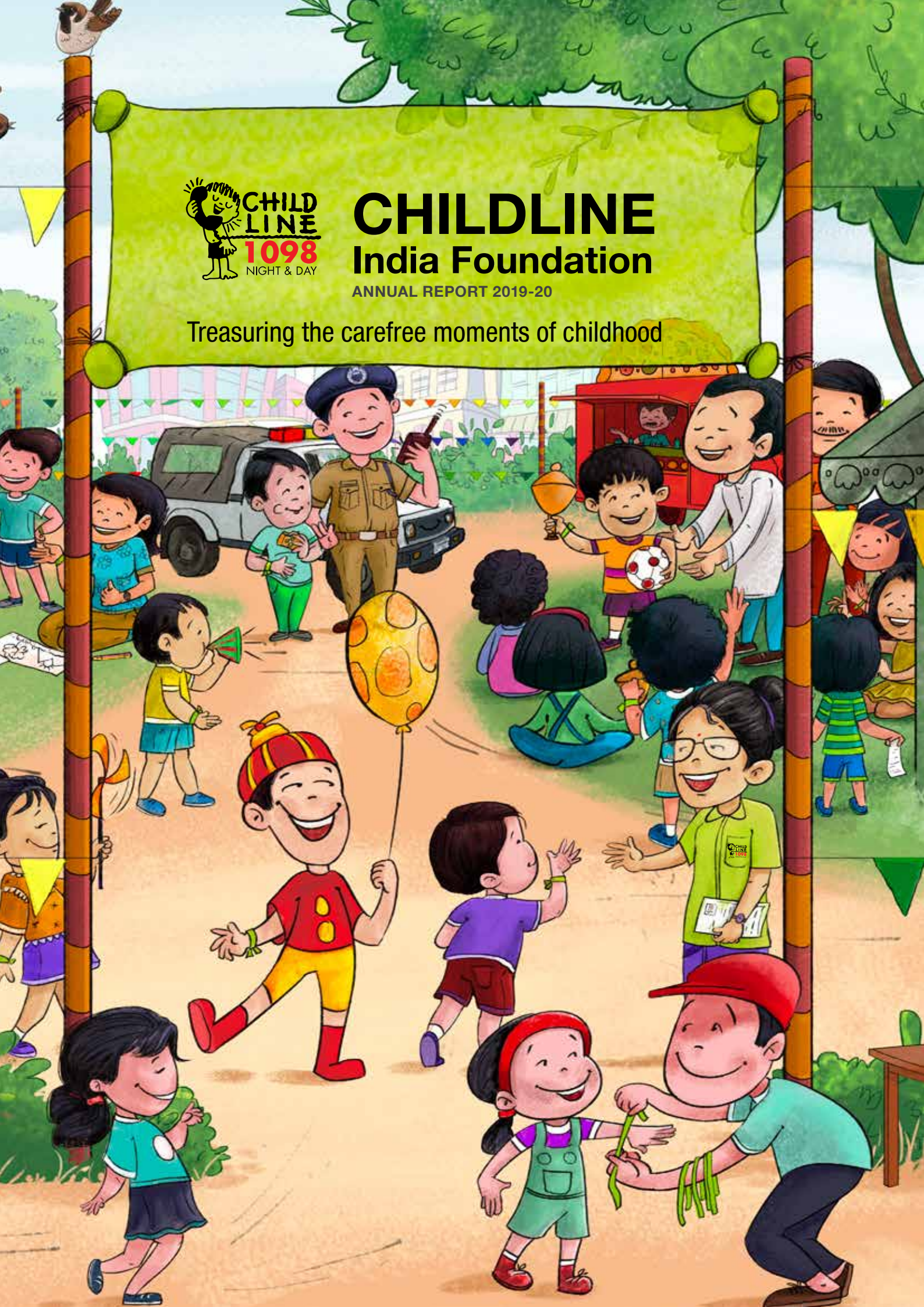

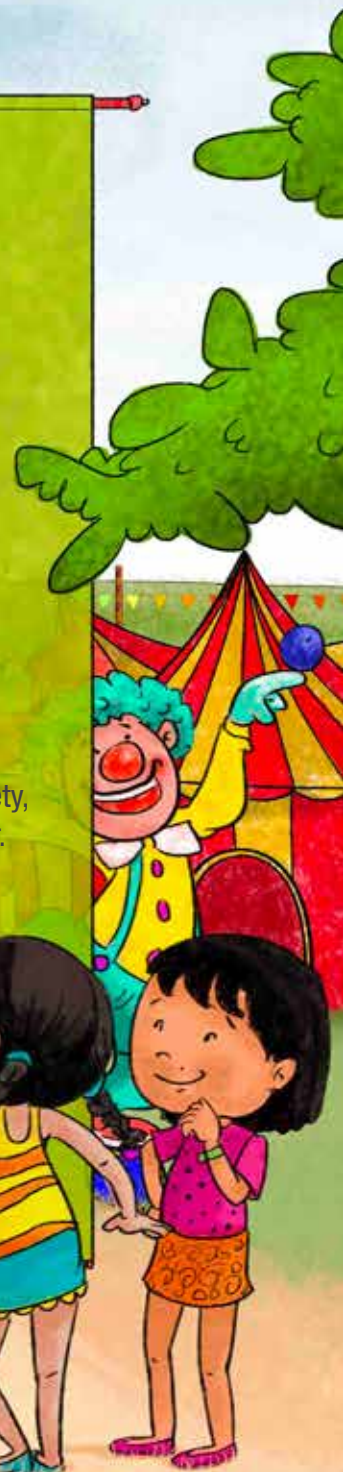

CHILDLINE INDIA FOUNDATION (CIF)

Child protection is a key concern in India as children, especially those belonging to the weaker sections of society, are vulnerable to exploitation and harassment of various kinds. Child abuse, child trafficking, child labour, female foeticide & infanticide, child marriage, undernourishment are amongst the host of issues that affect children. This is especially in the case of children below the age of six, children living on the streets, children who are orphaned, children with physical or mental disabilities, children affected by HIV/AIDS or other long-term diseases, children displaced by conflict/civil unrest/natural disasters. CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF) is a non-profit organisation with a vision to create a child-friendly nation that guarantees the rights and protection of all children. It is the nodal agency of the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development, and acts as the parent organisation for setting up, managing and monitoring the CHILDLINE 1098 service across the country. CIF's responsibilities include monitoring of service delivery and finance, training, research and documentation, creating awareness, advocacy, as well as resource generation for the service.

CHILDLINE

The CHILDLINE 1098 service, developed and managed by CIF, is a 24x7, emergency, free phone outreach service linking children in need of care and protection, to relevant organisations run by Government departments and civil society organisations for long-term care, protection and rehabilitation. Any child or adult calling on behalf of a child is assured of assistance from a trained team capacitated to reach the child within an hour of having received a call on 1098.

CHILDLINE is India's first national-level response to the ratification of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). Additionally, it also receives special mention in the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection) Act, 2015, where the Government has requested that CHILDLINE acts as a catalyst in bringing together State agencies and voluntary agencies at the local level to ensure implementation of the Act.

When the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD) came into being in 2006, it recognised CHILDLINE India Foundation as the Nodal Mother NGO for implementing the CHILDLINE model across all districts in India. In order to put in place a process framework for the implementation of Child Protection, CHILDLINE joined hands with The National Institute of Social Defence and developed a programme: 'National

Initiative for Child Protection (NICP)'. This subsequently became the framework for the MWCD-initiated Integrated Child Protection Scheme programme (ICPS), which funds the expansion of CHILDLINE services. As of March 2020, CHILDLINE has a pan-India presence, operating in 569 cities/districts across 35 states/UTs, and responds to over 89,98,000 calls a year.

OBJECTIVES

- To reach out to every child in need of care and protection by responding to emergencies on 1098 and by physically reaching out to them.
- To adapt and integrate telecommunication technology, linking all districts to the service of 1098, and making it available to all children in need of care and protection.
- To provide a platform of networking amongst organisations and to provide linkages to support systems that facilitates the rehabilitation of children.
- To work together with the Allied Systems (police, healthcare, juvenile justice, transport, legal, education, communication, media, political and the community) to create child friendly systems.
- To advocate services for children that are inaccessible, non-existent or inadequate.
- To create a body of NGOs and Government organisations working within the national framework and policy for children.
- To be a nodal child protection agency in the country, providing child protection services to children.
- To contribute and work towards strengthening and participating in a global movement that addresses issues related to child protection and ensures that children's voices are heard.

PROGRAMMES AND ACTIVITIES

- Responding to calls on the national toll-free number 1098 and facilitating rescue and emergency outreach services for children in need of care and protection.
- Coordinating rescue and other outreach services with the help of relevant local departments like police, administration, labour, health, railways and others.
- Ensuring proper documentation of all children rescued to facilitate their rehabilitation and restoration, where necessary.

- Producing children before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) to ensure care and protection.
- Supporting the CWC in the long-term rehabilitation of children, wherever required.
- Supporting a national network for the tracking of missing children.
- Providing data related to children rescued and rehabilitated for the compilation of a national comprehensive database of child protection.
- Creating awareness and ensuring access to the 1098 helpline number.
- Establishing linkages with other child protection services, the community and local bodies to meet the immediate needs of children rescued.

PARTNERSHIP MODEL

CIF believes that for CHILDLINE to be successful and effective in reaching out and responding to the needs of millions of children across India, it is crucial to function in a partnership framework, one which recognises that:

- A helpline cannot operate in isolation.
- All service partners share a reciprocal relationship.
- Partners have clear and definite roles which lead to a feeling of joint ownership towards the model.
- All partners share the vision, mission and the success of the model.

CHILDLINE, therefore, is a unique partnership between the Ministry of Women and Child Development, State Governments, Department of Telecommunications, voluntary agencies, academic institutes, the corporate sector, the community and children. It is the crucial link between children in distress and in emergency situations, and a well-connected network of services that are already in place and working towards the care and protection of children. It acts as the single point of contact that facilitates instant access to support, advice, active intervention, and often, even lend a sympathetic ear.

OPERATIONAL STRUCTURE

CHILDLINE Contact Centre (CCC)

CHILDLINE Contact Centre (CCC) is a 24-hour, voice response facility using contemporary BPS (Business Process Services) technology. There are 6 centralised call receiving centres across 5 locations (Mumbai, Delhi,

Kolkata, Chennai and Bengaluru), and all CHILDLINE cities/districts are connected to it.

CHILDLINE Advisory Board/District Advisory Committee

The CHILDLINE Advisory Board or District Advisory Committee is the principal policy-making body of CHILDLINE. Headed by the District Magistrate and Collector at the city and district levels respectively, it comprises of Government officials, NGOs, corporates, concerned individuals, and reviews the performance of CHILDLINE, sets new directions, recommends strategies for smartening up the service, and opens up mainstream systems for training and advocacy.

Nodal Organisations

Nodal Organisations are usually academic institutes or NGOs which anchor and facilitate the city service structure. They coordinate between 1098 service providers and ensure that service glitches are ironed out. They are charged with the responsibility of networking with and training members of the local allied system, coordinating and calling the CAB meetings.

Collaborative Organisations

Collaborative Organisations or Collab Partners function as the intervention units for CHILDLINE. Once a CCC responds to a call received on 1098, if it is deemed that the case requires emergency intervention, the case is transferred to a Collab Partner, who then sends personnel to the location to carry out the required intervention. Collab Partners also undertake outreach and awareness building.

Support Organisations And Sub-Centres

Support Organisations and Sub-Centres are typically located in city suburbs or in rural areas, and supplement the work of Collab Partners. Cases from the Collab Partners are referred to the Support Organisations/Sub-Centres, for on-ground follow-up. These are usually organisations with substantial community outreach at the grassroots.

Resource Organisations

Resource Organisations provide specialised services such as counselling, shelter, legal advice, sponsorship, adoption, etc, and extend their services to children referred by CHILDLINE.

ADVOCATING FOR CHILD RIGHTS AND PROTECTION

Advocacy on Child Rights and Protection forms one of the core pillars of CHILDLINE India Foundation's effort towards our vision of child-friendly India. Our advocacy efforts have significantly contributed to CHILDLINE's growth in each district/state across the country. The thrust of our advocacy efforts has been on facilitating the implementation of the Integrated Child Protection Scheme, creating awareness about CHILDLINE, and building capacity among stakeholders on the various legislations that are relevant for child protection such as the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012, the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015, the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006, the Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986. Advocacy and networking initiatives are practiced at all levels - right from engaging with local village Panchayat bodies, to working alongside officials at the State and Central Government level. Since, recognition from stakeholders across the board allows for easy implementation and adoption of child helpline services.

NORTH

HARYANA

Ambala Railway, CHILDLINE

CHILDLINE team conducted an orientation initiative on "Standard Operating Procedure" for Railway employees to ensure the utmost care and protection of children. A total of 25 people participated in this initiative including personnel from GRP, RPF, Child Welfare Committee.

PUNJAB

Mohali

Orientation training on the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015 was conducted by the National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development Regional Centre at Mohali for functionaries of CHILDLINE from 27-29th November. It was attended by 39 CHILDLINE functionaries

belonging to Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Himachal Pradesh.

The major objectives of the orientation were the following:

- To orient the CHILDLINE functionaries on the provisions of the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015 and Rules, 2016.
- To discuss the issues and challenges related to care, protection, rehabilitation and the reintegration of children in need of care and protection.
- To discuss how we can coordinate with different agencies at the district level for the best implementation of the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015.
- To develop some strategies for effective implementation of the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015.

DELHI

CHILDLINE aims to influence stakeholders to create a more robust safety net for children, in order to bring child issues in front of policy makers and Government officials and to propose for necessary changes and inclusion of the key stakeholders. CHILDLINE Delhi teams undertook the following advocacy initiatives in 2019-2020:-

- Meeting with the Secretary, Director & Additional Director- Department of Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi with regard to the Awareness of CHILDLINE 1098 across Delhi School. This is with reference to the Notification issued by the Ministry of Women and

Child Development Government of India, D.O. No. CW-1-11/6/2019-CW-I-Part (2) (e-767532) issued on 24th September, 2019 & Written Petition (Criminal) No. 1/2019 taken by the Hon'ble Supreme Court. As a result, a signboard has been placed in almost all schools in Delhi.

- Meeting with the Secretary, Director & Additional Director- Department of Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi with regard to the appointment/nomination of District CHILDLINE as Social Worker in School Management Committee (SMC) under the RTE Act, 2009, for issuing the circular for the visibility of CHILDLINE 1098 services on School Vehicles and display of Web-link of CHILDLINE India Foundation on websites of Directorate of Education & Education Department, Govt. of NCT of Delhi.
- Regular Meetings with the Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights, Govt. of NCT of Delhi with regards to the following:
 - Formation of CHILDLINE State Advisory Board (SAB) in the state of Delhi.
 - Appointment/Nomination of CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF) & District CHILDLINE in various committees of States & Districts under JJ System & Child Protection Services.
 - Display the Web-link of CHILDLINE India Foundation on website of Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights, Govt. of NCT of Delhi.
 - In regards to continued publicity of CHILDLINE 1098 in Delhi.

Following were the outcomes of regular meetings with Delhi State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, Govt. of NCT of Delhi:

- DCPCR issued a circular to Director-DWCD for the further formation of State Advisory Board.
- DCPCR issued a circular to the Office of the Divisional Commissioner (Revenue) and from thereon, a letter has been issued mentioning the appointment of CIF as a special invitee in the State Steering Committee.
- CHILDLINE logo has been incorporated on the official website of Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights, Govt. of NCT of Delhi.

