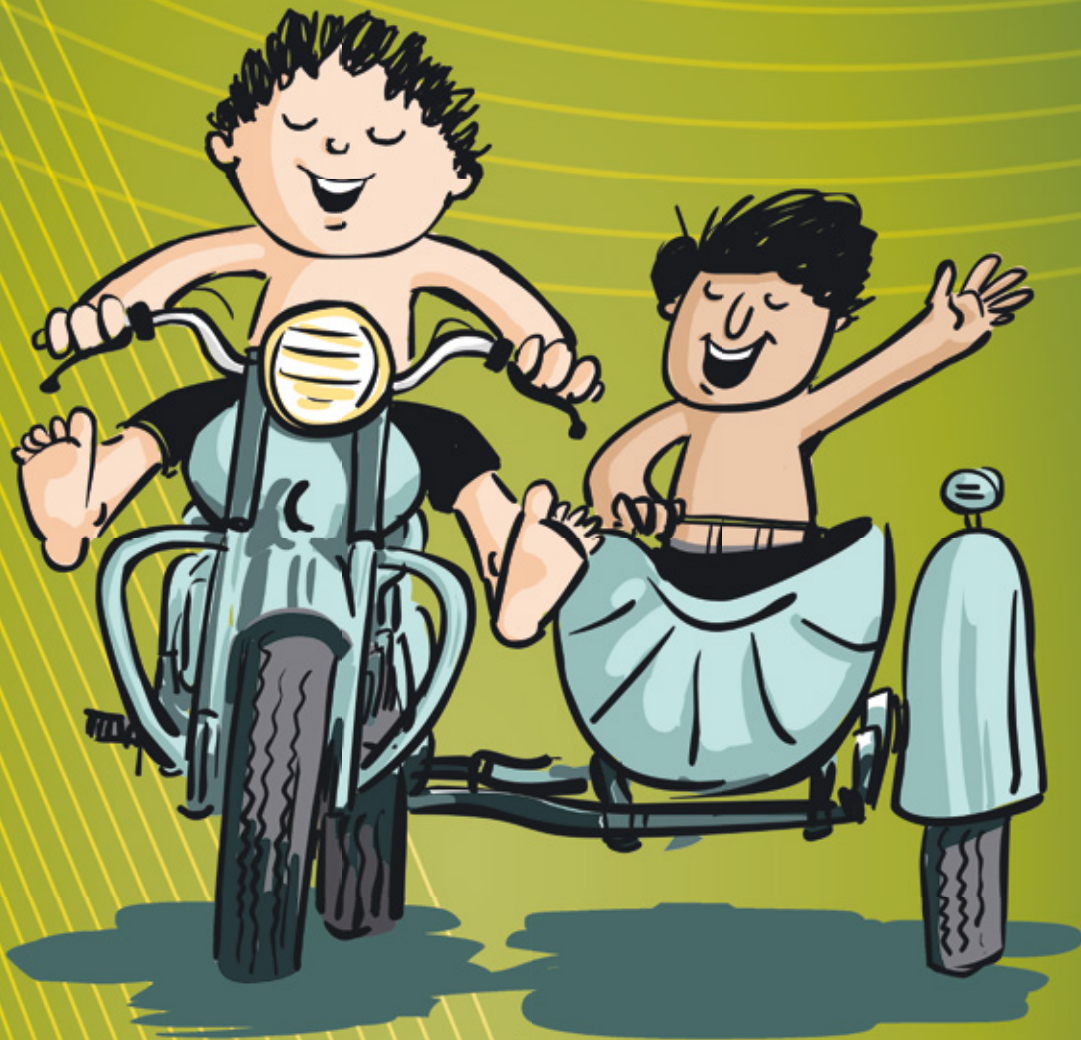

## What is CHILDLINE?

CHILDLINE is a national, 24 hour, free, emergency phone and outreach service for children in need of care and protection. Initiated in 1996, as a pilot project in Mumbai, CHILDLINE is currently operational in **280** cities across **30** states and UTs in India.

