A new life for abandoned baby in Bhagalpur

CHILDLINE Bhagalpur saves a new born baby abandoned in a dustbin.

CHILDLINE Bhagalpur received a call from a concerned individual stating that a new born baby was found abandoned in Bhagalpur town near a roadside dustbin.



CHILDLINE team immediately visited the spot and met the child who was suffering from infections and needed to be admitted to the hospital for neonatal care. The child was immediately rushed to the Government hospital in Bhagalpur.

Necessary arrangements were made, support was provided by the team and the Chief Medical Officer, following which the child was moved out of the ICU. The child was discharged from hospital 2 days later. Meanwhile, the CWC studied the case and directed CHILDLINE to shift the child to an orphanage and make necessary arrangements with the State Adoption Resource Agency (SAA) for adoption. As all ends well, the child is living a happy and healthy life.

6 year old visually-challenged girl battles several odds

*Aneshwara, a 6 year old visually-challenged girl, who was being subjected to sexual harassment from a 51 year old school teacher at the Government School for Blind in Salem, Tamil Nadu was rescued by **CHILDLINE Salem** with help from the Sevvapet police. The accused is currently behind bars.*

On 10th December 2012, CHILDLINE Salem was contacted by Aneshwara's parents informing them that their daughter was sexually harassed by a 51-year old teacher in a Government School in Salem. They requested immediate help.

CHILDLINE instantly brought the case to the notice of the Child Welfare Committee, District Child Protection Officer and Commissioner of Social Defence.

The team along with Ms. P. Devaki, District Child Protection Officer, and Ms. Kamatchi, Member, CWC, Salem met with the child and her parents to collect facts about the case. The

team conducted an inquiry and preliminary investigation that confirmed the charges.

During a counseling session, the child revealed that a teacher namely G.K Natarajan who handled the carpentry class, had sexually harassed her. Natarajan is the only teacher who was not blind among seven other teachers in the school.

After silently suffering for several months, Aneshwara finally shared her ordeal with her parents who then contacted CHILDLINE Salem asking for help.

CHILDLINE immediately approached Sevvapet Police station asking for a probe into the case. The team met with Mr.A. Safifullah, Inspector, Sevvapet police station who assured all their support. Though the police tried to register a complaint on the basis of information collected, the parents were not willing to do so.

The CHILDLINE team requested the police to take utmost care not to reveal the identity of the child and ensure that the child was not victimised in the course of investigation and trial.

Natarajan who had been working as a teacher for two decades in the school denied the allegations saying that he was being targeted for being strict. During the inquiry with the child, parents and other teachers from the school, the police found the prima facie evidence against the accused.

Invoking for the first time the stringent provisions of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act 2012 which came into effect in November 2012, the Salem police arrested the 51-year old school teacher Natarajan.

The accused was later remanded to judicial custody by the Judicial Magistrate for 15 days and sent to the Salem Central Prison. CHILDLINE is following up on the case.

What does the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act 2012 say?

The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012 defines a child as any person below the age of 18 years and provides protection to children from offences such as sexual assault and sexual harassment.

The Act states that a person commits "sexual assault" if he touches the parts of the child or makes the child touch the parts of accused or does any other act with sexual intent which involves physical contact without penetration

The Act treats an offence as "aggravated" if it is committed by a person in a position of authority or trust such as a member of the security forces, a police officer or a public servant. It specifies penalties for the offences and provides a mechanism for reporting and trial of such offences.

The Act says that "whoever, being on the management or staff of an educational institution commits sexual assault on a child in that institution shall be punished with imprisonment of either description for a term which shall not be less than five years but which may extend to seven years, and shall also be liable to fine."

Salem teacher remanded; two more sexual abuse cases reported

Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act invoked against accused

SALAM: Invoking for the first time the stringent provisions of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012, the Salem City Police on Thursday arrested a 51-year-old schoolteacher of the Salem Government School for Blind on charges of sexual abuse and harassment of visually-challenged girls, all aged between 6 and 8, studying in the school here.

City Police Commissioner K. C. Mahali told The Hindu that the teacher was remanded to judicial custody by the Judicial Magistrate No.3 and was sent to the Salem Central Prison.

The teacher, however, denied the allegations saying that he was being targeted for being strict in the school.