- DCPCR issued a circular to Department of Education & Delhi Municipal Corporation Schools, Government of NCT of Delhi.
- DCPCR issued a letter to the concerned Government authorities requesting to increase the visibility of CHILDLINE at prominent locations and on public transports in Delhi.
- DCPCR has also written the same to National Baal Bhawan (under Ministry of Human Resource Development) as a result of which National Baal Bhawan agreed to place CHILDLINE hoarding in the premises of NBB-Delhi.
- Announcement has started on the ISBT Kashmiri Gate- Delhi.
- Display of 1098 Helpline number in DTC Buses, Delhi Metro Rail Corporation, Schools, Private Cabs, Public Places ensured.
- Meeting with DRM, ADRM (Admin.), DCM of Delhi Division under Northern Railways with regard to -
 - Regularization of CHG meeting at Delhi Division.
 - Information about the awareness activities of 1098.
 - Utilization of station funds for CNCP in contact with Railways.
 - Announcement of 1098.
 - Display of 1098 at electronic scrolling machines installed at railway station and platform.
 - Additional room to be provided to CHD for counseling and shelter of children.

Gurugram meeting

On 7th January, 2020, a meeting was convened in the CHILDLINE Gurugram office, which was attended by Sh. Roop Sudesh Vimal, Hema Khatri, Fizza Saghir, Heenu Singh, Shaiju Varghese, Samiksha Raperia and Rakesh Yadav. During the meeting, some issues and concerns were discussed that needed intervention:-

- A workshop was conducted on the emphasis of stress reduction and capacity building for employees of CHILDLINE.
- Quarterly Meetings were conducted wherein the concerns with the commission were discussed. This

would ensure that all the cases were responded and recorded appropriately while avoiding any delay as per the guidelines, keeping the best interest of the child in focus.

- The need to arrange Human Resources was discussed which would help in assisting data analysis and report writing for 6 months, initially.
- This would help in reviewing reports later as CHILDLINE has detailed data of several years.
- Follow-up and restoration support of each case to be provided to CHILDLINE by all Child Welfare Committees.
- Hoardings of the district magistrate, hospitals, etc. to be put up in Government premises and announcements about CHILDLINE in Metros, ISBT, Anand Vihar to be done to increase visibility.

UTTAR PRADESH

Bahraich

A meeting was held on 28th September, 2019 to counter human trafficking on Rupaidiha Border in Bahraich district with the cooperation of organisations, and the police from India & Nepal. This meeting helped in building better coordination between the police personnel of both countries.

Jhansi

On 13th August, 2019 at BRC Mauranipur block of Jhansi district, a meeting with teachers was conducted

by the CHILDLINE team in which principals from all schools of the block participated. In the meeting, problems and cases related to children were discussed and information about child helpline number 1098 was provided. The principals suggested to put up a complaint box in their schools so that children could drop their written complaints and issues in the box without any fear. All the principals agreed to put complaint boxes in their schools.

NAGALAND

- In the month of May 2019, Nagaland State Legal Service Authority organised a workshop on Invitation to the Legal Awareness Programme on "Child Protection: Towards Collective Action" in coordination with CHILDLINE. CIF representative was called to attend that workshop as a resource person.

- Home Department also incorporated CHILDLINE logo and message in the IEC materials published by the NSLSA.

MEGHALAYA

During their visit, the CIF representatives met with SCPCR (State Commission for Protection of Child Rights), Home, Governor of Meghalaya, Social Welfare Department and briefed them about CHILDLINE services in Meghalaya. After the visit, a circular was issued from Home Department to support CHILDLINE. Additionally, Komal Film, CHILDLINE logo and message has been incorporated on the website of Social Welfare Department.

TRIPURA

A meeting was organized with Director of Social Welfare and Social Education Govt. of Tripura regarding the constitution of State Level CHILDLINE Advisory Board.

Initiation of Child Friendly Police Station at Sepahijala District Tripura:

Tripura's first Child Friendly Police Corner has been established in coordination with Police. In the inaugural, CIF representative along with Chairperson TSCPCR, DCPO Sepahijala, Local MLA & Police personnel were present.

Distribution of Child Friendly Police Jacket at West Tripura & Belonia:

In the POCSO Act, 2012, Chapter 6, Section 24 (2), it is written that the Police Officers while recording the statement of the child shall not be in uniform. Furthermore, the JJ ACT Model, Rule 16, Section 9, Subsection V clearly stated that the Child Welfare Officer should be in plain clothes.

The CHILDLINE West Tripura & Belonia team in coordination with CIF, Social Welfare and Social Education Govt. of Tripura, District Administration & Police Personnel had organised a programme where

Subsequently, a letter was sent by RRCH to the Department and the State Level CHILDLINE Advisory Board was formed. Next, a meeting was organized with the Chairperson ASCPCR. She was requested to incorporate CHILDLINE logo and case study in the annual report published by the Commission. She agreed for the proposal and hence, the matter has been incorporated in it. Later on, CHILDLINE logo and two case studies were incorporated in the annual report.

Mumbai

CHILDLINE team Mumbai attended the following programmes:-

CHILDLINE Thane team visited the office of Thane Superintendent to discuss the issue of non-cooperation by local police stations.

The event launch of Child Rights week with Maharashtra Police at Navi Mumbai was attended by CHILDLINE team on the completion of 30 years of CRPC. CHILDLINE team attended the meeting at DG office Mumbai with 4,83,029 students and 7597 teaching and non-teaching officials.

CHILDLINE team conducted a training campaign for NISHTHA 7 Batch of Maharashtra regarding the CSA and POCSO Act, wherein a total of 1576 teachers across Maharashtra were trained in 27 sessions.

CHILDLINE team trained around 500 teachers in 4 batches from Gujarat and MP on Child Physical Abuse and POCSO Act, 2015.

The coordinators from CHILDLINE team conducted NISHTHA training at the district level in Gadchiroli, Nashik, Chandrapur, Mumbai, Parbhani, Nagpur, Solapur and Kolhapur.

The campaign for ending violence against children in partnership with UNICEF and Maharashtra Police was attended by the CHILDLINE team. Representatives of the CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF) provided valuable inputs for content in module training.

DWCD Mumbai organised a workshop on the role of cooperators in the establishment of ward level Child Protection committees which was attended by the CHILDLINE team.

- Art competition was conducted for over 1700 students of the resident tribal schools.

The circular of cooperation to be issued from all the police stations of District Kathua to CHILDLINE Kathua, and also hanging of a small board/flex that displays the CHILDLINE emergency number 1098.

Next, a circular to be provided to all the Government and private schools for hanging/displaying the CHILDLINE emergency number 1098 in school premises. And most importantly, a circular to be issued for the President and industries for cooperation to CHILDLINE in awareness programmes and Child Labour Cases.

- The police staff and concerned authority will accompany CHILDLINE Uttar Dinajpur during prevention of Child Marriage.
- The police will produce the child before CWC and no child should be restored to family without producing the child before the CWC.
- Allied system will provide necessary support to CHILDLINE during case intervention.
- Discussion regarding issuing of ID Cards for the CHILDLINE team members of Cooch Behar.
- Participation of CHILDLINE in all the block development meetings and Primary Health Centre meetings.

- Regarding increasing visibility of CHILDLINE in transport, schools, hoardings at public places, BDO offices, Gram Panchayats, Police Stations, Bus stands, etc.
- Regarding conducting a survey on status of child at red light area of Ghatal Block.
- RTO will be requested to distribute amongst the Government and private transportation to display CHILDLINE stickers in all vehicles running in the district for awareness.
- Discussion regarding support from Labour Department in all the Child Labour cases in the district of Dakshin Dinajpur.

On 5th July, CIC Ms. Jennifar attended the NCPCR meeting which was conducted in Kalaburagi Division. She presented CHILDLINE data and some of the cases were brought to the notice of NCPCR.

On 2nd February, 2020, Ms. Chithra Anchan attended the **state level sensitization cum awareness programme that was arranged for all Heads and Principals of District Institute of Education & Training centre.** Ms. Anchan was also one of the **speakers for the session.** The programme aims to sensitize teachers, parents and students on positive outlook towards their exams. She spoke about CHILDLINE and how it functions. Also, the nature of calls with regards to schools was discussed. This initiative was done as per the instructions of KSCPCR.

Officer issued directions for CHILDLINE Visibility boards in Hospitals and its premises. Five visibility boards were fixed spots at Beach Hospital, Kozhikode. The Deputy Director Education directed Head Masters to conduct POCSO Awareness in collaboration with DLSA and CHILDLINE. Kudumbashree District Mission Coordinator supported CHILDLINE for training CDS Chairpersons and District Youth Welfare board. Overall, these CABs could ensure the participation of District Collector /ADM to chair the meeting and vital decisions could be made.

Thrissur

The CHILDLINE visibility board was fixed at Thrissur Zoo near the enquiry counter on 16th June, 2019. CHILDLINE posters were on display at all the police stations. School level awareness on Substance and Drug Abuse- "ZERO ZONE" an awareness exhibition against Drug Abuse was organized. One day training for CMPOs was conducted on 22nd October, 2019 with the support of WCD. Also, training was organized for School JPHNs with the support of NHM.

Trivandrum

The Health department gave instructions to prioritise the CSA victims for medical examination and treatment; the DMO issued a circular for the same. The District Collector requested the Transport officer for pasting CHILDLINE 1098 Number in all passenger vehicles. Sensitization programmes were conducted for elected representatives of Local Self Govt.

Kasaragod

There was an order to fix CHILDLINE visibility in schools by displaying posters in all classrooms of the district. Then, the children of Mahila Mandiram were issued with bus concession cards and also RTO passes were provided to them. The visibility board of CHILDLINE 1098 was kept in the Panchayat office.

CHILD HELP DESKS

Accelerating emergency services at railway stations

India's railway network is one of the largest in the world-connecting the country and facilitating the movement of passengers and goods all around the year. It comprises of 1,23,542 kilometres of track over a route of 67,415 kilometres across 7,349 stations. In 2018-19, the network carried 840 crore passengers annually or more than 23 million passengers a day!

India is also home to the largest number of children (39% of the population) in a single country in the entire world. According to the estimates, at least 40% of children in the country live in situations that make them vulnerable to abuse and exploitation. A large segment of this population lives in urban areas, having travelled from small towns and rural areas, in search of livelihood opportunities, to eke out a living, in the hope of a better life or in some cases, even to fulfill their dreams of meeting the film stars they idolise. And many of them, use the railway network to reach these urban centres. They arrive in urban centres, by travelling via trains, either as individual runaway children, or in many cases, in groups via an organised trafficking network. Big railway stations are key transit points in this process. The huge railway network, which is such an important lifeline of the country, is misused severely.

For many of the children who arrive at the urban centres in trains, railway stations serve as the first port of call. These railway stations can therefore become key outreach points for identifying and assisting vulnerable children. CHILDLINE and other civil society organisations that have been working with children in contact along with the railways as well as those in and around railway platforms, have therefore advocated for concerted efforts and focused programmes at important railway stations.

CHILDLINE sought to set up an institutional mechanism to provide a safety net in and around the railway stations, involving the association of multiple stakeholders. The purpose was to rescue children during the transfer process from safety to exploitation, or even wean off a child from living on the streets by providing alternative options. The objective was to respond to a child's

needs, before it gets escalated into a situation where the child becomes more vulnerable to exploitation and abuse.

In 2015-16, a partnership between two key ministries and multiple civil society partners with the common agenda to address the vulnerability of children and prevent abuse, saw a unique initiative taking shape. A Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) was formulated in March 2015 and a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between the Ministry of Railways and the Ministry of Women and Child Development on 19th May, 2015. One of the operative instructions that was a part of the SOPs was that the CHILDLINE Help Desks/Kiosks/Booths to be set up at railway stations as an institutional mechanism. These were to be manned by the CHILDLINE partners that were receiving, rehabilitating and restoring children.

The CHILDLINE Help Desk aids in providing immediate attention to children at railway stations who are found unaccompanied by adults, thereby addressing the issue of runaways, missing or abandoned children, and children in other difficult circumstances in a systematic & institutionalised manner. On account of being situated in a prominent area, the help desk not only serves to address the needs of vulnerable children, but also aids in creating large scale awareness about how children at risk could be helped, thereby promoting increased civic participation.

The regular ambit of CHILDLINE services are provided to children who come in contact with the Railways, based on outreach efforts, calls and cases reported to the 1098 helpline and walk in referrals by concerned adults. Assistance to children includes protection of children from exploitative situations, producing them before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC), and subsequent linkages to long rehabilitative services.

As of March 2020, CHILDLINE is operational in 128 railway stations across India and the programme will be extended to more railway stations progressively.

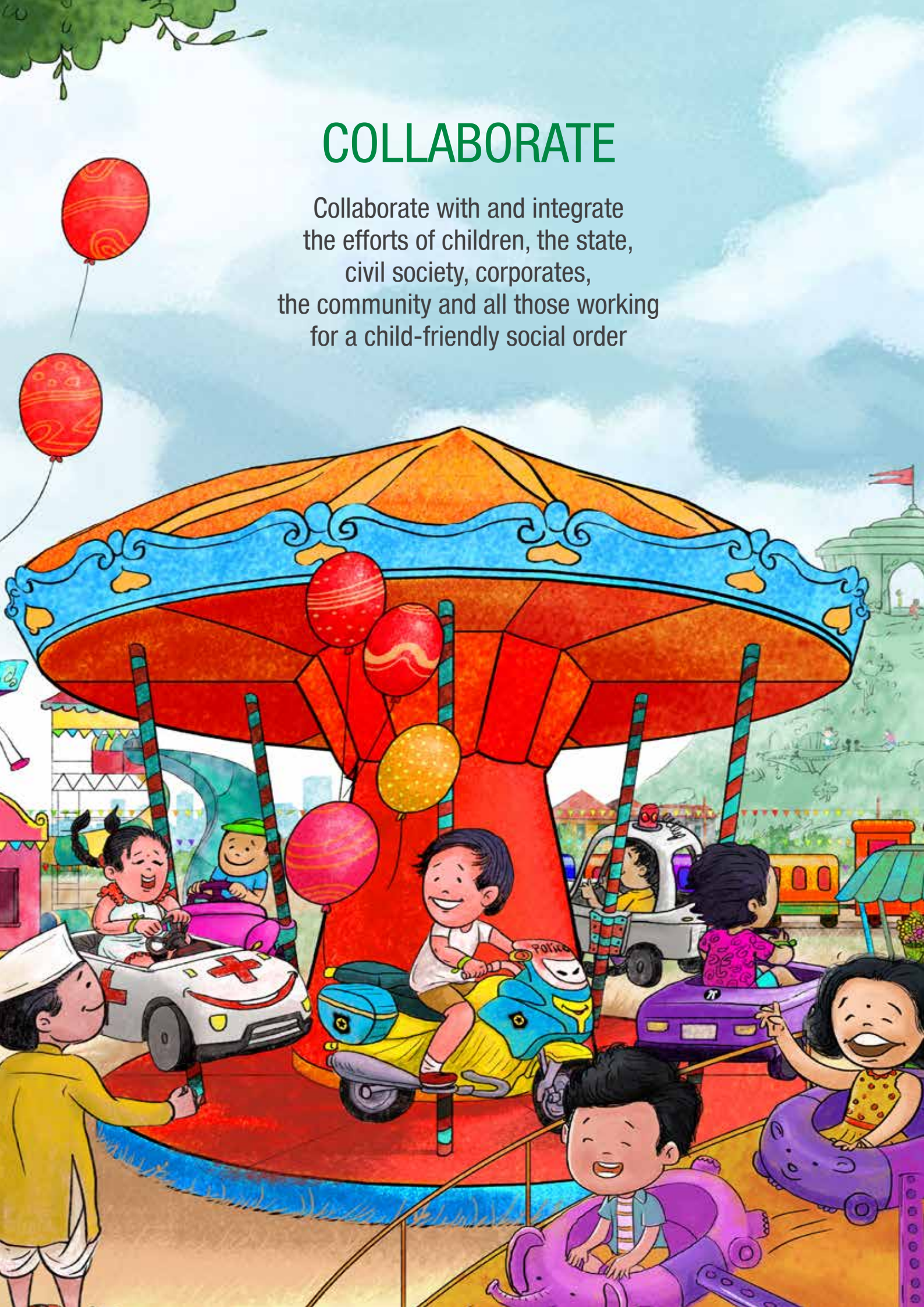

TRAINING NEEDS ASSESSMENT

CHILDLINE India Foundation set up the CHILDLINE Knowledge Hub in September 2016, with a need to link information from the ground with its larger overall objectives. It was created to strengthen CHILDLINE’s understanding of the existing protection needs of children, build knowledge and skills regarding protocols, laws and legislations being followed during interventions, and integrate the programmes with the overall Integrated Child Protection Scheme structure. To achieve this, the Knowledge Hub would initiate and strengthen research, provide policy inputs on experiential learning, and build capacity among personnel engaged in child protection. Training is a core component of the functions of the CHILDLINE Knowledge Hub. Activities carried out under this component include assessment of training needs, design of curriculum, and carrying out technical & skill-based training programmes for the CIF team, CHILDLINE Partners team, as well as other stakeholders as required. Considering that training needs differ from region to region, it was important to carry out a Training Needs Assessment (TNA). Using tools such as questionnaires, case scenarios which elucidated barriers and challenges faced by personnel and one-on-one interviews with key stakeholders to gather information, the TNA helped in preparing the training plan and developing the Train-the-Trainer manuals. As a result, CIF was able to identify gaps between existing and required level of skills, knowledge and attitudes among CHILDLINE and Collab Partner personnel, identify what the training programmes should cover, and also ensure that appropriate and relevant training was being delivered.