CHILDLINE reaches out to the most marginalized children with the aim of providing them rehabilitation and care from unsafe situations. CHILDLINE provides relief and rehabilitation in the space of shelter, medical aid, repatriation, rescue, emotional support and guidance. So if YOU see a child in distress, Call **1098!**







CHILDLINE Se Dosti was conceptualized back in 2007.

Friendship aka 'dosti' was a simple yet far reaching concept. The idea of a CHILDLINE Dost seemed like a close, real relationship, one that could be nurtured over years, best epitomized by Jai-Veeru from Sholay.

Childline Se Dosti was a distant, one-off initiative present in our subconscious.

CHILDLINE was undergoing one of its largest expansions in the history of the organisation. The tempo was rising whilst the teams were burning the midnight oil to meet deadlines set by the Government.

160 cities, 25 states, but a severe lack of awareness.

The need of the hour was not a marketing tactic, a fund-raising dinner, a fresh branding strategy, a new corporate tie-up or a path-breaking advertising campaign... it was the creation of a unique property for CHILDLINE that would be etched in the minds of people for years to come.

Thus began the brainstorming, brawls, bickering, banter and bedlam.

What was the real objective of this campaign? What message would it convey? What events would be held? Which cities would participate? What would be the title of this movement? Where were we to begin from?

We began digging up archives, rummaging through outmoded and recent campaigns, some that were fruitful and some that never made it to the top rung.

We tried our hand at new campaign ideas, out-of-the-box angles at old campaigns but nothing seemed right.

After weeks of exploration, we boiled our options down to the 'Help me fly' and 'Childline Se Dosti' campaign. They seemed to have some emotional chords that the rest didn't. They had been successful in their own time, but the question was...Were any of them still relevant today?

A lot of brouhaha, exchange of emails and brooding landed us the 'CHILDLINE Se Dosti' campaign title. It had the pulse, the tick and the momentum that we were furiously chasing after. Amen to that.

CHILDLINE Se Dosti became an established nation-wide awareness campaign making ordinary citizens stakeholders in Child Protection. The aim was to involve the community by understanding and recognising Child Protection and being pro-active in reducing vulnerability of children to risks.

The issue of Child Protection began to resonate with people across all walks of life. The community was invited to take a pledge and commit themselves to being a CHILDLINE Dost and participate in a multitude of exciting events happening across the country, on the eve of Children's Day.

From rickshaw and bus outreach programmes, signature campaigns, walkathons, rallies, tying of the suraksha bandhan to police personnel to nukkad natak, each city/district in India was bustling with events and activities during the week long dosti celebrations.

What began as a marketing attempt/donation drive with the distribution of Dosti coupons is now a nation-wide awareness and fund-raising campaign across India. This initiative was proposed with the hope that with each person, a new 'dost' is made.

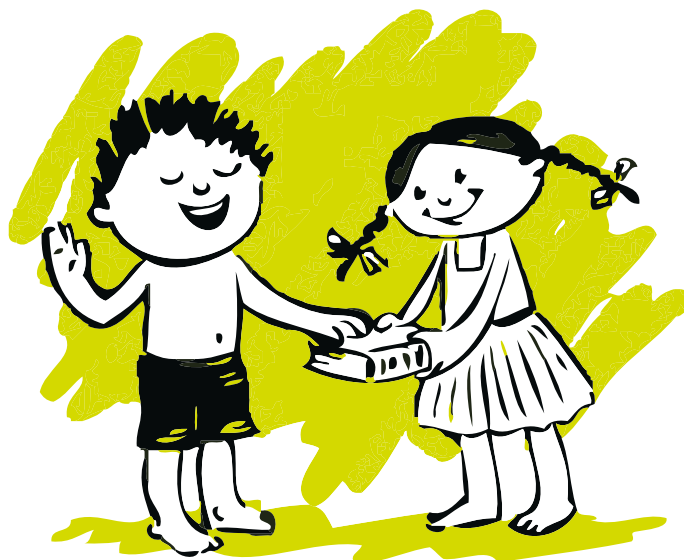

# 'It's only words, children'\*

Children of India, brace yourselves today for an outpouring of words. Slogans will pile up on clichés stacked on platitudes. You will hear ad nauseam that you are the nation's future. And that no investments yield greater returns than those made in your future. It's somewhat less likely that you will hear yourselves described as citizens whose entitlements and rights are guaranteed by your constitution and by numerous treaties and conventions, most particularly the United Nations Child Rights Convention we signed on your behalf over 20 years ago. Actual commitments to realise those rights, with budgetary allocations to back them, will probably be even less forthcoming.