The Act, which activists claim as "gender-neutral," point out that Section 7 under the Act says that whoever, with sexual intent, touches the parts of the child or makes the child touch the parts of the accused or does any other act with sexual intent which involves physical contact without penetration is said to commit sexual assault, while Section 9 defines the management or staff of an educational institution or religious institution, (who is) committing sexual assault on a child in that institution. Section 11 says that a person is said to commit sexual harassment upon a child when such person with sexual intent offers any word or makes any sound with the intention that such word or sound shall be heard by child.

On Wednesday, parents of four visually-challenged girls studying in Classes 1 and 2, alleged that their daughters were sexually harassed by a teacher. They contacted Child Line activists who in turn conveyed to officials of the Child Welfare Committee (CWC).

A preliminary investigation, according to CWC members, confirmed the sexual harassment charges. P. Devaki, District Child Protection Officer, and Kamathi, CWC member, held

their enquiry with girls and parents.

Based on the report we approached the senior police officials for an immediate probe into the incident," said A. Xavier, chairman of District Child Welfare Committee. Sevagapoli Police Inspector A. Sathish said the police conducted a marathon 9-hour enquiry with 12 girls, all visually impaired, their parents and teachers and found prima facie evidence against the accused.

"We have taken utmost care not to reveal their identities and would also ensure that the children are not victimised in the course of investigation and trial," he said.

The accused has been working as a teacher for two decades in the school being run under the aegis of Department of Differently-abled of Tamil Nadu Government.

Besides him, four other teachers are working in the school, which has a strength of 79 students. The Salem school is one among the three in the State. The other places are Chennai and Tiruchirappalli where the visually-challenged, a majority of them from down-trodden society, are imparted special education.

Cases against mason

The Seithur police in Rajapalayam have registered two cases of attempt to rape against a mason here. Ganesan was remanded to judicial custody on Thursday.

The accused were neighbours of the girl. The victim and the accused belong to the Schedule Caste community. The girl was kidnapped by the duo and allegedly raped by one of them. Though the incident took place around midnight of December 31, the victim preferred a complaint with the Namangipetta Police only on Thursday morning. Deputy Superintendent of Police of Rajapalayam S.P. Raja told The Hindu.

The DSP said that the girl was a school dropout. "She and her mother were working in Tiruchirappalli for about six months. On New Year's Eve the two came to visit the girl's father."

According to the girl and her mother who came to the police station, somebody knocked the door close to midnight on December 31. Her father was drunk, so the girl answered the door thinking that it could be her elder sister. The two accused were at the door in a drunken state.

Before the girl could react, one of them covered her face with a blanket and gagged her mouth to prevent her from raising an alarm. They took her to a government school nearby. "She was allegedly raped by one of them while the other stood guard," Mr. Raja said.

Police sources said the victim raised an alarm. On hearing it, somebody knocked the door close to midnight on December 31. Her father was drunk, so the girl answered the door thinking that it could be her elder sister. The two accused were at the door in a drunken state.

Before the girl could react, one of them covered her face with a blanket and gagged her mouth to prevent her from raising an alarm. They took her to a government school nearby. "She was allegedly raped by one of them while the other stood guard," Mr. Raja said.

14 child labourers rescued from bangle making unit

The Bangle making industry across India routinely engages the services of children in converting celluloid into bangles. In a recent intervention, **CHILDLINE Delhi** rescued 14 child labourers from a bangle making unit in Jahangirpuri, New Delhi.

CHILDLINE Delhi received a call from a concerned citizen who shared information that 14 children were working in a bangle making unit in Jahangirpuri, New Delhi. A team member immediately visited the spot to gather information on the situation. CHILDLINE instantly brought the case to the notice of the Delhi Police and discussed the case. The team worked in close coordination with the Delhi Police and other NGOs to carry out a well planned rescue operation.



In a joint raid conducted by CHILDLINE Delhi, Bachpan Bachao Andolan, Prayas, the Labour Department and the Delhi Police, as many as 14 children between 6-15 years were rescued from a bangle making unit situated in Jahangirpuri.

Vijay, a 10-year old boy from Bhagalpur, Patna was an earnest student at school but he was compelled to leave as his parents couldn't draw in much income with their daily labour wages.

"I work from 9 am till 11 pm without a break. Although I was promised a monthly salary of Rs 3,000, I have not been paid anything yet", said Vijay.

During the rescue, the team learnt that the working condition in the bangle making unit was extremely unhealthy and the children were engaged in hazardous jobs. Children were allured by the agent at different time from villages of UP, Bihar and Assam and employed in hazardous work for more than 12-15 hours a day. Children of 10-14 years of age, belonging to poor families, were forced to work for hours together for Rs 50 to 100 a week.