NORTH

CHILDLINE India Foundation collaborated with stakeholders to help the CHILDLINE teams be fully equipped with laws and procedures during any child intervention case. During the year 2019-20, the training was focused on documentation, emotional support, guidance skills and Child Protection Acts.

Outreach strategies, training on SOP for railways, outreach strategies documentation, trafficking and intervention categories were provided to the Railway CHILDLINE teams in March 2020. CHILDLINE Railways team provided relief services to riot victims in Delhi district with the emphasis on psychosocial support for

affected children. Later, CHILDLINE in coordination with UNICEF conducted a psychosocial training programme for the distressed children. In these training programmes, set-up of child-friendly spaces was done while workshops organised by Government, Non-Government departments, were the key highlights. In total, CHILDLINE team attended 133 sessions of training/workshop on the topics of Juvenile Justice Act, 2015, POCSO Act, 2012, Child Marriage Act and ITPA, Substance Abuse, etc.

CIF as an organisation has consistently spearheaded the representation of its objectives on public forums, meetings and workshops. Over the last five years, CIF

has interacted with many like-minded organisations and shared its thoughts from the ground level. Some major highlights are as follows:

CIF representative delivered a session on bonded Child Labour in the workshop arranged by IJM to analyze the expanding conceptual boundaries of Child labourers while understanding the dynamics of migrant labours.

CHILDLINE attended a two-day state-level training and consultation meeting on implementation of Juvenile Justice Act, 2015 and operational challenges faced by key duty bearers, organised by BBA.

CHILDLINE Gujarat attended two days of training on Child Physical Abuse and Online Safety of children organised by Karnavati University at Gandhinagar.

During the consultation, planning and implementation of alternative care was discussed in detail towards the deinstitutionalization of children with prime focus on family and community care. NISHTHA is a capacity building programme for “Improving Quality of School Education through Integrated Teacher Training”. It aims to build competencies among all the teachers and school principals at the elementary stage. The functionaries (at the state, district, block, cluster level) shall be trained in an integrated manner on learning outcomes, school based assessment, learner-centered pedagogy, new initiatives in education, addressing diverse needs of children through multiple pedagogies, etc. This has been organised by constituting National Resource Groups (NRGs) and State Resource Groups (SRGs) at the National and the State level who would be training 42 lakh teachers subsequently. As Child Protection personnels’ master trainers from CHILDLINE India Foundation were responsible to conduct sessions on CSA and POCSO ACT, 2012.

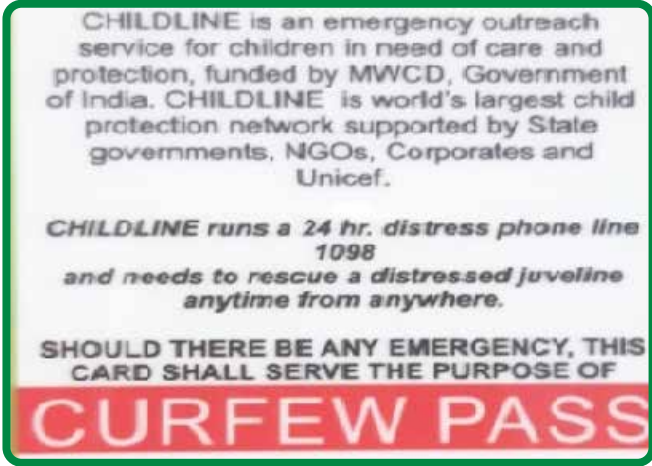

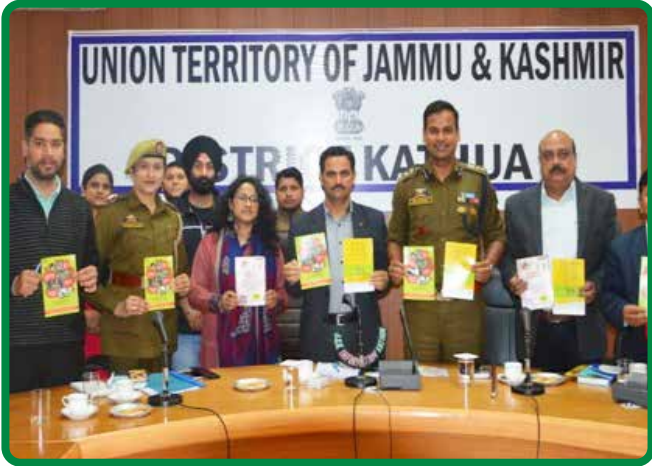

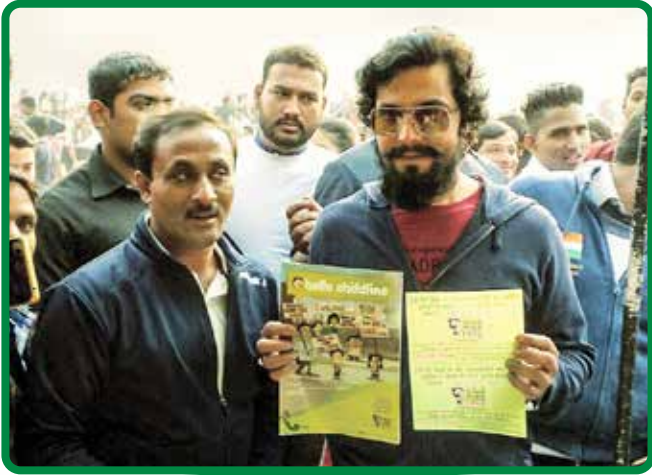

CHILDLINE conducted periodic interactions with children to gather their views and to know the problems they are facing. The "Open Houses" are conducted periodically and allow children to be heard and seek support from Government systems. As the name suggests, an

Open House is a forum for children associated with CHILDLINE to address conflicts, assess, review and evaluate the services of CHILDLINE 1098. It also allows space for children to raise issues and identify solutions to the problems along with the CHILDLINE team. In the year 2019-20, 93 Open Houses were engaging with approximately 5405 thousand children in the state of Delhi. Following were some issues which were identified and addressed through Open House meetings:

- Issues of Substance Abuse and Child Marriage were discussed with the concerns of DLSA and the DCPO.
- Children who were trying to get admission in the mainstream schools received assistance to get enrolled in the municipal schools.
- The community people and the children were made aware of safe and unsafe touch.
- Consequences of the addiction to mobile usage were discussed and the tips to engage the children in extra-curricular activities were explained to the parents.

ODISHA

Open house programmes were conducted at community levels, residential schools to discuss the major children related issues.

Issues that were raised during the Open House:

- Non-functioning of PHD water supply of the village. So, children and villagers are facing problems for drinking water. There is no tube well in Satnamipada of Rohidaspada Village.
- Unavailability of Anganwadi building in the village. Anganwadi centre only functions in one room of the Primary school. Quality teaching was not provided by teachers for both Anganwadi and Primary schools.
- The Primary school is also a kilometer away from the village and there is no separate road to the school. So, children are facing difficulty of going to school during the rainy season.
- The children have no Aadhar card.
- During the rainy season, children face lots of problems while going to school.

Actions taken to address issues raised during Open House:

- Meeting with Ward Counsellor to take action for repairing of PHD water supply within 3 days.
- Then, the CHILDLINE team will help write a letter to

RWSS for digging the new tube well at Satnamipada. Also, CHILDLINE members along with the villagers will discuss with Sarpanch to solve issues related to drinking water.

- CHILDLINE submitted the request letter to District Social Welfare Officer to solve the Anganwadi building issue.
- CHILDLINE also submitted the request letter to Executive Officer, Jharsuguda Municipality for construction of new separate road with the support of villagers.
- CHILDLINE team will arrange the necessary documents of the three children with the help of AWW and ASHA for making Aadhar card.
- CHILDLINE team discussed with Sarpanch to submit the plan for the construction of a concrete road.

Outcomes of the Open House Programme:

- CHILDLINE team arranged necessary documents of the three children and with the help of ward members, they applied online for Aadhar Card which were then issued.
- One separate room has been arranged by the Sarpanch for AWW centre.
- Regular follow-up is going on with the allied system for rest of the issues.

JHARKHAND

CHILDLINE in Jharkhand has conducted a total number of **480** Open House programmes and were able to reach out to **20554** children through the programmes. Issues were related to lack of playground & boundary wall in schools, problem of drinking water and sanitation in schools, requirement of tube well in communities, cases of school drop-outs and Child Marriages, incidences of eve-teasing, etc.

CHILDLINE team calls out the issues of children in these Open House programmes and escalates the same to the concerned authority towards resolving the issues.

Follow-up visits are also done and the children are informed on the steps taken by CHILDLINE team towards resolving their problems.

Across the state of Karnataka, an Open House is conducted focusing on issues raised by children. This is one of the important tools which directly ensures the child’s participation. CHILDLINE provides space to voice their needs, issues in the community and advocate for their local community problems to the allied departments invited. Parents and communities are also invited for Open Houses. Total 355 open meetings were conducted and about 5187 children, 35068 adults and 2939 authorities participated in those meetings.

IMPACT OF OPEN HOUSE

- CHILDLINE facilitated for initiating the construction of compound wall in many schools and playgrounds.
- Construction of separate toilet for girls and boys in many schools, drinking water facilities through local Panchayat leaders and solve mid-day meal issues.
- Linked many children sponsorship schemes under ICPS scheme, RBSK scheme, etc.
- Regular beat has been initiated by police wherever school premises are misused.
- Facilitation done for solving drainage issues, closing of open well and street lights in many of the villages.
- It also helped in healthy coordination between the department as well as community people.
- Bus facilities in many of the villages by co-ordinating with the transport department and ensure that there is positive change in behaviour of bus driver and conductor while interacting with school children.

Open House is a unique platform for children and community to share issues of children. It also provides an opportunity for CHILDLINE to listen to children and collect feedback on services of CHILDLINE and other departments including suggestions. Officials from line departments are involved in Open House Programmes.

A total of 156 Open House sessions were conducted with children, community people and allied departments. A total of 9487 children and 1404 stakeholders have participated and 390 cases reported through these Open Houses.

Total 442 Open Houses conducted, 29905 Children and 22424 adults have been reached and nearly 491 cases were reported. Issues such as school/village level infrastructural needs, transportation facilities were also addressed and solved.

KERALA

222 Open Houses were planned to be achieved in Kerala and 24 in the UT district of Lakshadweep and

Puducherry. Out of the target, in Kerala, CHILDLINE has conducted 168 Open Houses and 12 in UTs. The under achievement of target was due to consecutive unprecedented floods experienced in most of the districts during the monsoon of 2019.

Open House is a strategic component programme of CHILDLINE from its inception and also vital tool of CHILDLINE to listen to the voice of Children.

During the year 2019-2020, CHILDLINE could ensure high quality in organising Open House with the participation of relevant Govt. Department representatives. Here, children were given a platform to put up their concerns to the officials. The officials also got an opportunity to hear the voices of children's talk which had an enduring effect on the outcome of Open Houses organised. Face-to-face conversation eased out many problems of children; such as rude behaviour by private bus workers, excise checks in the neighbourhood on illicit alcohol making and distribution, installation of street lights, bus services to remote places, safety of children around school premises, neglect faced at homes, rescue from eve teasing etc. Several safeguarding and care issues were also brought to the attention by children through Open Houses and most of them have been resolved, while the rest are work in progress.

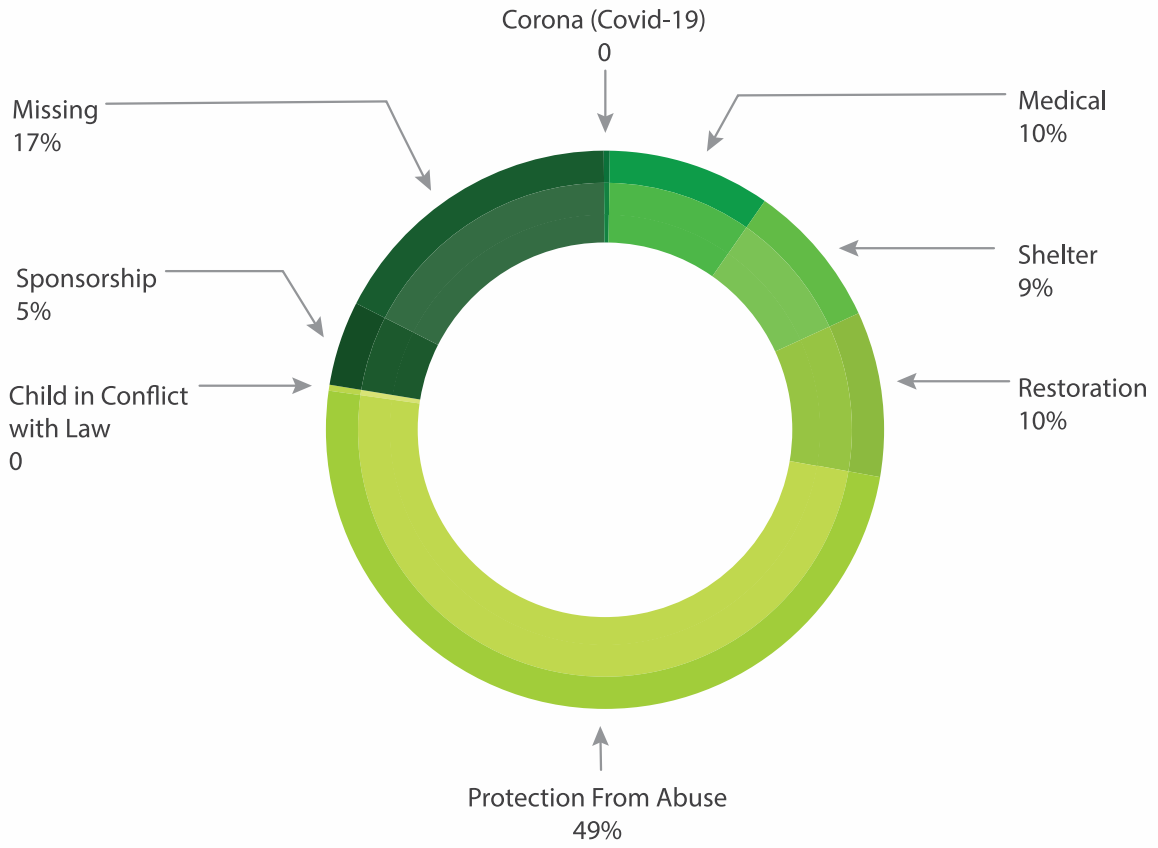

In addition to being the first respondents to children in need of care and protection and offering comfort to those in distress, it also plays a critical role in shaping and implementing the existing National Child Protection mechanisms.