One commitment to you that we do honour is the one that requires us to report how much we actually spend on your well-being. Last year you accounted for a grand total of 4.09% of your country's expenditure. The bulk of this (2.49%) was spent on educating you. Despite the staggering increase in violence against so many of you, we chose to spend only 0.04% of our total expenditure on your protection.

In fact, despite the 40% increase in child rapes, the 83% increase in procurement of girls and the 56% increase in the sale of girls for prostitution that the National Crime Records Bureau reported between 2005 and 2011, we managed to rationalise a 25% cut in the child protection budget this year. And our media collectively agreed that much more attention was due to those among you that committed violent acts than those who were the victims of violence.

You may have noticed that your country will elect new leaders soon. If you consume any media at all you could not have escaped the incessant exchange of barbs, claims, accusations and insults. By the time we actually vote we will have exhausted our vocabulary of disparaging nicknames and examined in threadbare detail our prospective leaders' knowledge of history, geography and astronomy.

Have you perchance noticed any mention of policies that concern you amidst the verbal barrage? Ah yes, there was some tangential mention when we debated some months ago whether we need to grow the economy before we honour your rights or vice versa. Not that there's any dearth of policies we've framed for you. Assembling the complex jigsaw of schemes we've endowed you with could keep you occupied from conception to adolescence.

The most recent, the National Policy for Children, 2013, reaffirmed that "every child is unique and a supremely important national asset." Odd then that there has been more discussion, in the run up to the elections, of the merits of our space programme and of the costs and benefits of record-breaking statues than of these precious assets.

The policy goes on to reiterate that the "safety and security of all children is integral to their well-being and children are to be protected from all forms of harm, abuse, neglect, violence, maltreatment and exploitation in all settings." You would hope that this would, for example, see us finally put an end to children being put to work across industries and sectors.

That we'd see a sharp rise in prosecutions of those who illegally employ or traffic you. Or that we would have found the resources to ensure adequate safety and care for those of you forced to live in shelters, homes and orphanages.

You do, I'm sure, see evidence all around you of our tireless work to "ensure that all out of school children such as child labourers, migrant children, trafficked children, children of migrant labour, street children, child victims of alcohol and substance abuse, children in areas of civil unrest, orphans, children with disability (mental and physical), children with chronic ailments, married children, children of manual scavengers, children of sex workers, children of prisoners, etc. are tracked, rescued, rehabilitated and have access to their right to education."

I'm sure that someday soon we'll also get around to delivering the "equitable access to comprehensive, and essential, preventive, promotive, curative and rehabilitative health care, of the highest standard, for all children before, during and after birth, and throughout the period of their growth and development" that the policy proclaims.

In a couple of years we will review our collective achievement of the Millennium Development Goals. We will, it appears, achieve the goal to provide almost all of you access to some sort of schooling, no inconsiderable achievement. We will, however, fall far short of our goals to reduce infant and child mortality or hunger. On gender equality outside education we almost appear to be slipping backwards. And there is little evidence we are even beginning to pay serious attention to how climate change will affect your lives and your futures.

Many of our neighbours who have not been the beneficiaries of our stellar GDP growth rates, some post-conflict states and nations far poorer than we are will outperform us. Ponder on possible reasons for

the mismatch when they liken you to buds or jewels or bulbuls today.