Pankul, a 10-year-old from UP said, "I came to visit Delhi a few months ago with my father but I was made to work in this factory against my wish. I do not want to work but want to go to school."

The rescue team found children in an appalling condition and frightened to talk with anyone. A rapport was built with the children in order to gain their trust. The necessary support and counseling was provided to the children and they were produced before the CWC who directed them to a temporary shelter home. The investigation continued in order to trace their parents.

New Life Home abuse case: CHILDLINE Shillong rescued 6 children from abuse

In a shocking case, 65 year old Reverend Sang Kunga Miller, owner of the New Life Home was apprehended when he was found exploiting and sexually abusing minor inmates of the shelter home run by him in Shillong.

Timely intervention by CHILDLINE Shillong helped in rescuing 6 children from the home. The case proves to be a springboard for CHILDLINE to think critically and act cleverly towards enforcing child protection norms and standards in all shelter homes for children across India.

The incident came to forefront after two minor boys were unable to bear the torture and escaped from the shelter home to report the tale of the inhumane treatment they faced during their stay at the shelter. The Civil Society Women's Organisation (CSWO) instantaneously brought the case to the notice of the Additional Superintendent of Police (Crime). The Additional SP (Crime) informed the District Child Protection Officer who called CHILDLINE Shillong asking to rescue the children from the home.

NGOs call for stern action against Rev Miller

SHILLONG: Several NGOs including the Lympang ki Seng Kyntel, the convening body, the Civil Society Women's Organisation (CSWO), Agnes, the Khasi Students' Union, Domestic Workers Union besides many other concerned individuals met at the Step by Step School on Wednesday to discuss the issue of alleged rape and molestation by Rev SK Miller of New Life Ministry.

The NGOs condemned the series of incidents of molestation indulged in by Miller and called for strict legal action against him. The meeting also urged the Child Welfare Committee of the

Social Welfare Department which is questioning the children who have been abused and raped, to speed up the process and file the statements taken before a judicial magistrate at the earliest.

The NGOs also called for immediate removal of the present management from the Ministry so that free and fair investigations can be carried out.

Earlier, a US citizen, who said he had spent three years in Shillong and was part of the New Life Ministry, said that all the elders who are part of the Ministry but had chosen to remain silent about Miller's acts of commission deserved to be booked. (Contd on P-10)

Natl child panel seeks report from State Govt

SHILLONG: The National Commission for Protection of Child Rights on Wednesday sought a report from the State government on alleged rape and molestation by Rev SK Miller of New Life Ministry.

Acting on complaints received from several local NGOs on the issue, the commission has sought a detailed report from the East Khasi Hills district administration on the matter.

When contacted, member of the Commission, Dr Yogesh Dube told *The Shillong Times* that the Commission was apprised of the matter by the social organizations of the state who have also sought an immediate intervention of the commission.

"For the past few days, we have been receiving complaints and reports on this serious issue and taking a strong cognizance on this (Contd on P-10)

Upon receiving the information, the CHILDLINE team immediately visited the home and confirmed the complaint. As CHILDLINE probed deeper and unraveled stories of grave violations from the children, it sets off a long investigation culminating in the rescue of the children from the shelter home. CHILDLINE also informed the CWC, Police and DCPU officials about the incident and requested help to rescue the children.

On September 29, 2012, CHILDLINE Shillong along with local police rescued 6 children comprising of 2 boys and 4 girls

from New Life Home, a shelter home at Nongrimmaw in Laitumkhrah, Shillong who were allegedly exploited, molested and sexually abused. Children rescued were all aged below 18 years belonging to poor families living in villages along the Assam-Meghalaya border.

During the counseling session, children revealed that they were brought to the hostel by Reverend Miller with a promise to send them to school and take care of their needs. However, they were forced to clean the house, cook food and fetch water for his family. The team was shocked to find that the New Life Home authorities did not provide them any details, including the identity of those who came to take the children

Fresh molestation charges against Reverend Miller

SHILLONG: Fresh allegations against the New Life Home owner, Reverend Sangkunga Miller were on Sunday pinned by the four minor girls who were rescued on Saturday from his hostel at Nongrimmaw in Laitumkhrah with reports that the priest molested and abused them on numerous occasions.

These four girls who were among the six children rescued by the police and Child Line on Saturday from the New Life Home had revealed the kind of inhumane treatment they were exposed to during their stay at the hostel.