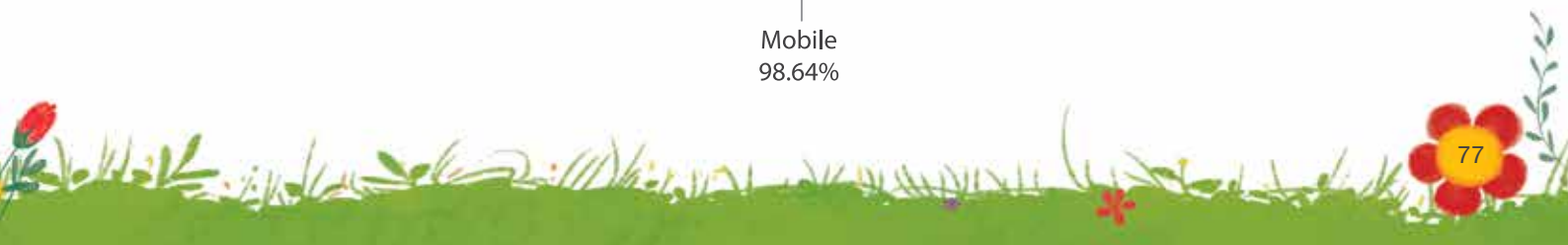
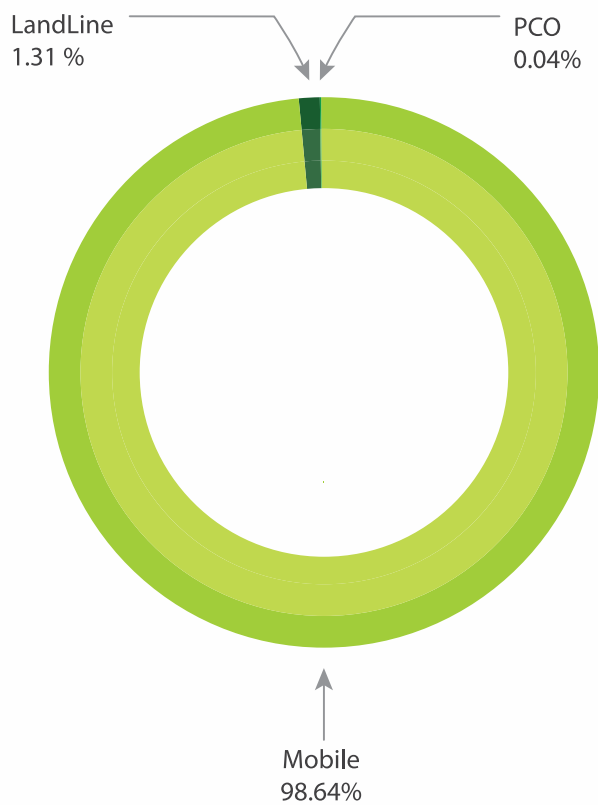

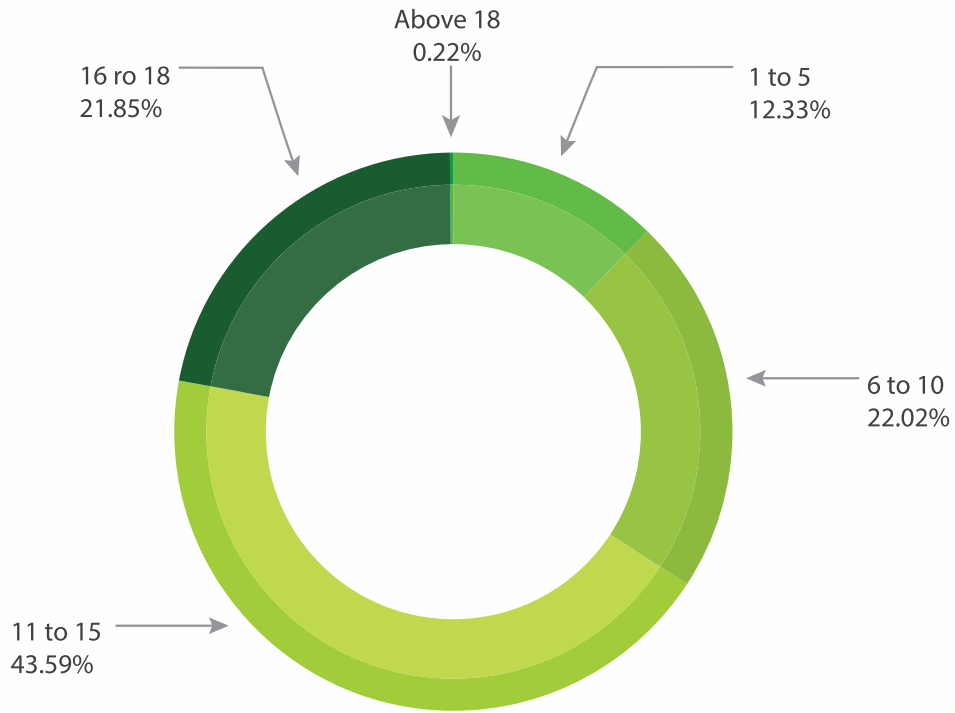

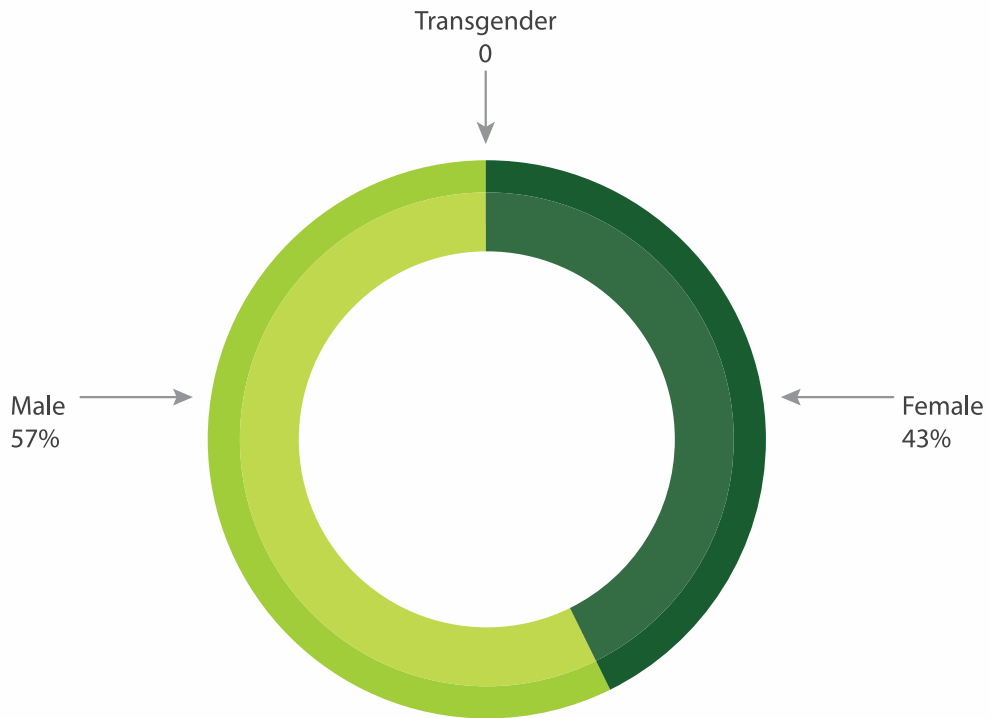
How children called CHILDLINE 1098?

CHILDLINE CONTACT CENTRE (CCC)

The CHILDLINE 1098 service is a 24-hour free, emergency, phone-outreach service for children in need of care and protection. The voice of every distressed child reaches us through the CHILDLINE Contact Centres (CCC). The CHILDLINE service needs to reach every corner of the country to ensure that every distressed child's cry for help can be heard and responded to. It is with this aim that contemporary technology and systems are used at the CCCs to which calls are directed. There are at present 6 call receiving centres across 5 locations (Mumbai, Delhi, Kolkata, Chennai and Bengaluru), and all CHILDLINE cities/districts are connected to it. The CCCs answer calls round-the-clock, at the National level, to ensure that every child who calls 1098, is provided help through partners at the local level. CCC is staffed by CIF staff and the technology/infrastructure is outsourced to TCS using cloud-based connectivity.

HOW CCC FUNCTIONS

Once a call is received at the CCC on 1098, it is answered by a trained CHILDLINE Contact Officer (CCO). If the call resolution can be completed on the phone, it becomes a CCC operation. However, for calls requiring Direct Intervention, the CCO lists the details and makes an outbound call to the Collab Partners (the CHILDLINE Interventions unit) in the city where the call has come from. Then the Collab partner takes over and indicates to the CCC an estimated time of intervention and post the intervention, reports the complete case details to the CCC. This enables the CCC to complete the case documentation. Sometimes, the caller speaks in a local dialect. In such cases, the CCC facilitates a conference call with the local Collab Partner.

EXPANSION MODEL

- Remote-located primary data centre in Mumbai and disaster backup secondary data centre in Chennai.
- Data centre to host CRM software server, call recording server, Genesys platform server, Data backup server.
- These are connected via MPLS (Multi Protocol Label Switching) Cloud to each CCC location.
- CCC locations at TCS facility in each city are linked to data centers via MPLS cloud-based connectivity.
- Vendors include : Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) for hosted solution model (data centers and MPLS connectivity) and for CCC facility in each city and Talisma for CRM software.