Could it be because you are not an organised vote bank that this situation persists? Maybe those citizens who do have the right to vote can be persuaded to act on your behalf. Perhaps the adults in your family, neighbourhood and school could ask the candidates seeking their votes a few questions on their plans for you.

Who knows, a journalist or two might spare some bandwidth to demand answers from the talking heads they meet regarding these unfulfilled pledges. Surely there's a captain of industry among us who would tack on a side order of child-friendliness to the business-friendliness main course that seems to be the sole criterion that determines their choice from the menu of aspiring leaders. Maybe, if you all ask really politely and in chorus, the party manifestos will include hard commitments to which you can hold our next set of elected representatives accountable. Now those might be worthy words.

महिला एवं बाल विकास मंत्रालय एवं चाइल्ड लाइन हीटल परियोजना के संयोजक से कट्स इन्टरनेशनल ने संगठन को 'चाइल्ड लाइन से दोस्ती' अभियान के तहत राजेन्द्र बस स्टैंड पर कैंप आयोजित किया। इस दौरान लगभग 300 यात्रियों से हस्ताक्षर कराकर उन्हें चाइल्ड लाइन की जानकारी आमजन तक पहुंचाने के लिए शपथ भी दिलाई गई।

**INDORE:** In a bid to associate with direct and indirect stakeholders, Childline - an organisation that works for children in distress - reached Indore railway station with its 'childline se dosti' national campaign on Wednesday.

The Hindustan Times recently carried a detailed report on children who were rescued from the railway station.

"Since transportation is a tool that links children to different places, we chose railway station to promote our campaign. We invited parties linked to railways like Government Railway Police Force, shop vendors, canteen owners, rail authorities

and staff, auto-rickshaw drivers and coolies and provided them training," said Wasim Iqbal, city coordinator, Childline.

Childline team, with its toll free number 1098, tried to sensitise trainees about sexual abuse, runaways, missing children and other related crimes.

"It was an interactive session where we enquired from trainees what they do with children in distress. It was evident that a link between community and Childline was missing. We established the link and named 'Phoolan' (after the 2009, UNICEF Dileep Chhabra award-winning film).

Childline team distributed awareness material to people and tied 'childline friendship bands' to people who voluntarily decided to curb child problems and would direct missing children through advised channels.

The main objective of the campaign was to sensitise the GRP officials, Shop vendors, Canteen owners, Railway authorities and staff, Auto-rickshaw drivers and Coolies about runaway children, missing children, child sexual abuse. The team distributed awareness materials and tied Suraksha Bandhan to the participants who then pledged their support to CHILDLINE and would dial 1098 if they see any child in distress.



This has paved a way for the CHILDLINE to build a close knit network of volunteers who would assist CHILDLINE in tracking suspicious passengers and bringing them to the notice of CHILDLINE. This was a successful example of executing CHILDLINE's vision statement-making child protection everyone's business.

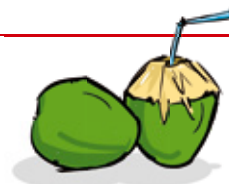

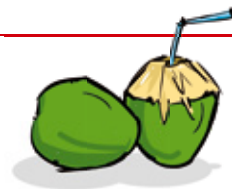

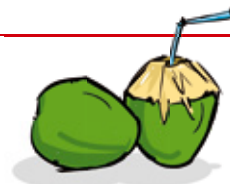

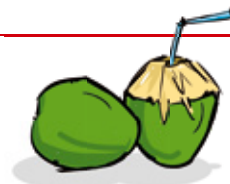

## STRICT ACTION ON UNREGISTERED CHILDREN HOMES IN TIRUCHY SOON

The DCPU, Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and police station-level Child Welfare Officers will join hands to combat crimes related to children. The DCPU will formulate a team comprising members of CWC and child welfare officers, who would inspect all the homes in the district to identify unregistered homes. "We will not hesitate to cancel unregistered homes soon after our intensive inspection in the days to come and we are working on it," says R. Devika, District Child Protection Officer. The plan is that the district has 65 NGOs running children's homes and half of them did not register as per Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2000 strongly violating norms, she said, adding that unregistered homes could pave the way for child abuse and child trafficking.