Earlier, it was alleged that Rev Miller sexually abused and exploited labour from these minor children whom he brought from poor families from the Meghalaya - Assam border, in the name of sending them to school. Rev Miller was arrested on late Friday night but was subsequently admitted to the Civil Hospital after he fell ill.

Each story narrated by these minor girls added more

weight to the prior details disclosed by the two boys who escaped from the hostel on Friday and reported the matter to the police.

taking into consideration his deteriorating health. The police however maintained that the children are in currently being kept in shelter homes.

The four girls are being kept in children's shelter home while the boys are under the look and care of the Child Line. On the other hand, Child Line has further mentioned that the case is being referred to the Child Welfare Commission and a meeting is expected to be held next week and as of now, the children will still be under the care of the shelter homes until further outcomes.

When asked if the parents of the children were informed, a Child Line representative said at present, no such information has been fed to the parents of the children citing the distance and remoteness of their villages which are located in the Meghalaya - Assam border.

Meanwhile, the CSWO (Agnes) has lodged another FIR before the police on Sunday charging Rev Miller of child abuse and molestation.

out of New Life Home. The 4 minor girls aged 8, 11 and 12 respectively revealed that their tormentor would often ask them to wash his legs and give him body massages even as he touched and groped them on several occasions. The traumatised girls who referred to Rev Miller as Uncle couldn't muster up the courage to expose their bad experiences to any elderly people including the Reverend's wife. Each story narrated by these minor girls added more weightage to the prior details disclosed by the 2 boys who escaped from the hostel.

"On several occasions, "Uncle (Miller) asked us to wash his legs and massage his body at his home and he would touch our body. We don't like him," the minor girls later confessed to the CHILDLINE team members. "The owner very often hugs us and touches us at places that are sensitive and if we don't cooperate he assaults us," a girl further complained.

Considering the seriousness of the case, a team comprising

CHILDLINE Jammu reunites Jerry with parents

*Jerry, a 5 year old speech and hearing impaired child was reunited with family 3 months after he went missing in Jammu with help from the Police and **CHILDLINE Jammu.***



CHILDLINE Jammu received a call from the Kannachak station house officer informing them about a missing child who was found wandering near a pond in Kannachak village. He could not speak and was unable to respond to their queries. The CHILDLINE Jammu team visited Kannachak Station and met the child.

Jerry, a 5 year old boy hails from Chhattisgarh lived with his parents in Jammu. Jerry had gone missing from Bhagwati Nagar, near the old bus stand in Jammu. The process to locate his parents was started and his short stay was arranged at Ved Mandir, where he stayed for around 2^{1/2} months.

During a CHILDLINE outreach programme in Bhagwati Nagar, a shopkeeper discussed Jerry's case and helped CHILDLINE Jammu team to locate his parents. Efforts were put into locating his parents of the child by flashing news through the police control room and over 200 CHILDLINE centres across the country.

"The case was unique, as Jerry could not speak anything but his name due to a congenital disorder affecting his vocal cord. His inability to converse was a major hurdle in locating his parents," said Manjari Singh, Centre Coordinator, CHILDLINE Jammu.

Jerry was later shifted to the SOS Children's Village for temporary shelter. His parents were subsequently located and on meeting his parents, Jerry immediately recognised his father. Finally, Jerry was handed over to them at the Kannachak police station after completing the legal formalities.

While Jerry could not express his feelings in words, his gestures conveyed the emotions he was going through after being reunited with his parents after almost 3 months. CHILDLINE Jammu was instrumental in reuniting Jerry with his parents.

79 child labourers rescued from factories in Delhi

*In a massive raid organised by **CHILDLINE Delhi** along with the Police and Bachpan Bachao Andolan (BBA), 79 children working in garment and leather factories in Navi Kareem, Central Delhi were rescued; perpetrators were arrested.*

79 children were rescued from garment and leather factories in a joint raid by CHILDLINE Delhi with support from BBA.

Trafficked through local agents from the villages of Bihar and Nepal, these children had been working in the factories for over 6 months and were involved in stitching, cutting, dyeing and tanning of garment and leather for which they were paid a paltry sum of Rs 50 to 100 as weekly wages.

CHILDLINE Delhi provided necessary care and support to the children and produced them before Child Welfare Committee (CWC) who directed the child to a rehabilitation centre.

7 employers and traffickers were arrested on the spot and an FIR was registered against them under the Juvenile Justice Act, Bonded Labour Act and Child Labour Act.