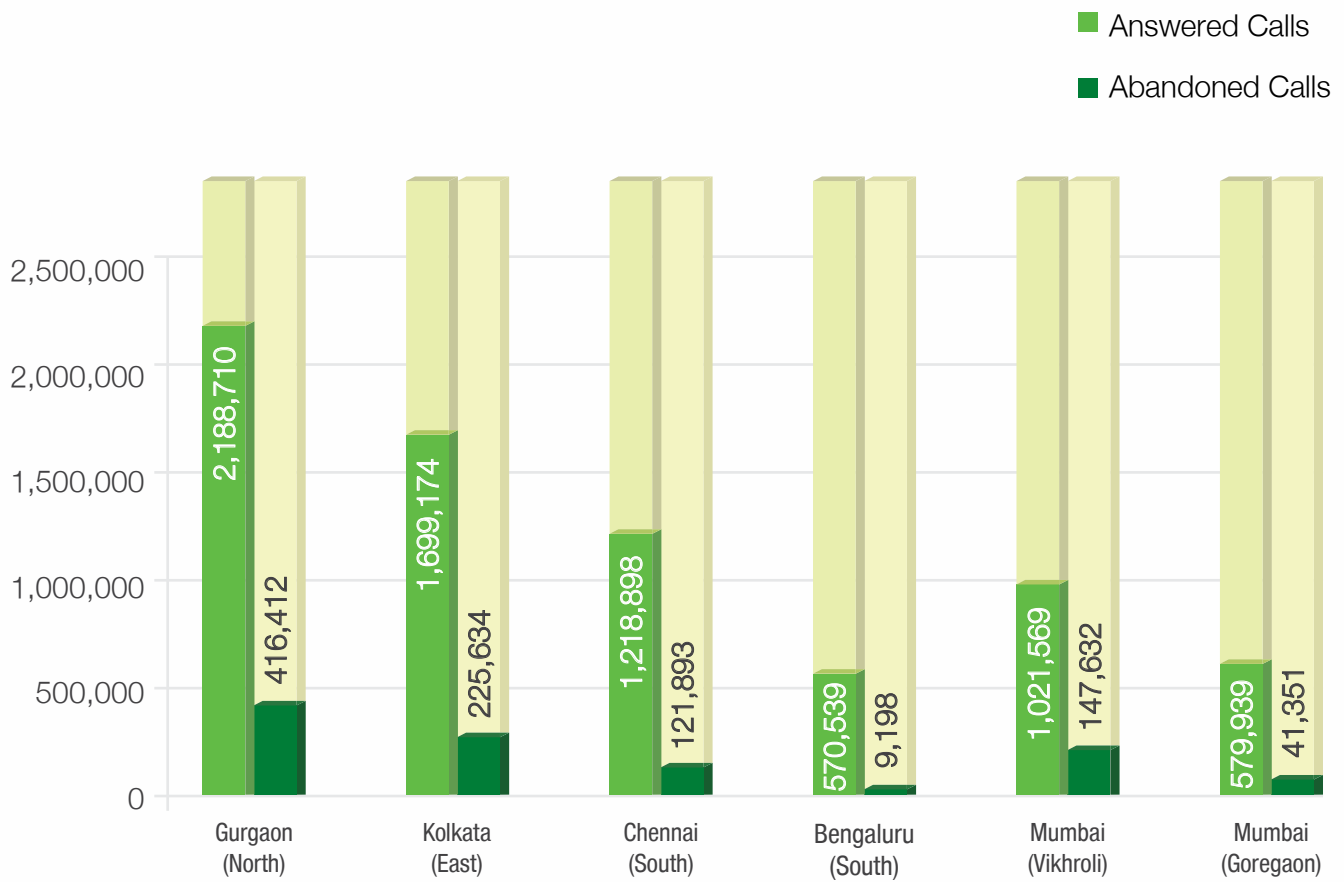

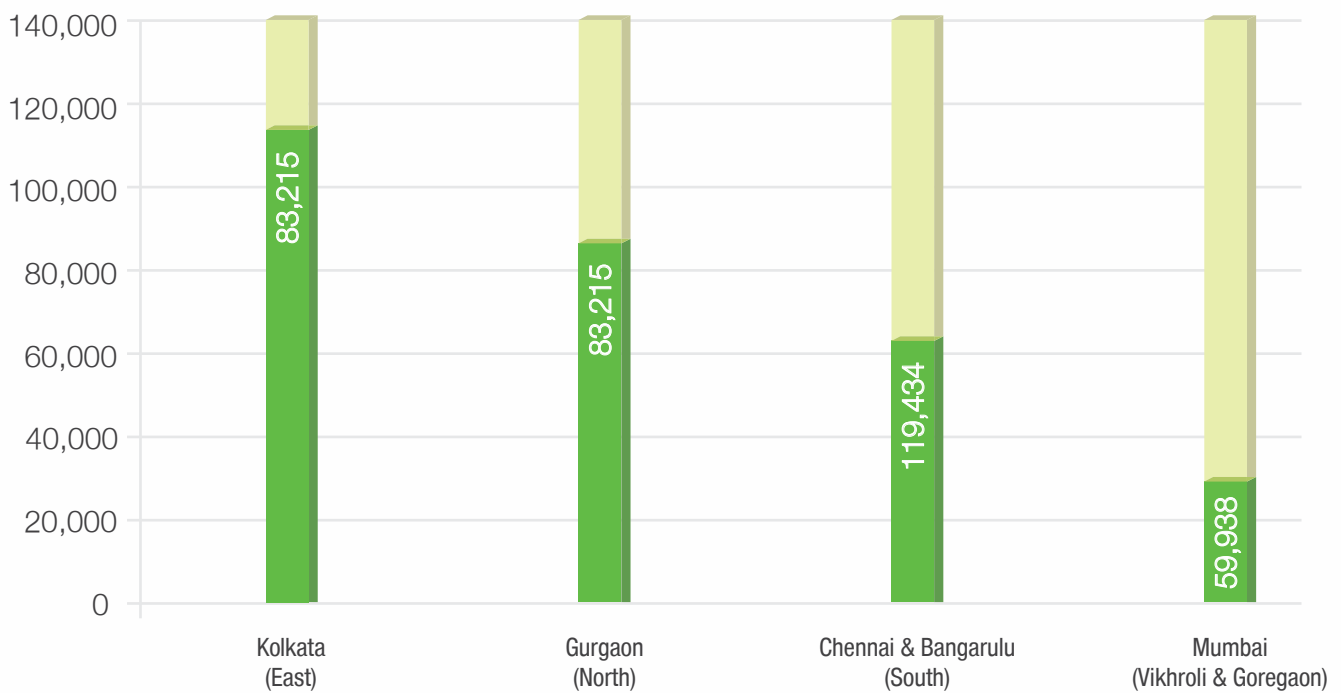

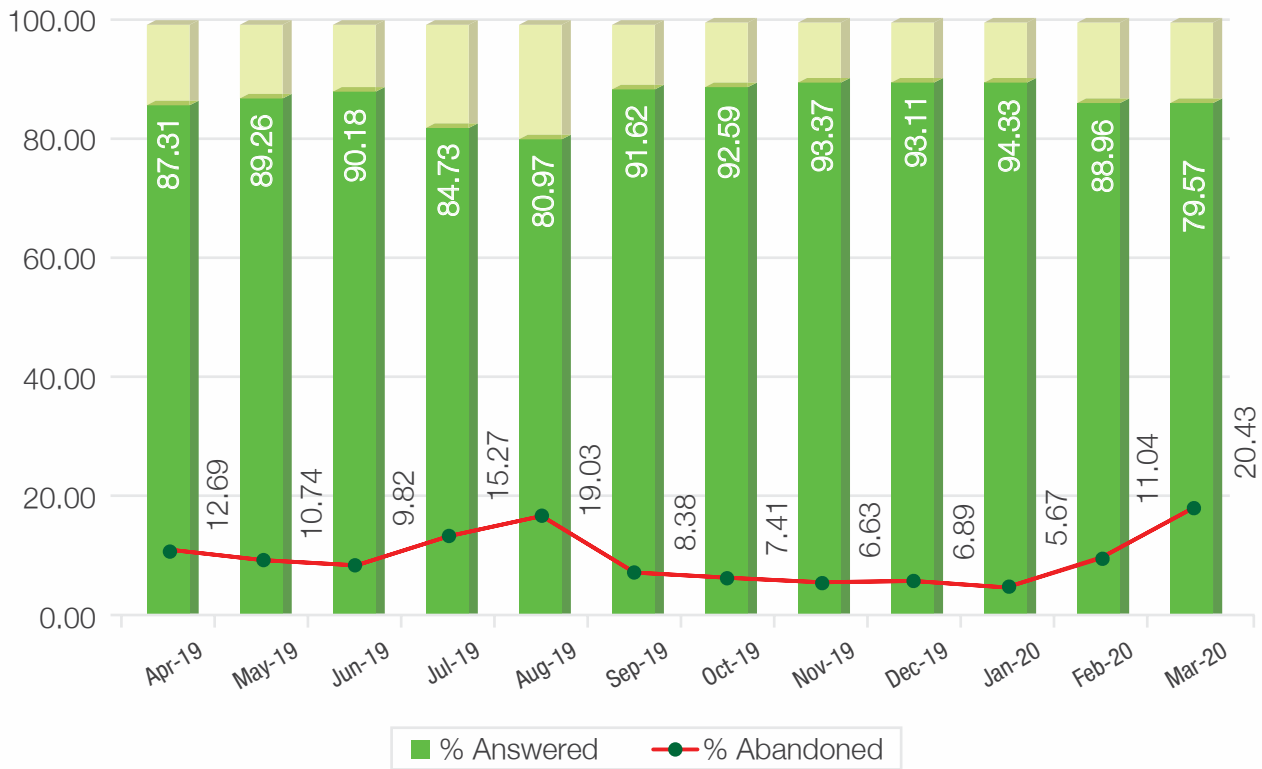




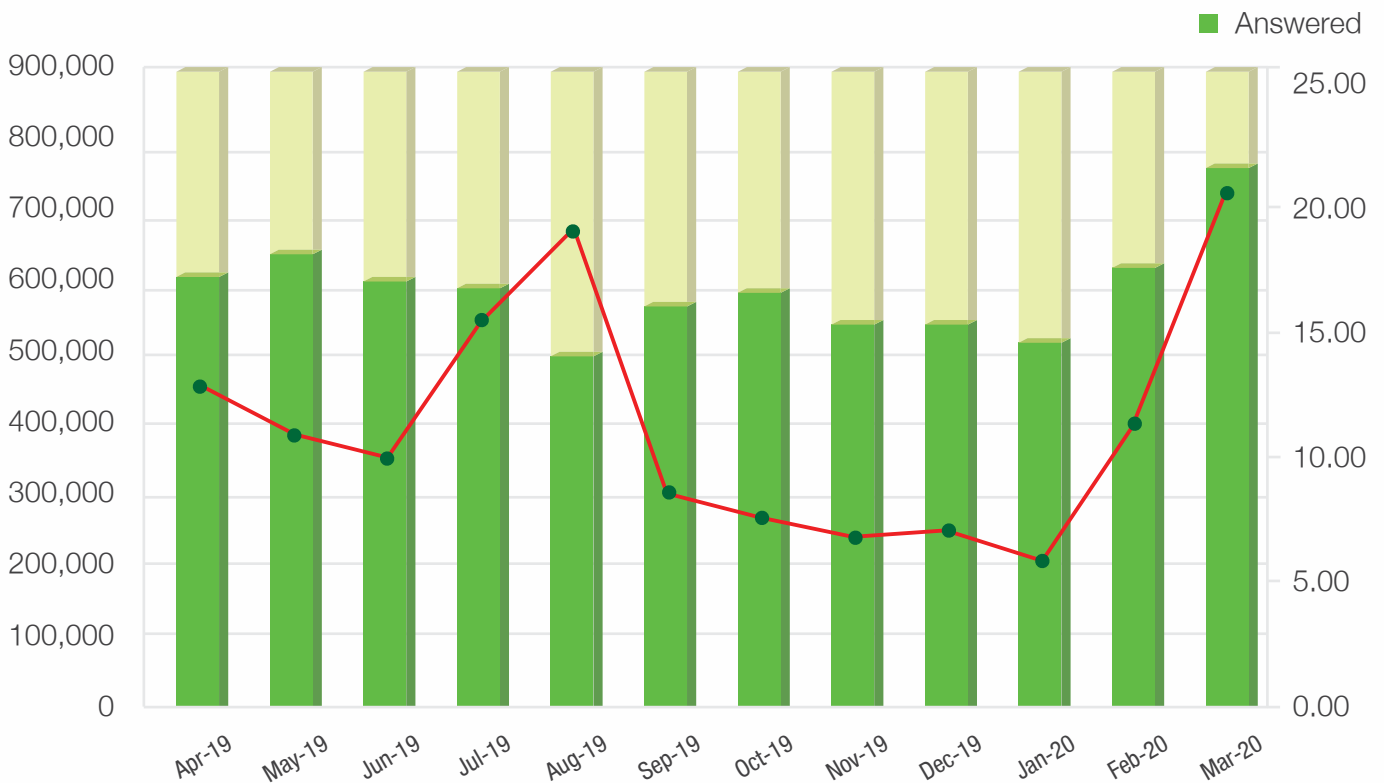
Zone wise Intervention



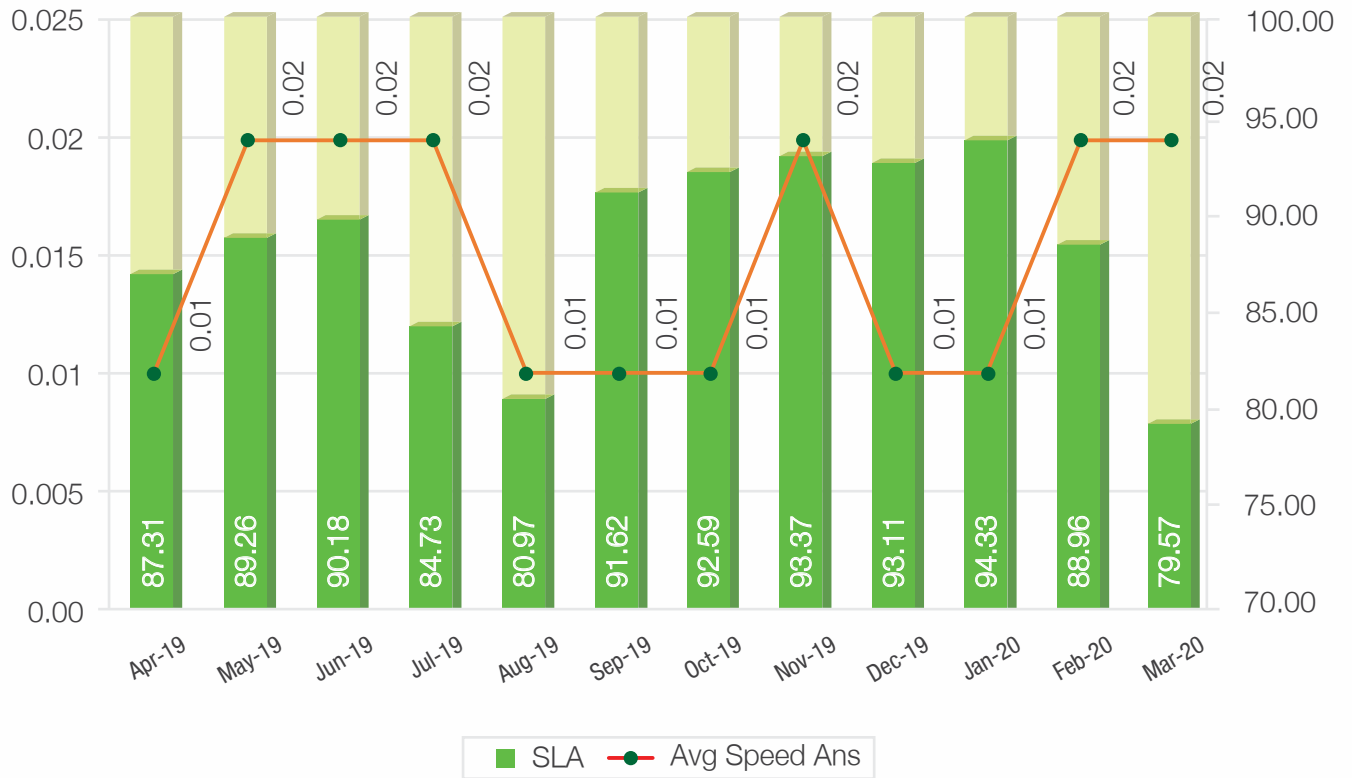
Yearly Trend: Calls Answered and Abandoned Percentage during April 1, 2019 to March 31, 2020

RESPONDING TO CHILDREN IN DISTRESS

The below-mentioned interventions/cases are a mere drop in the ocean of the work done by the CHILDLINE team.

****Details of the cases mentioned here have been changed to maintain confidentiality.***

CASE STUDIES

Medical Emergency

On 8th July, 2019, CHILDLINE received a call from Sangeeta (name changed), concerning her daughter, who was having inconvenience in walking. CHILDLINE team requested the caller to reach CHILDLINE office with the child. The caller came to CHILDLINE office the next day with her child and revealed that while playing, her daughter had suffered a knee injury. The child was immediately taken to a nearby dispensary.

A check-up and X-ray of the child was conducted, after which the doctors informed that her knee was filled with water and an immediate minor surgery would be needed to remove the water. Also, another surgery would be required after a week, or the child could lose her leg. The CHILDLINE team got two surgeries done successfully and saved the girl from becoming handicapped.

Substance Abuse/Drug Addiction

This case study is in relation to a 16-year-old who had been under the influence of Substance Abuse for 3 years. CHILDLINE Anantnag received a call from CHILDLINE Contact Centre and the caller informed CHILDLINE Anantnag that the said child is a Substance Abuser and wants feasible intervention. CHILDLINE Anantnag counsellor and a team visited the child for proper understanding of the case and to develop a rapport with the child. Counsellor tried her best to help the child come out of his problem and hence, the 1st session of counselling was done. During the counselling session, it was discovered that the child was psychologically deviated and wasn't able to receive our intervention. His condition was so bad, that he was lost in his own world. His parents had already tried all possible things to get him back on track, but they failed! Furthermore, CHILDLINE Anantnag approached the drug addiction centre for his admission and received thumbs up! Meanwhile, the CWC

Pulwama was also intimated regarding the said case in order to ease the admission process of the child.

Trafficking case

During the 2019 unrest in the valley, a 16-year-old girl was trafficked to Bihar. All sorts of communication was barred in the valley. The case was flashed on electronic media (T.V.) by a news channel. Next day, CHILDLINE team visited the concerned village and confirmed about the said family. Luckily, CHILDLINE traced the said family and interacted with family intimates. The father of the child informed us that his daughter was illegally trafficked to Bihar by an outsider who was working as a mason in the same village. In this connection, an FIR under Section 363 RPC was lodged at the police station. The CHILDLINE Anantnag team visited the concerned police station in order to know the status of the case. The concerned Investigation Officer briefed us about the case and stated that a police party had been sent to the Etawa village for recovery of the girl along with the family members of the victim, but the rescue of the child failed as the trafficker had displaced the girl to some other place. On the same day, the CLA intimated CWC Anantnag, District Child Anti-Trafficking Unit Anantnag and Deputy Superintendent of Police about the said case. Simultaneously, CLA intimated CHILDLINE Supaul about the said case and a rescue plan was initiated. All the required documents including the Birth Certificate, the FIR copy was sent to CHILDLINE Supaul. CHILDLINE Supaul carried the rescue operation and finally the girl was placed at a shelter home in Supaul. A rescue team from Anantnag left for Supaul for restoration of the child and the child was restored on 11th Oct, 2019.

Child Abuse

On 9th January, 2020, CHILDLINE got a call from an informant in Kasaragod district of Kerala. The informant revealed that a 10-year-old girl had suffered physical assault from a peon of her school, where she had

been studying. As per the information, CHILDLINE team visited the child's house on 10th January, 2020 and met the child and her parents. When the CHILDLINE team visited the child's house, it was found that the girl was staying in rented quarters with her parents, grandparents and younger sister. Her father is a daily wage worker and mother, a homemaker. The child is studying in the 5th standard at a school in Kasaragod district.

After meeting the child at her home, the team discovered that the girl was scared and not willing to go to school. The girl revealed that one day, without having Madrasa teachings, she reached the school by 8.45 am and there were no other students there. Normally, the teacher used to be there at the school, but that particular day, the Arabic teacher was on leave. When the child went to staffroom to get the broom, the peon, came there and showed his private parts. The child got scared and tried to run away from there, but he caught the child and forcefully kissed and hugged her. Later, the child mentioned this incident to her friends. Then, in the evening, the mother found that the child was extremely scared, so on a lot of prodding, the child told everything to her mother and subsequently they dialed the helpline number 1098.

