde, a thirteen-year-old boy from Sonari village near Sinnar, was taken to a hospital in his village by his mother for getting a fever. The doctor gave him an injection after which there was swelling in his right thigh. It developed into a abscess cavity. When opened, the doctor gave two tablets to normalize the swelling. He also injected two saline bottles but his condition did not improve. The doctor then asked his mother to buy two more injections at a cost around Rs 100. Amol's condition be-

gan deteriorating, the doctor shifted the village. The boy was taken to the government hospital at Dapur, Sinnar. "He had swelling from his right hip till his knee had admitted him for five days at Dapur but his condition did not improve. He was then admitted for 15 days at Bytco Hospital. Here too his condition was not stable then he was brought here at Adgaon Medical College. Since the past four months he is being treated here. He informed his mother, Amol's Shinde to NZ. But the doctor's name could not be known since her mother is illiterate and does not remember his name. Amol's family had shifted to the

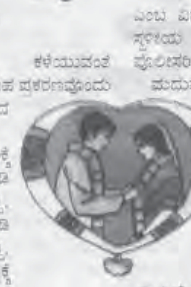