Sting operation busts 'Whitener' seller in Gwalior

The number of children living on streets who indulge in sniffing whitener ink is on the rise. Krish, a 12 year old boy addicted to sniffing whitener, a cheaper and potentially dangerous way to get high was rescued by **CHILDLINE Gwalior** from Gwalior Railway station.

After the rescue, Krish along with the CHILDLINE Gwalior team and a journalist from Patrika daily conducted a sting operation on an individual who illegally sold whitener to the children.

During one of the outreach programmes at the Gwalior railway station, the CHILDLINE team noticed that Krish was sitting on the railway station and sniffing the whitener ink. The team member spoke to them and then convinced Krish to accompany him to the CHILDLINE centre.

Concerned over the growing instances of substance abuse among street children, the CHILDLINE team approached the Gwalior Police station and sought a sting operation with their team. The team with the help from the boy provided all the details on the case to the police. Acting upon the tipoff, the Mr. Anil Upadhy, Thana in-charge Padav police station acted quickly and conducted an inquiry into the case.



The team also insisted for a check on the illegal sale of whiteners by owners, distributors, and production companies. Krish was produced before the CWC who directed to send him to a temporary shelter home.

21 children rescued from forced begging



The story of children who were rescued by **CHILDLINE Durg** from begging in train is distressing. Abject poverty forced children to engage in begging.

In a recent initiative to curb child beggary, CHILDLINE Durg along with assistance from the Government Railway Police (GRP) rescued 21 children from begging in a train. The team, officials from Government Railway Police (GRP) travelled through several trains frequented by child beggars at Durg Railway Junction.

"We got information that there was a group of 5 women who used their children for begging in trains," said Mr. Suresh Kapse, Centre Coordinator, CHILDLINE Durg.

CHILDLINE Durg along with Government Railway Police (GRP) of Durg Railway Junction rescued 14 girls and 7 boys in the age group of 18 months to 13 years from the trains. The rescue team found traumatic tales of children rescued from begging in train. All the children were shifted to the CHILDLINE centre.

"Out of 21 rescued children, 12 were found in local train, followed by 6 kids in the Pune-Howrah Azad Hind Express and 3 in the Superfast Express," says Mr. Suresh Kapse, Centre Coordinator, CHILDLINE Durg.

During counseling, the children revealed to the team that the parents had pushed them into begging. They earned anywhere between Rs. 200 and Rs. 300 per day and gave their earnings to their parents.

CHILDLINE provided necessary support and counseling to the children. They were produced before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and handed over to their parents.

CHILDLINE Namakkal rescues 6 child labourers from college canteens

6 boys under 14 years were rescued from working at a college canteen in Namakkal by **CHILDLINE Namakkal** with support from officials from the Labour Department, National Child Labour Project, Namakkal.



CHILDLINE received a call from a concerned student residing in Namakkal informing them that few minor children were working as child labourers in a college canteen. The team made a visit to the spot and found the children.

The CHILDLINE team immediately informed the Police about the case asking for assistance. The CHILDLINE team, the Police department and the Labour Department, the National Child Labour Project and the Health Department held a meeting to workout the plan of action and decided to conduct a raid against the employers of children.

During the raid, 6 boys in the age group of 10 to 14 years were rescued. The rescue team found that 3 boys hailing from Krishnagiri district were working in the canteens of a group of education institutions in Namakkal to clean tables and wash vessels while the other 3 were employed in a bakery near the institution.



After the rescue, the children were provided immediate care and protection. All children were counseled and team members gathered information for the purpose of documentation.

During the counseling session by **CHILDLINE**, the children revealed that they were told by the employers not to reveal their correct age, if anyone asked. The team produced the children before Mr. J. Kumaragurubaran, District Collector and the Child Welfare Committee. **CHILDLINE** was to ensure that all the children rescued would be enrolled in special schools for rescued child workers.

14-year-old resists early marriage; father arrested

*Prompt intervention by **CHILDLINE Kolkata** saved Bhavini, a 14 year old child bride from Beldi village who was forced to marry by her father.*

Children like Bhavini from the Beldi village of West Bengal have been staging a silent revolution in the state against child marriage by asserting their rights. The story of Bhavini shows that how children as young as 14 years are being forced into marriage by their families.

Bhavini, lived with her parents. Unable to support her school education, Bhavini was made to drop out of school while she was in the 7th standard.