After talking to the child, she revealed that her other friends also went through the same experience from the peon. After having a confidential talk with the girl, CHILDLINE team went to the school and also spoke to her friends with the consent of the Head Teacher. The CHILDLINE team learnt that similar incidences had happened with some other students too. On the same day, the information was given as per Section 19 (1), POCSO Act, 2012 to the SHO of Kasaragod Town Police. Immediately, the police came and took statements of six students and also did medical examinations, recorded statement before the Magistrate as per Section 164 of CRPC. The next day, the abuser was arrested and was remanded. Moreover, the same person reported to have abused nearly ten students in a school at same district where he worked previously.

At present, the child is staying with her parents and she is attending school. CHILDLINE continuously made follow-ups through emotional support and guidance to bring back the child to normalcy. Overall, the progress of the girl is satisfactory and CHILDLINE Kasaragod dedicates

all the efforts of the child's trauma recovery, while legal process is progressing in POCSO Court simultaneously.

Child Abuse

On 4th February, 2020, an unidentified caller called CHILDLINE 1098 and informed about severe physical abuse on two young children by their step-father. The children are said to be natives of Rappthadu village and are studying in Government School, Anantapur.

On 9th February, 2020, the CHILDLINE team met the Headmistress of the school, and inquired about the reported children. CHILDLINE personally interacted with the children with regards to the incident and learned that their step-father has been severely beating them up. They were immediately taken to the Grama Sachivalayam, which is adjacent to the school, and were produced by Mahila Police personnel. From there, the information was passed on to the town-police station, Anantapur. A constable from the town police station met the parents and gave them counselling about how not to ill-treat the children or abuse them physically. He warned them that stern action would be taken if any such incident repeats again. The CHILDLINE team counselled the children and gave them confidence, then asked them to report to their teacher if they are beaten up or troubled again.

On the very next day of 10th February, 2020, the Headmistress called CHILDLINE again and complained that the children were terribly beaten up by their step-father, and requested to intervene into the issue. The CHILDLINE team immediately rushed to the school and took a note of it. Photographs of the wounds on the bodies of the children were taken and were forwarded to the CHILDLINE to DCPO, and CDPO who immediately came to the school to take a note of the situation. On personal interaction with the children, they informed that their father beats them up for no reason, and they are very scared to go home and face their step-father. The officials decided to go to the children's family, and talk to them so that the issue can be settled. So, the DCPO and CDPO called, the SI of Police, Rappthadu and explained him the situation, informed him to support them as they are going to meet the children's family.

The mother of the children, strongly protested about any beating up of the children, and she was very arrogant with the team. For a while, she said that the children have fallen from a height causing them the injuries. But when the team explained her that those are not injuries caused

by an accidental fall, she started arguing that as parents, they very well know about how to control their children and have all the rights on them when they misbehave or act arrogantly. She even threatened the team that this type of enquiry and counselling is a shame and they will commit suicide if they ever come again to their house to talk about the children. The team, however, warned her and her husband not to repeat such things ever again. They also made a phone call to the police station requesting to strongly warn the father of the children to not do any cruelty on the children.

The news of the physical abuse on these two children has appeared in the local newspapers of 11th February, 2020. Responding to these media reports, the SI of Police, Raptadu Police Station called CHILDLINE 1098 requesting them to come to the police station. The parents of the children were also present at the police station by the time the team members went there. The team members of CHILDLINE explained the SI about the happenings during the past 2 days. In the meantime, the DCPO and the CDPO also came to the Police Station.

On advice by the SI of Police to lodge a written complaint to proceed further, the CHILDLINE, CDPO & DCPO submitted a written complaint on behalf of the children. An FIR was registered under Section 324 IPC and Section 75 of Juvenile Justice Act, 2015. The children were sent to the Government hospital for medical examination and treatment for the injuries.

Later, the children were provided with temporary shelter, by the CWC orders, in the State-run Balasadan while the parents were sent for Remand.

On 12th February, 2020, the children, escorted by CHILDLINE team member and a woman police officer from Raptadu police station, were produced before CWC. Then, as per the orders of CWC, they were sent to child care home in a village, where an NGO is running a CCI, with orders to provide them food, shelter and educational facilities. They issued orders that the mother can visit the children every month on 2nd and 4th Sunday without creating any problems for them. They also issued orders that the real father of the children and the grandparents also can meet the children on 1st and 3rd Sundays without disturbing them or creating any problems.

Child Marriage

Shanti Kumari (Name Changed), a 13-year-old girl lived at Ausgram Paschimpara, District Purba Bardhaman. Her marriage was fixed by her parents as it was a custom in their village to get the child married at the earliest age possible. CHILDLINE Purba Bardhaman received a call from a concerned adult who informed them about the child's marriage which was scheduled to happen the very next day. CHILDLINE Purba Bardhaman immediately contacted the Inspector-in-Charge from the Police Station to take some necessary action. CHILDLINE with the help of Police and Block Development Officer (B.D.O.) went to the house of the minor girl and took a written declaration from her parents stating that the girl would not be married off before 18 years of age and also tried to make them aware about how child marriage is a social evil. The parents of the minor girl including the community people were educated on the fact that child marriage is a social evil because of its several ill-effects. Hence, CHILDLINE Purba Bardhaman emerged successful to prevent a case of Child Marriage.

Runaway

Jaideep's (name changed) parents were living separately. The child and his elder brother stayed with their grandparents in Bihar. Soon, the child's mother came and took the child with her to Haryana. The mother had been staying with another man who had 3 children and 1 child of their own. Jaideep was sent to a private school, but he was not getting the attention he needed. He was being threatened by his step father's ex-wife. Eventually, he got scared and ran away from his house. The child was found by Haryana Police and was placed under a Care Institution for 2 years. Later, the family was retraced and the mother with the child's step-father came to take him back where they found that the child was neither interested in studies nor work.

Once again, he ran from his house and was found by CHILDLINE Delhi. After the daily diary and medical examination, the CHILDLINE team produced the child before the CHILD WELFARE COMMITTEE Kalkaji, New Delhi. During the CWC production, the child stated that he neither wants to live with his mother nor wants to go to his real father's home. The child was unable to make the right decision for himself. The child was handed over to his mother,

and a few days later, he was taken secretly by his maternal uncle and handed to his father. The child was happy earlier but soon his father started to beat him. He left and ran to his step-father's house, and from there also he ran away. He was very disturbed cause of his complicated and broken family. It was the third time that he had fled from his house and eventually, he came in contact with CHILDLINE Help Desk of Hazrat Nizamuddin railway station.

CHILDLINE counselled the child and taught him the importance of life. His behaviour changed soon and he became positive towards his life. From there on, he began staying with his maternal grandparents and his elder brother. And later after the pandemic and lockdown, a follow-up was conducted, and now he is happily living with his biological father.

Child Abuse

CHILDLINE Contact Centre (CCC) informed Bhopal CHILDLINE about the case of a 13-year-old who is into Substance Abuse. The caller was the mother of the child.

The child was brought to the CHILDLINE office accompanied by her maternal uncle. The lady team members interacted with the child wherein the child narrated her story. The child's father is a rickshaw puller while her mother is often ill and bedridden. They are two siblings and she lives with her maternal uncle while her sister lives with her parents. The girl discontinued her studies after the 7th standard. Once she dropped out of school, her friends from the locality got her into the habit of consuming drugs. During the interaction, the team felt that the child is not providing complete picture of the situation, but they did not pursue her any further.

Next day, the team visited the child's maternal uncle's house where the woman team member again interacted with the child. During counselling, the child broke down and told the CHILDLINE team that she would not be able to share anything here onwards.

The child with her grandmother was taken to the CHILDLINE office where she narrated what happened 6 months back. Whenever she fought with her grandmother, she left the house at night without informing anyone. She then went to the bus stand where she met a boy, who offered her a cigarette which was filled with marijuana. After smoking

the cigarette, she got under the influence of drugs and fell unconscious. Then, the boy physically abused her. Next morning, she found that her clothes were in a bad condition and realized that something unfortunate had happened to her. She stayed with him for 2 days where another boy joined them in consuming marijuana, hash (charas), tablets of Nitrobeta and alcohol. Along with the 2 boys, she went with auto rickshaw drivers, during which she was again physically abused many times. Thereafter, all three were taken around the city where they were assaulted in exchange for money. They divided the money amongst the three of them and used it to purchase drugs. After this, the child pleaded with the CHILDLINE team to help her get out of this situation.

After due procedure, an FIR was registered against the perpetrators under Indian Penal Code (IPC) 376 and Sections 3 & 4 of POCSO Act. The child by order of the Competent Authority was placed at Balika Gruh. Meanwhile, the 12 perpetrators had been arrested.

Child Beggary

The CHILDLINE team received information from a fruit vendor about a 13-year-old boy who was wandering here and there. Plus, the other people engaged him in wrong activities which were not good for the future of the child. The CHILDLINE team visited the spot and met the child and brought him to the CHILDLINE centre.

During the counselling session, the child revealed that his mother had abandoned him and married another person when he was small and his father is always under the influence of alcohol. Therefore, he was staying with his aunty. He used to collect scraps and his earnings would go to his aunt, while in return, she used to provide him with food. The child further informed to the CHILDLINE team that he also used to sit in scrap shop and supply liquor bottle and in return, they would give him five to ten rupees. So, in this manner, the child collected Rs. 500 to 600 daily and he would give all that money to his aunt.

After getting all the information, the CHILDLINE team visited the aunty. However, she was reluctant to provide further information about the child and instead, started shouting and blaming the CHILDLINE team. The team shared this information to CWC, Child Protection Officer and District Programme Officer, The Ministry of Women

and Child Development. The DPO and WCD instructed the CHILDLINE team to conduct a revisit of the child and his concerned people to collect further details about the child. But no one was found there and the door was locked. The team again conducted a spot visit with the SJPU unit and finally found the child in Tiwari Bazar ground with the family members of the child. The team informed them that they would be arrested if they engaged their child in such activities. After this, the aunt and the father of the child agreed to appear before CWC along with necessary documents.

On 5th August, 2020, the father appeared before CWC and revealed that his wife left him when his child was 6 and as of now, he is living on the streets with his child. He also stated that he is ready to keep the child in a shelter home if the child continues his education from there. The CWC issued the order in this regard and shifted the child to a shelter home. The child is staying in a shelter home and attending school regularly and the team is following up on the progress of the child.

Child Labour

Tahir (name changed), a 12 year boy hereditarily belongs to a village in Uttar Pradesh and is staying with eight family members including his parents and siblings. His parents were not educated. Tahir's father was the only bread earner of the family; therefore, the child's elder sister was compelled to work as a domestic servant to support her father, however, it was very challenging for the child's father to manage the daily expenses of the house. Because of the poor financial condition of the family, it was difficult for the child's father to send all six children for formal education. Hence, Tahir was enrolled for Madrasa education in a local village, nearby his home. But Tahir didn't wish to study in Madrasa Education, and eventually left his studies. His father tried getting him to work in a shop, but shop owners thought that he would be small and not efficient.

Eventually, he found job of a domestic worker in a house where he worked for a year. Later, he was removed from work and accused of stealing. After coming back home, Tahir was happy to meet his family. His father was getting all expenses paid off when he was working, so he tried to get him work. At the second place of

domestic work, he was again blamed for stealing within a month and removed from there as well. Then, he was sent to Delhi with a woman where Tahir's sister worked at that woman's maternal house. In Delhi, the child was again blamed for stealing, but he never committed any such crime. Soon, a new incident happened. The owner of the house liked gardening, but someone had kept sugar crystals near her plants, which destroyed it.

The entire family blamed him for it and even the woman who had brought him joined in. Tahir was beaten up by one of the family members, so he planned to run away. Tahir's father called up at the place to enquire about his son's well-being, but he was always told that he is fine and happy. Finally, Tahir found an opportunity and ran away. He was wandering on the streets of Delhi, when a kind man met him and asked what happened. Later, that same man called CHILDLINE 1098, and informed them about the child. Soon, the team arrived and the child was ready to go with them. After receiving such good treatment from CHILDLINE team, he opened up about everything.

On the other hand, the team was making efforts to help the child trace his family. The police lodged a Firsthand Information Report against the child's employer. Through follow-up, the information was received that the CCI team could open the Bank Account in favour of the child. Tahir's employer deposited Rs. 50,000/- which was converted into fixed deposit as per the guidelines of the CWC so that no one would be misusing the amount.

By this time, the child's parents also came to meet and take the child back home. The presence of his parents gave immense pleasure to the child as he was eagerly waiting to go back with them to his native place. A healthy conversation occurred with the parents too by the team about Child Rights and Child Protection. Therefore, considering all the facts, CWC made the direction to restore the child to his parents. The rest of the compensation amount of Rs. 38,000/- was pending from the employer. The concerned authorities were directed to help the child to get his full compensation with immediate effect. At the time of going back with his parents, the child himself decided that instead of working in another shop, he will study. Then after growing up, he will open his shop and help his family.

15-year-old held for molesting class 8 student in Bisrakh

GREATER NOIDA: A 15-year-old youth was apprehended on Sunday for allegedly harassing a class 8 student in a village under Bisrakh police station area. Police registered a case against the suspect for molestation and the suspect for molestation and under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act.

Manoj Kumar Pathak, station house officer, Bisrakh police station, said that the girl and the suspect are neighbours. Their families had some issues. The girl has accused the suspect of

Police said the girl got scared allegedly by the repeated threats made by the suspect and stopped going to school. Pathak said a few days ago, the girl dialled child helpline number (1098) and narrated her ordeal.

Satya Prakash, senior manager, FXB Suraksha-Childline, said that a team heard the matter and informed the district child welfare committee (CWC) about it.

"The girl had stopped going to school due to harassment. With CWC's intervention, a case was registered against the suspect at Bisrakh police station," he said. The Childline team also coun-

Pathak said that a police team visited the house of the suspect and apprehended him.

"He will be produced before the child welfare committee and sent to juvenile home," the SP said.

In July 2018, a child was allegedly molested by lifeguard of a prominent school's swimming pool in Greater Noida. Parents of the girl and other students had protested against the school administration, leading to the suspect's arrest.