**PUDUCHERRY:** A large majority of children that call the Puducherry Childline are in need of emotional support and guidance. Over 65 per cent of the interventions made by Childline in the past one year were for emotional support.

In the past year, the Puducherry Childline received 2,423 calls, of which interventions were initiated in 369 cases.

According to the coordinator for Childline, Ravi, the main reason that children call was to receive counsel-

ling ahead of their public exams. It is a very trying time for children, and they are grateful for any counselling. Most of the children who were counselled appeared and cleared their examinations. Based on last year's statistics, a majority of the calls were received in December.

Childline also often receives calls requesting sponsorship for children to study and also to provide shelter to children.

Making a difference

A dozen calls were received for protection from abuse, both physical and

sexual.

In the last year alone, 20 children were reunited with their families, and 38 students were given educational support and assistance, which allowed them to continue studying.

The idea of Childline is to provide children with a toll-free emergency contact number that will allow them to report any kind of problem they face in society. The Childline will give them immediate care and also link them to long-term services that will allow them to continue receiving the care they deserve.

With this in mind, Childline is raising awareness on its 1098 number, through a week-long celebration for Children's Day.

On Friday, a group of children from the Baby Sarah Home and the Jolly Home for gypsy children were taken to the botanical gardens for a day out.

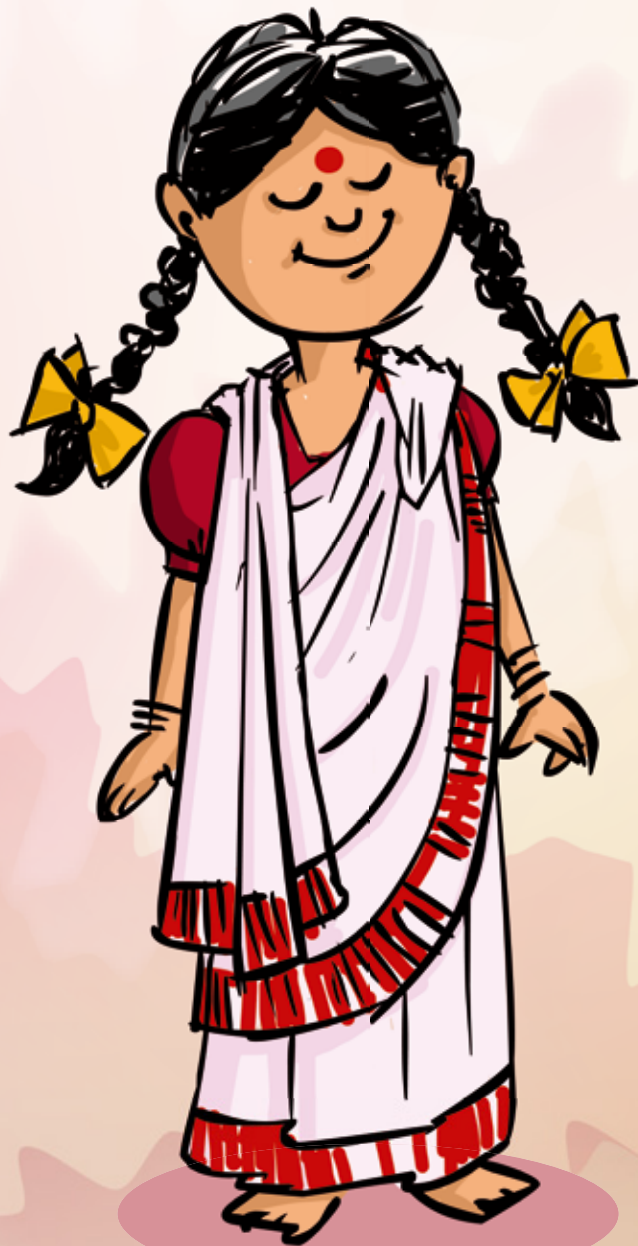
Through the week until November 20, there are a number of different events taking place.