Corced to marry, Bhavini mustered up the courage to stand up against her father and foiled an attempt to get her married. she called up **CHILDLINE Kolkata** to alert them about the same. The team immediately visited the spot to gather some facts on the information.

The **CHILDLINE** team along the police rescued the child from her house. **CHILDLINE** instantly brought the case to the notice of the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and gave a written petition along with the birth certificate of the child. Subsequently the child was produced before the Child Welfare Committee who directed to sent the child to a Government shelter home. Padak Gorai, father of the child was arrested by the police.

The Supreme Court directs compulsory registration of FIRs in all missing children cases

As per the National Crime Records Bureau statistics, almost 100,000 children go missing, with over 30,000 remaining untraced each year in the country. However, less than 10,000 cases are ever registered.

Mandatory FIRs on cases of missing children

In a major breakthrough, the Supreme Court of India passed landmark directions for registration of First Information Reports (FIRs) in every complaint of missing children in the country.

In a writ petition filed by Bachpan Bachao Andolan (BBA), a Supreme Court bench headed by Chief Justice of India, Justice Altamas Kabir and Justice Vikramjit Sen and Justice Jasti Chelameswar, has expressed serious dissatisfaction over the tepid response from all state governments from across the country on the issue of missing children.

Hundreds of children go missing in a day

Accepting the arguments of Mr. H.S. Phoolka (Senior Adv.) and Mr. Jagjit Chhabra (Advocate on Record) appearing for the petitioner that every day hundreds of children are going missing without a trace and law enforcement agencies are not serious in their efforts to stop this crime and immediate steps for the recovery of these children must be taken, the Court directed immediate registration of FIRs.

Special Juvenile Police Units at every police station

The Court accepted recommendations of the National Human Rights Commission to set up Special Juvenile Police Units at every police station across the country with a dedicated Child Welfare Officer/Special Juvenile Police Officer, to swiftly act in cases of all children in need of care and protection as well as in conflict with law.



SALIM: Though 26 child marriages, eight in the city alone, were stopped in the past 10 months, not a single complaint has been lodged with police.

As per law, it is a cognizable offence and a non-bailable one, with parents and persons who solemnise the child marriage being given two years imprisonment if found guilty. Hence it is essential that child marriages should be reported for the welfare of the society.







“CHILDLINE Calling...is India Listening?” Vol. 7

CHILDLINE India Foundation came out with the 7th edition of the “CHILDLINE Calling is India Listening?” presenting a collation of all the calls received on 1098 and the analysis of the calls/intervention cases for the period January 2011 to December 2011.



Profile of the child assisted

The data highlights that CHILDLINE reaches out to

- Maximum number of children in the age group of 11-15 years (47%)
- Higher number of boys (65%) than girls (34%)

Profile of the caller

As an emergency helpline and outreach service, CHILDLINE receives calls from various types of callers. The data highlights that 25% of calls are made by children either for themselves or to refer about a friend, 18% of the calls come from CHILDLINE member, 17% from concerned adults, 13% from family members, 16% allied system, and 6% from NGO personnel.

Calls

During the year CHILDLINE received a total of 22, 48,896 calls. Of these a total of 59,547 intervention calls were recorded. Of this the south zone, with 38 cities covered by CHILDLINE, accounted for 46%; the east zone with 32 cities, accounted for 29%.

Source of Calls

Of the intervention cases, as in the previous year, a shade

over 68% were received as calls on 1098. Another 17% were received by CHILDLINE teams during Outreach activity.

Of all calls that came to 1098 on phone for direct intervention, only 2% came from PCOs, 20% through landlines (including landlines of private telecom service providers) and a significant 46% came from mobile phones. 33% of mobile callers are children. Of phone calls, 41% came from residential areas, 12% from Railway stations/ property and 10% from streets/ pavements and police station each.

Reasons for calling

Emotional and Mental health related issues (14.48%) of overall reasons followed by Education related (12.14%), lack of resources (9.90%) are the most critical reasons for calling CHILDLINE.

Each of these categories is broad classification that covers several sub reasons. The analysis in this publication provides a view of the detailed sub reasons for calls to CHILDLINE.

Intervention Cases

Intervention involves reaching out to children and providing the emergency assistance and linking children to services available for long-term care. Highlights of data presented in this publication are:

- Emotional Support & Guidance is the largest category of interventions provided (33.58%).
- Medical interventions were provided in 12.60% of cases.
- Shelter and Restoration related interventions accounted for 14.69% and 12.86% respectively.