In September last year, a 24-year-old lift serviceman was arrested for allegedly trying to molest a 12-year-old girl in the

किशोरी 9 दिसंबर को घर से भागकर सांवेर के बस स्टैंड पहुंची थी। वहां से बस से वह इंदौर पहुंची और इंदौर-देवास जाने की बजाय रात में रतलाम आई थी। वह बस से उतरने की बजाय रोने लगी, कंडक्टर को शंका होने पर उसने पुलिस व चाइल्ड लाइन को सूचना दी। उस स्टेशन

रोड थाने ले जाया गया था। वहां से उसे चाइल्ड लाइन भेजा गया था। चाइल्ड लाइन पर टीम की सदस्यों ने 10 दिसंबर को काउंसलिंग की थी। इस दौरान उससे बताया था कि पिता उससे मारपीट कर प्रताड़ित करते हैं। 11 दिसंबर को फिर काउंसलिंग की तो उसने आपबीती बताई। उसके अनुसार पिता उससे गलत हरकत और दुष्कर्म करते रहते हैं। उसकी जिला महिला सशक्तिकरण अधिकारी ने काउंसलिंग की तो उसने वहां भी यही बात बताई। उसे वन स्टॉप सेंटर (सखी केंद्र) पर रखा गया। काउंसलिंग रिपोर्ट स्टेशन

रोड थाने पर भेजी गई और बाद में उसे भी थाने ले जाया गया। पुलिस ने किशोरी का मेडिकल भी कराया। पिता के खिलाफ शून्य पर भादवि की धारा 376 (2) एफ, 376 (2) एन, 376 (2) आई, 323, 506 और पोम्बो एक्ट की धारा 3/4 के तहत प्रकरण दर्ज किया है।

मां की हठे चुकी है मौत: किशोरी ने पुलिस को बताया कि वह तीन वर्ष की थी, तब उसकी मां का निधन हो गया। उसका बड़ा भाई भी है। वह पिता और भाई के साथ रह रही थी। छह वर्ष की आयु थी, तब से पिता गलत हरकत व दुष्कर्म कर रहे

हैं। विरोध करने पर मारते-पीटते हैं और जान से मारने की धमकी देते हैं। वह कक्षा नौवीं में पढ़ती है। उसने एक वर्ष पहले बड़े भाई को बताया था, तो वह उसे उसकी मौसी के घर छोड़ आए थे। वहां से पिता उसे वापस घर ले आए थे।

सगाई कर दी थी: किशोरी ने बताया कि उसके पिता ने इंदौर जिले के ही एक युवक से उसकी सगाई कर दी थी। वह 9 दिसंबर को फोन पर बात कर रही थी, तब पिता समझे कि वह उसकी किस्मों से शिकायत कर रही है और ब्रेक से उसकी पिटाई की थी। इससे वह घर से भाग निकली।

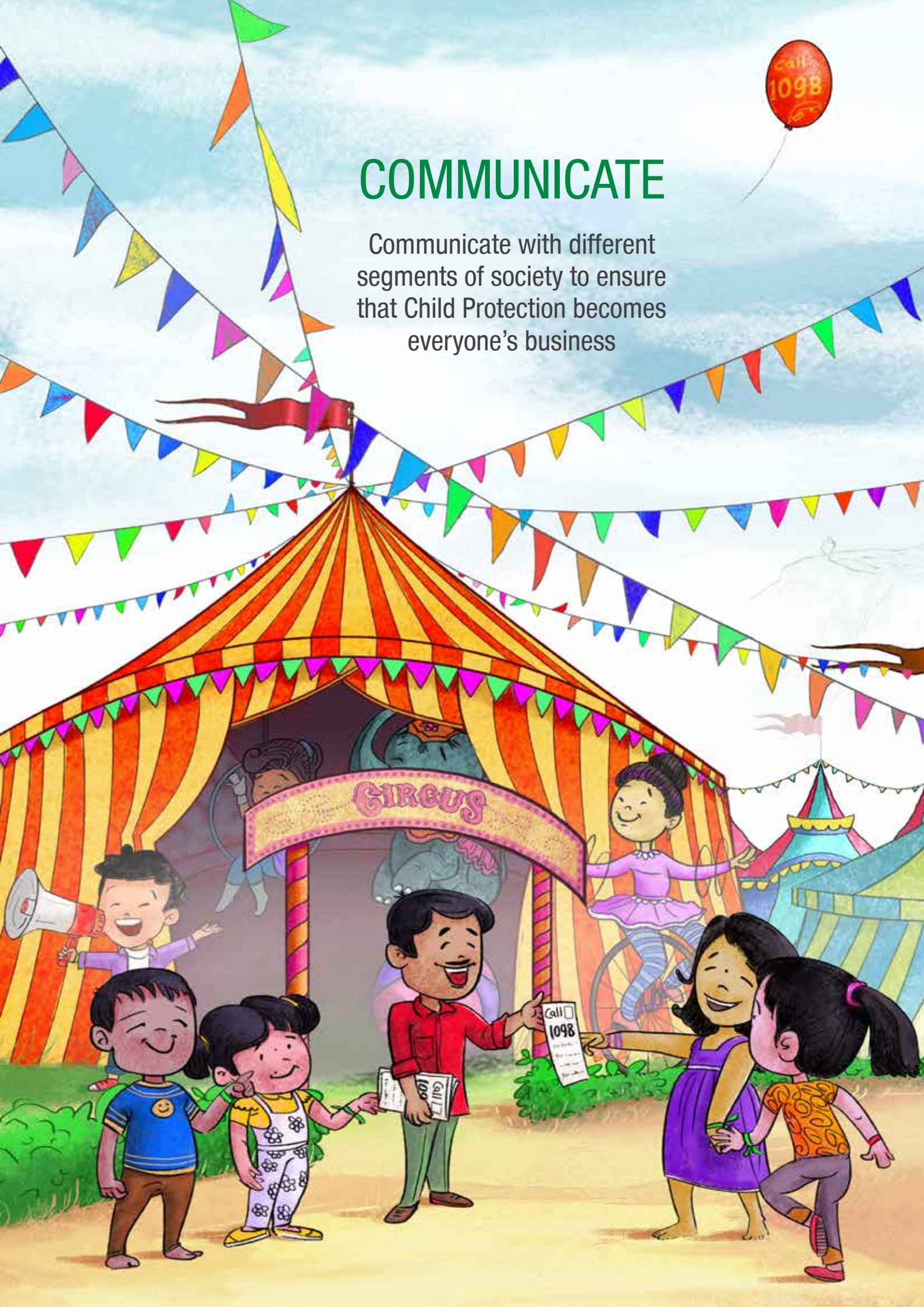

In India, due to the pandemic, 100s of people lost their lives and thousands are still infected with this deadly virus. As a result of the lockdown, many people lost their jobs resulting in no food to eat. These are the families of migrant workers and daily wagers. Families got stuck because of shutdown of public transportation. CHILDLINE has received 50 percent increase in calls during this period. The Deputy Superintendent of Police of Missing Cell, Gandhinagar had issued a circular in March 2020 to the Superintendent of Police (SP) and Commissioners of Police (CP) across Gujarat to provide necessary services to CHILDLINE 1098 to perform their duties effectively during lockdown period and provide support in taking children in Child Care Institution (CCI) or Child Welfare Committee (CWC). The circular also states that during this period, the Police and CHILDLINE with the support of the health department, need to provide emergency medical treatment to children and then present them before CWC. All the units at the district level have been asked to make arrangements to provide 24X7 support to CHILDLINE 1098. This circular has helped CHILDLINE to effectively respond to the needs of children and their families during lockdown.

CHILDLINE in the union territories received curfew passes. Teams are involved in providing information about COVID-19, counselling families including children, connecting communities to community kitchen, supplying food materials and preventing hygienic items (masks, hand wash and sanitizers) to children and

families. 2118 families with children were provided cooked meals or ration kits, hand sanitizers and masks. The Daman team had assisted the collector to make a list of migrant families going back to their home towns, so that they can stay safe.

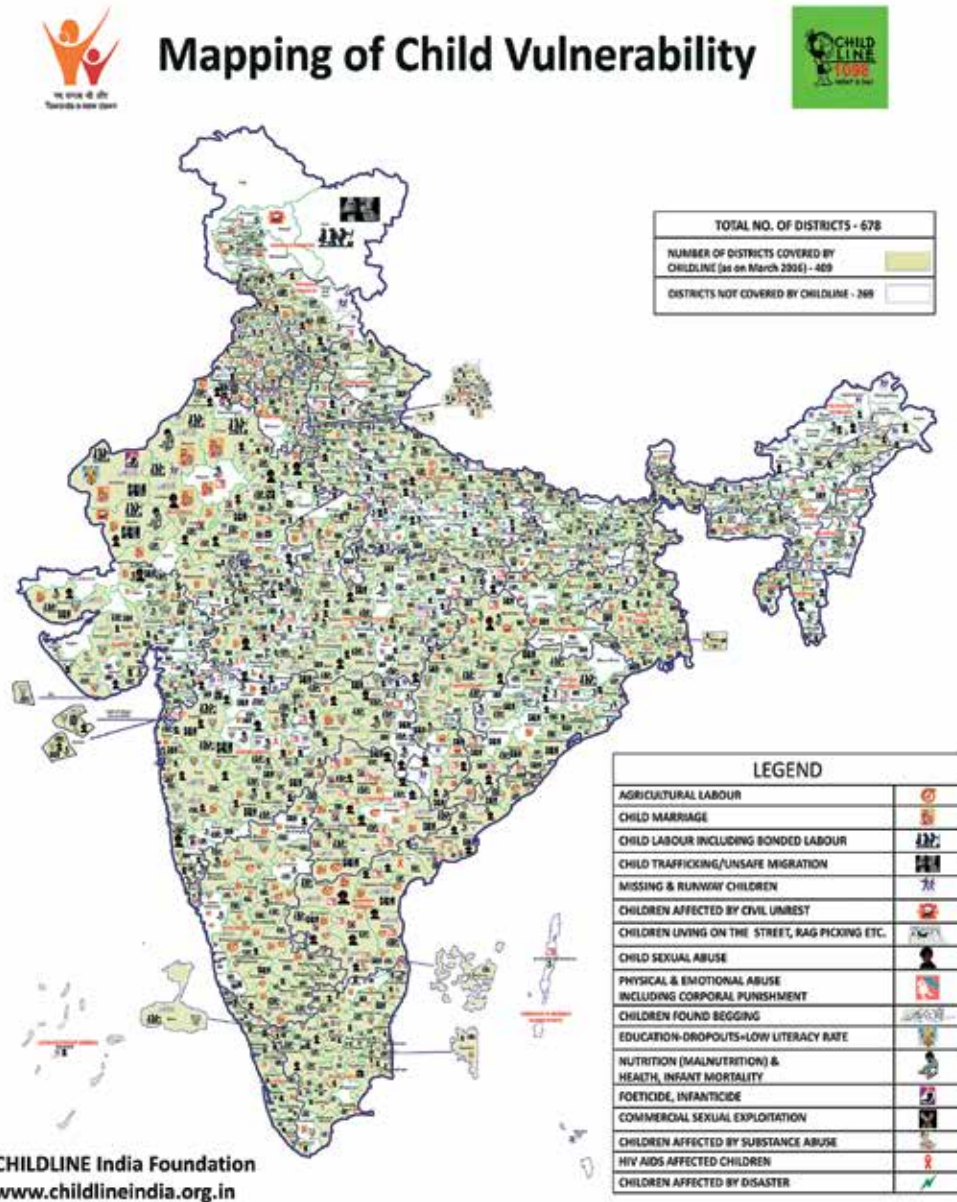
CHILD VULNERABILITY MAP

CHILDLINE India Foundation prepared the 'Child Vulnerability Map' - a district-wise map depicting problems faced by children across the country that was released by the Ministry of Women and Child Development on January 24, 2019 as a part of the National Plan of Action for Children.

The 'Child Vulnerability Map' covers 409 of total 678 districts in the country. It highlights vulnerabilities like Child Marriage, Child Trafficking, Missing and Runaway children, Child Labour, children affected by civil unrest,

Child Abuse, dropouts and low literacy rate, malnutrition, foeticide, and HIV affected children.

Odisha, West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand and Maharashtra have been highlighted on the map as Child Trafficking-prone states, while Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and Chhattisgarh as worst affected by malnutrition. North-eastern states including Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Nagaland and Mizoram have fared poorly in tackling Child malnutrition.



RESOURCE MOBILISATION

The Resource Mobilisation team mobilised over Rs 2 crores of funds in FY 2019-20, over and above the Government of India grant that CIF receives under the Child Protection Services Scheme (former Integrated Child Protection Scheme). In addition to the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India, other major donors/partners included UNICEF, Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives and Sattva.

The Resource Mobilisation also grew to become a 9-member team. Personnel were recruited for the institutional, corporate, events channels and grant writer. The Head - Communications and a Communications Specialist were also recruited. Roles under fundraising for which recruitment is still in progress include digital and HNI fundraising.

Through this partnership, CIF carried out a Training Needs Assessment to determine the gaps in knowledge and skills among CIF and CHILDLINE partner staff engaged in Child Protection, followed by a Training of Master Trainers (TOMT), to build a core team of Master Trainers (MTs) within CIF. CIF is in the process of finalising the training plan for Contact Centre Operators and CHILDLINE partners personnel to be rolled out in the next financial year, which UNICEF in principle has agreed to support.

b) Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives (APPI)

Which had pledged INR 30 crore over a period of 6 years (up to 2023) to support the Programme for Children in Contact with Railway Stations (PCCRS), issued a grant of INR 78.19 lakh this financial year. As a result, CIF was able to expand the programme to one more railway station, ie. Varanasi (Uttar Pradesh), taking the number of PCCRS stations to 7. Additionally, APPI had also pledged Rs 20.8 crore over a period of 5 years, to support CIF in its Organisational Development and for the expansion of the Resource Mobilisation team.

c) Sattva supported CIF in defining and rolling out its Organisational Development strategy over a 2-year partnership which ended in Feb 2020.

2) Corporate donors

SBI Caps released a pending grant of INR 24.71 lakh to CIF for the renovation of Child Care Institutions.

3) Events

CIF partnered with United Way to raise INR 14.07 lakh during the Tata Mumbai Marathon. A little over 50% of these funds were mobilised thanks to Sanofi India Ltd. which came on board as a corporate partner. 6 individual champions (who also participated in the event) supported CIF by creating campaign pages, through which INR 5.42 lakh was raised.

4) Digital

CIF raised INR 14.19 lakh through online donations from a total of 5,459 individual donors. The website was also remodelled to create provisions for allowing prospective donors to donate directly through the website, as well as create specific fundraising campaigns on the site. Of the total online donations, INR 4.8 lakh were channeled through the CIF website. Additionally, being cognisant of the looming COVID-19 crisis, in end-March, CIF also created a fundraising campaign on the website to mobilise funds to support its COVID-19 response.

5) School Programme:

CIF connected with 35,000 children across 104 schools in 9 cities and introduced them to Child Rights and CHILDLINE 1098 services. CIF also mobilised INR 21.39 lakh in donations through the school programme.

PROGRAMME FOR CHILDREN IN CONTACT WITH RAILWAY STATIONS

Supported by Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives (APPI)

In January 2016, Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives (APPI) expressed its desire to CHILDLINE India Foundation towards supporting the activities to strengthen the CHILDLINE activities. The scope of support ranged from prevention to long term rehabilitation services for the most vulnerable children and for the strengthening of CHILDLINE India Foundation. APPI committed for supporting the activities across 20 Railway Stations across India, out of which 7 have been already supported in a phased manner.

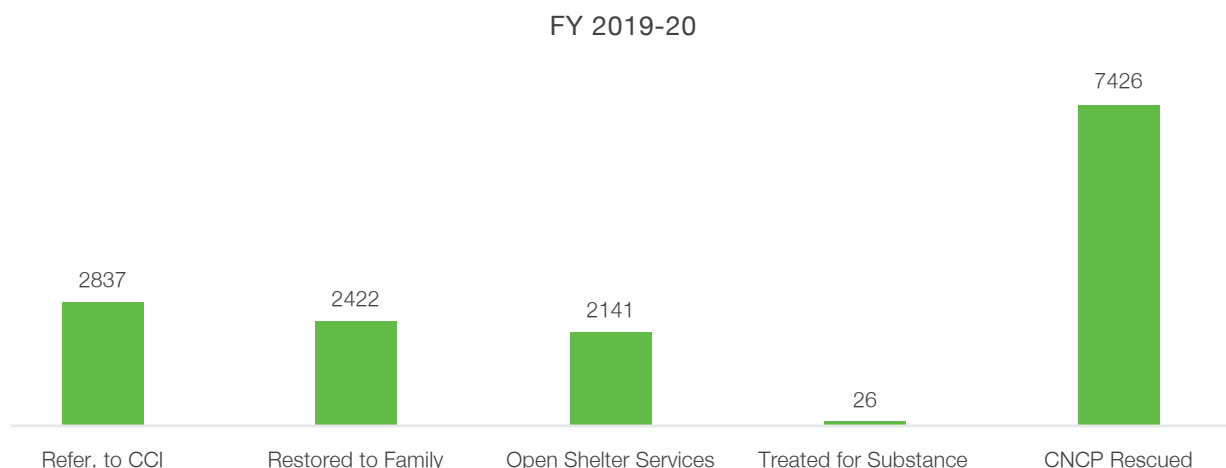
In 2017, the support was first extended to Howrah and Chennai Stations followed by 5 other stations including Old Delhi, Patna, Bengaluru, Varanasi and CSMT. Since inception of the programme, the team managed to reach and rescue 15,371 Children in need of Care and Protection, as of 30th April, 2020. Year-on-Year our initiatives and strategies have expanded our reach, for instance 2017-18 = 1621, 2018-2019 = 6324, 2019 – 2020 = 7426 (Cumulative up to March 31, 2020 = 15,371 children reached)

The following activities with 7 Station Level Partners, facilitated support in rescuing children with the stakeholders in 2019-2020:

- Sensitising and training RPF/GRPF officials
- Sensitising and training of railway commercial staff
- Conducting regular Child Help Group meetings with senior railway officials
- Creating awareness on Child Safety Net with commuters etc.
- Conducting Children Day Activities and other events

The programme specifically caters to children who need temporary shelter through its State of the art - Open Shelter Homes situated nearby the railway stations. Extending support for substance abuse and de-addiction services to children in need, and helping to foster social inclusion of children in society.

