To pledge that they would ensure every child they know is protected... The campaign consisted of a large number of activities in every city where CHILDLINE service is present.

What is CHILDLINE?

CHILDLINE number 1098 is a toll free number that is common in all the cities of India. Initially started in Mumbai in June 1996, CHILDLINE is currently operational in **190 cities**.

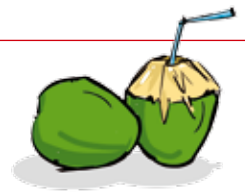

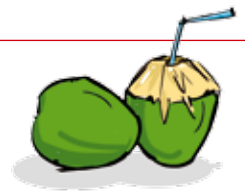


DHARMAPURI

Dental Camp

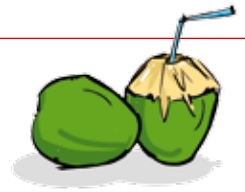

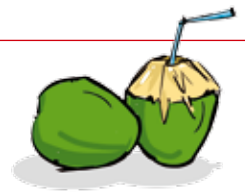
Dosti Mela

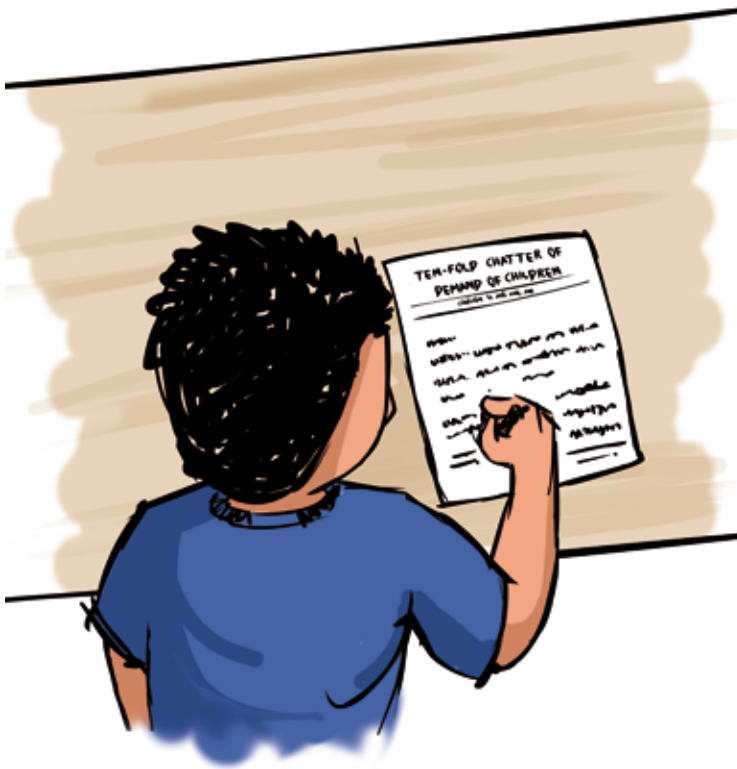

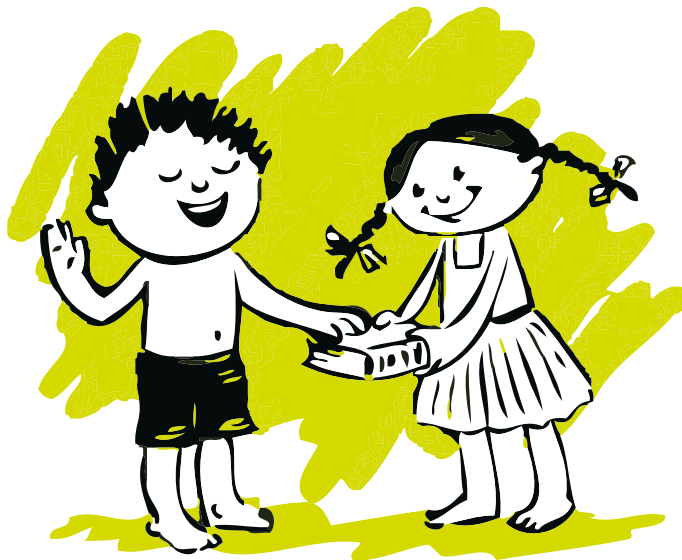

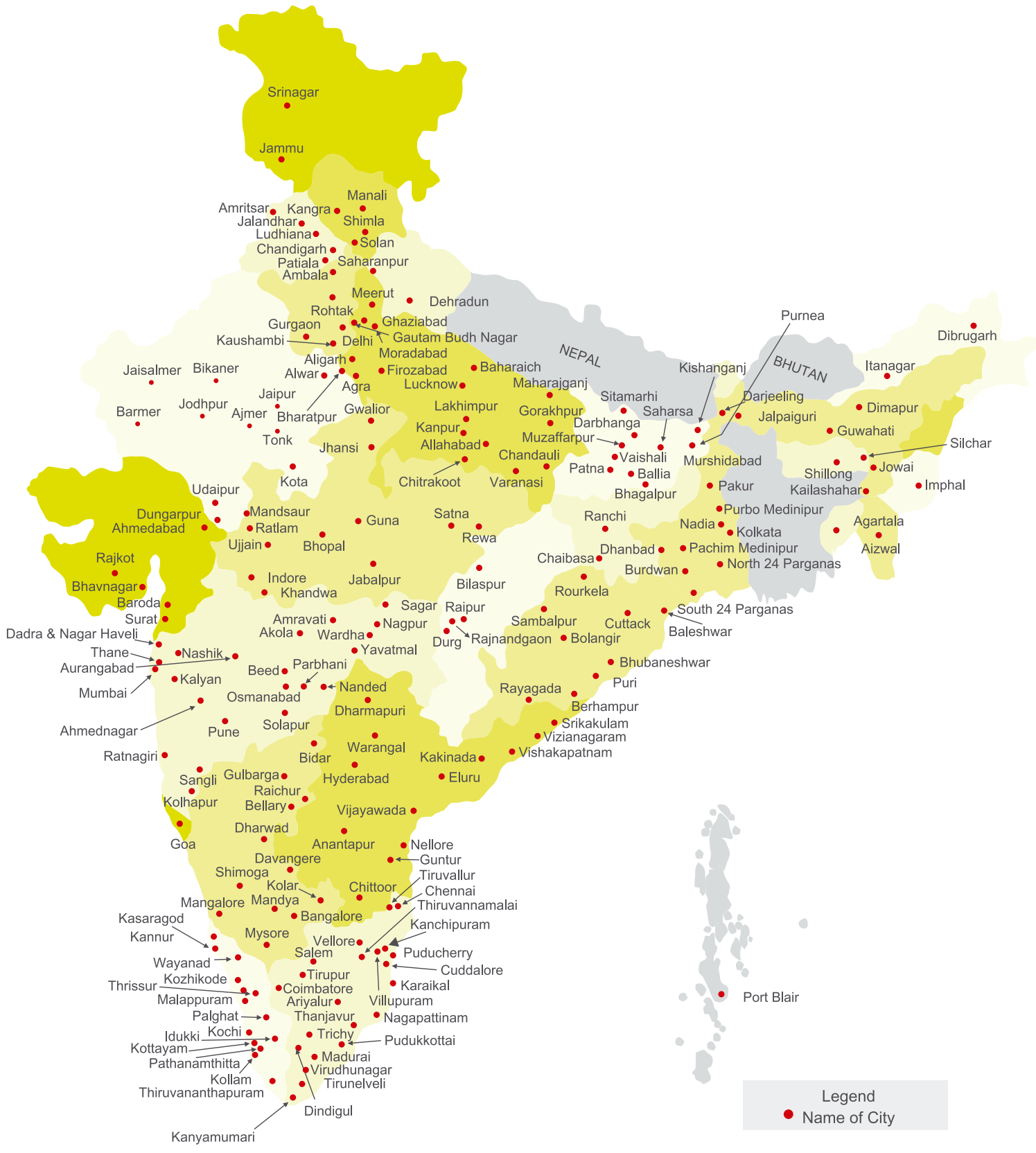