During the year 2019-2020, the PCCRS team managed to reach about 7426 children in need of care and protection. The following graph gives clear depiction of progress of the PCCRS in 2019-2020:



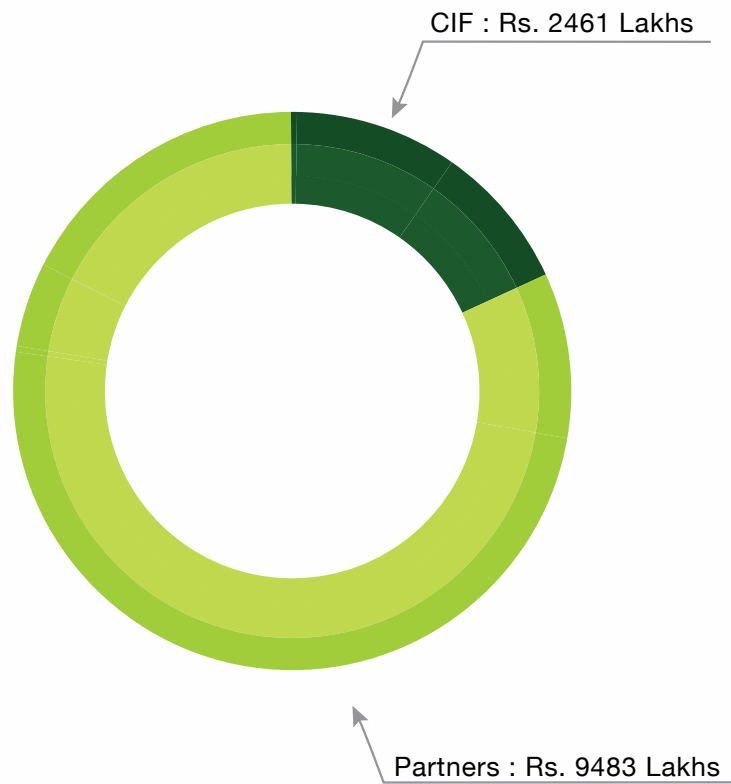

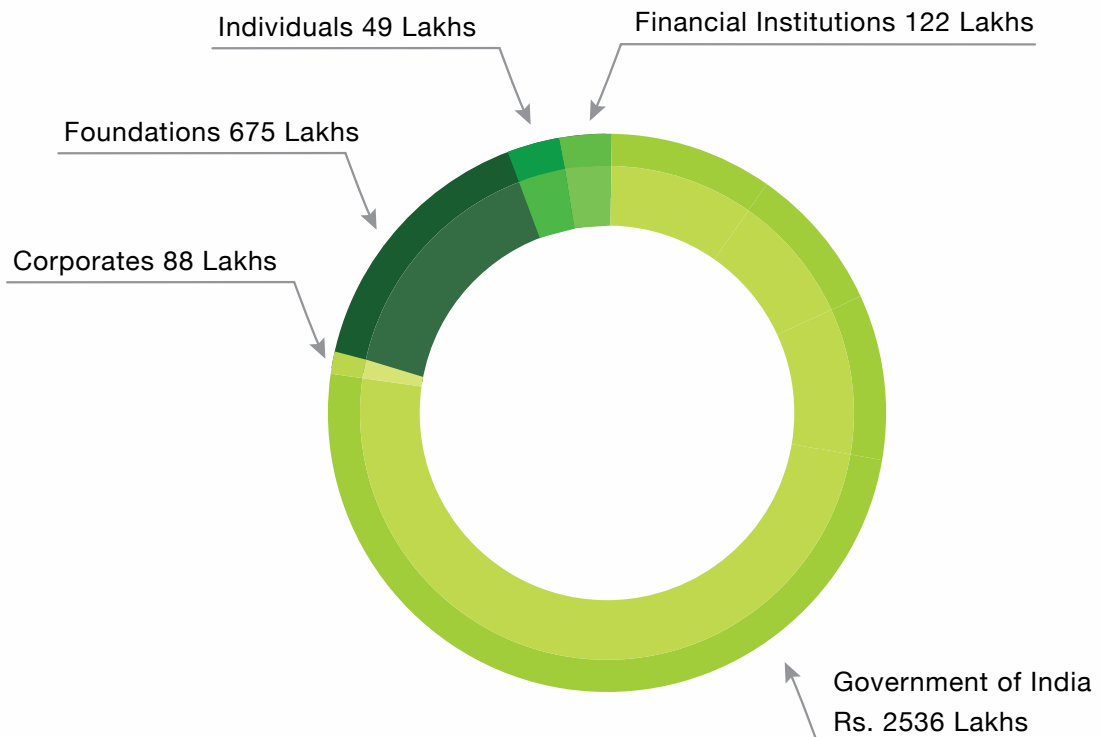
GOVERNMENT OF INDIA GRANT RECEIPTS

Total Government Funding : Rs. 11944 Lakhs



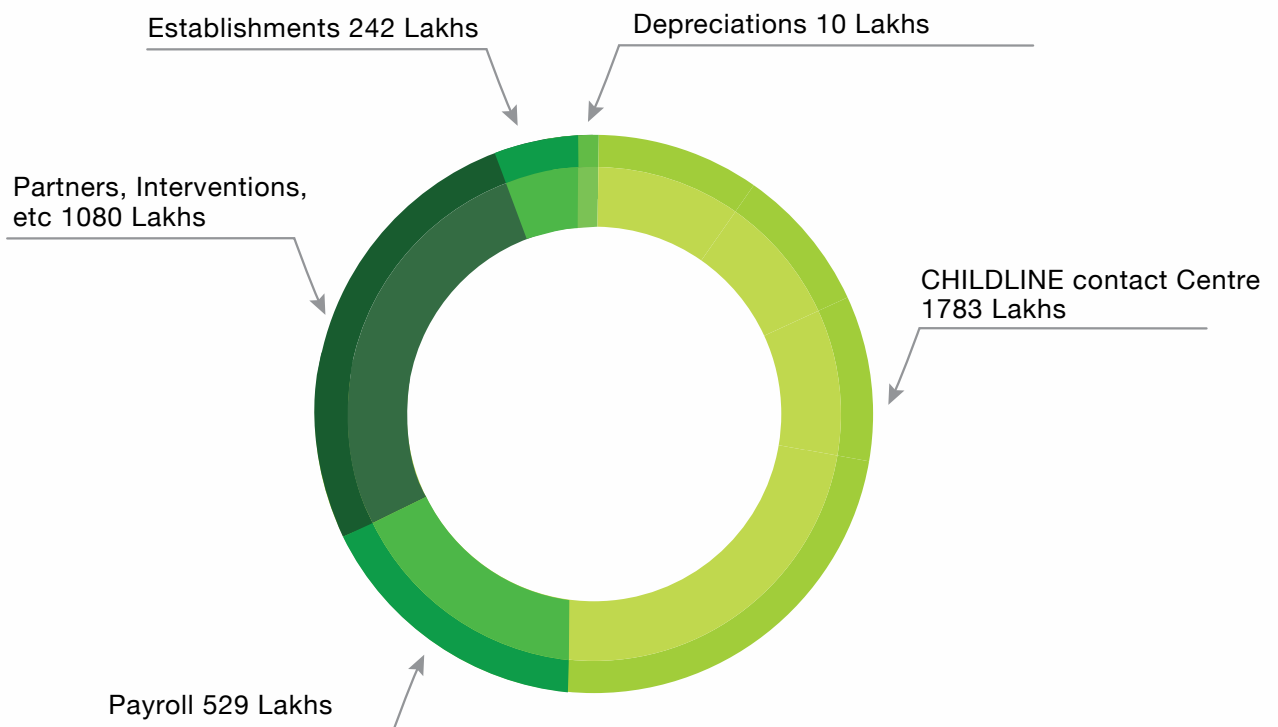
CIF INCOME ANALYSIS

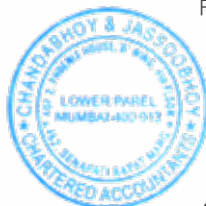

Significant Accounting Policies:

- a) The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India and the applicable Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.
- All Income and Expenditure items in the financial statement are recognised on accrual basis except of grant & donation.
- b) Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes all expenses relating to acquisition and installation of these assets. Fixed assets acquired out of the amounts received from donors towards specific projects are charged to the relevant project and accounted in the Fixed Assets schedule at a nominal value of Re.1 with a corresponding entry in sundry receipts of the same amount. Assets received free (as donations) are carried at nominal value.
- c) Depreciation is charged as per the method and rate as per the Income Tax Act, 1961. Depreciation on fixed assets has been charged to the Income and Expenditure Account.
- d) Assest purchased below Rupees Ten Thousand are expensed out during the year.
- e) Donations received for restricted revenue funds are taken to the 'Funds and Liabilities' in the Balance Sheet. Expenses incurred are disclosed under the head "Expenses on the Objects of the Trust" with an equivalent amount disclosed under the head "Transfer from Earmarked Funds" in the Income and Expenditure Account. Amount received towards purchase of Fixed Assets, are shown under 'Earmarked Funds' and expenditure incurred, if any, will be debited to such earmarked fund.

NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

- a) Block Grant received from the Government of India and recorded as liability at the time of receipt, is disbursed to Partner Organisations on the basis of signed agreements between Childline India Foundation and Partner Organisations.
- The liability is reduced by disbursements made/payable to Partner Organisations. The expenditures of Partner Organisations are certified by professional accountants. The Management of Childline India Foundation relies on these utilization certificates and other related documents.
- b) Fees payable to Charity Commissioner amounting to Rs.99,70,538/- for the years ended 31st March 2009 to 2020 has not been paid, as the authorities under instructions of the Bombay High Court are not collecting the fees.
- c) With effect from 1st August 2012, the Governing Board of the foundation has established a Staff Welfare Fund for the benefit of employees with an initial contribution of Rs.25 Lacs by transferring the said amount from the Income & Expenditure Account.
- Going forward, as per the decision of the governing board, 10% of the annual surplus would be transferred to the Staff Welfare Fund, subject to a maximum annual contribution of Rs.10 Lacs.
- d) During the year, foundation has complied with the provision of EPF and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 w.e.f 01.02.2020. As per the data provided, foundation has deposited PF contribution Rs.2,09,715 on behalf of employees (Employees contribution) till 31st January ,2020 though the same has not been deducted from the salary of respective employees. We were informed that, Foundation followed "take home structure" instead of CTC it will be difficult for staff to bear the entire employee PF at one go, it is decided by the management to recovere the same in next 2 years.
- e) Previous year figures are regrouped wherever necessary to conform to this year's classification.

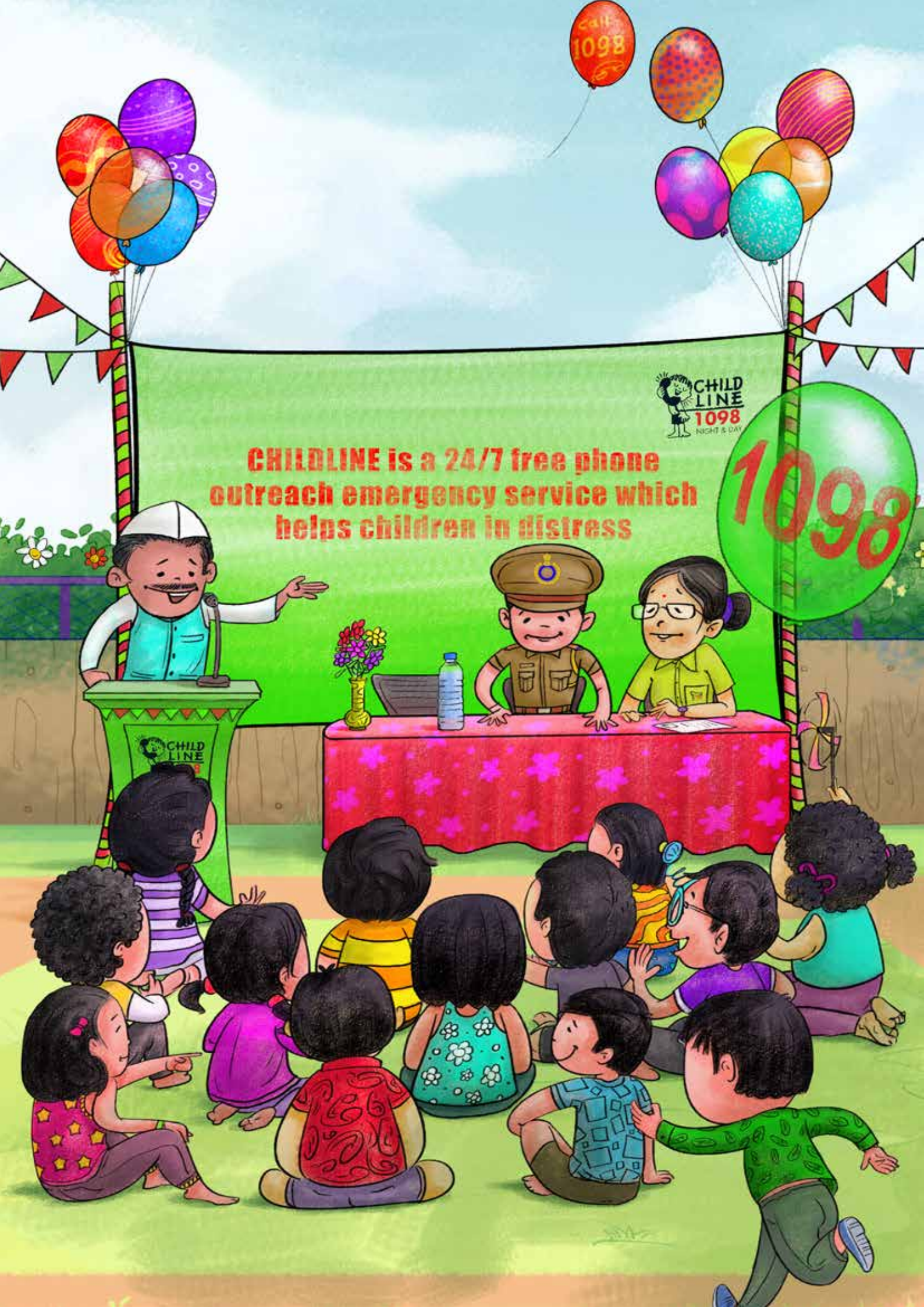
