CHILDLINE is India's first national level response to its ratification of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). The CHILDLINE 1098 service also receives a special mention in the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015.



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FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DESK

Dear All,

The COVID-19 pandemic brought about significant changes in every aspect of our lives. Throughout this challenging period, we are proud to report that CHILDLINE 1098 services were operational round-the-clock to ensure that every child in distress received care and protection. CHILDLINE 1098 answered over 50 lakh calls and provided emergency assistance to over 3.95 lakh children in the past year alone.

For CHILDLINE, the past year has been one of significant growth. By March 2021, CHILDLINE 1098's reach expanded to 598 districts, through a network of 1,074 intervention units (including Child Help Desks at 141 railway stations and 5 bus terminals), covering 81 per cent of the country in terms of district coverage.

The 2020-21 edition of our Annual Report provides a glimpse of the work done by CHILDLINE India Foundation in partnership with the CHILDLINE network over the past year - calls answered, our efforts towards engaging with children, communities and stakeholders, special events, stories from the ground of children who have been rescued or assisted, and various other initiatives undertaken by CHILDLINE in 2020-21. The report also carries a special highlight on our COVID-19 response, where we supported not only children, but also and also hundreds of thousands of others from vulnerable groups including as migrant workers and daily wage earners, who were affected by the pandemic and the lockdown. In addition to spreading awareness about child rights and child protection, a key focus in our outreach was also on educating communities on COVID-19 and safety measures. Additionally, given the challenges in interacting face-to-face especially when lockdown restrictions were in place, engaging with children, stakeholders and the general public through digital channels gained momentum, especially during CHILDLINE's flagship event, CHILDLINE Se Dosti.

We also built key partnerships with UNICEF, HCL Foundation, NIMHANS and others, and this has contributed greatly towards strengthening the CHILDLINE network and the larger child protection ecosystem, especially with respect to building capacities, knowledge and skills towards responding effectively to the needs of children.

We acknowledge the vital support received from the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development, the Ministry of Railways, RPF and GRP, State Governments, the Police and their staff in these difficult times. Our heartfelt gratitude goes to our network of partner organisations and other stakeholders in the child protection ecosystem including district administrations, statutory bodies, Child Welfare Committees, volunteers and others across the country. Their encouragement and cooperation have been indispensable to us. We would also like to thank Tata Consultancy Services, UNICEF, Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives, HCL Foundation, NASSCOM Foundation, Vodafone Foundation, Omidyar Network India, and British Asian India Foundation, Uber and all our other partners and donors for extending financial aid and/or in-kind support.

CHILDLINE INDIA FOUNDATION (CIF)

Child protection is a key concern in India as children, especially those belonging to the weaker sections of society, are vulnerable to different forms of exploitation and harassment. Child abuse, child trafficking, child labour, female foeticide & infanticide, child marriage, undernourishment are amongst the host of issues that affect children. This is especially in the case of children below the age of six, children living on the streets, children who are orphaned, children with physical or mental disabilities, children affected by HIV/AIDS or other long-term diseases, children displaced by conflict/civil unrest/natural disasters. CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF) is a non-profit organisation with a vision to create a child-friendly nation that guarantees the rights and protection of all children. It is the nodal agency of the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development, and acts as the parent organisation for setting up, managing and monitoring the CHILDLINE 1098 service across the country. CIF's responsibilities include monitoring of service delivery and finance, training, research and documentation, creating awareness, advocacy, as well as resource generation for the service.

CHILDLINE

The CHILDLINE 1098 service, developed and managed by CIF, is a 24x7, emergency, free phone outreach service linking children in need of care and protection to relevant organisations run by Government departments and civil society organisations for long-term care, protection and rehabilitation. Any child or adult calling on behalf of a child is assured of assistance from a trained team capacitated to reach the child within an hour of having received a call on 1098.

CHILDLINE is India's first national-level response to the ratification of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). Additionally, it also receives special mention in the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection) Act, 2015, where the Government has requested that CHILDLINE acts as a catalyst in bringing together State agencies and voluntary agencies at the local level to ensure implementation of the Act.

When the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD) came into being in 2006, it recognised CHILDLINE India Foundation as the Nodal Mother NGO for implementing the CHILDLINE model across all districts in India. In order to put in place a process framework for the implementation of Child Protection, CHILDLINE joined hands with The National Institute of Social Defence and developed a programme: 'National Initiative for Child Protection (NICP)'.

This subsequently became the framework for the MWCD-initiated Integrated Child Protection Scheme programme (ICPS), which funds the expansion of CHILDLINE services. As of March 2021, CHILDLINE has a pan-India presence, operating in 598 cities/districts across 35 states/UTs, and responds to over 50 lakhs calls a year.

OBJECTIVES

- To reach out to every child in need of care and protection by responding to emergencies on 1098 and by physically reaching out to them.
- To adapt and integrate telecommunication technology, linking all districts to the service of 1098, and making it available to all children in need of care and protection.
- To provide a platform of networking amongst organisations and to provide linkages to support systems that facilitates the rehabilitation of children.
- To work together with the Allied Systems (police, healthcare, juvenile justice, transport, legal, education, communication, media, political and the community) to create child friendly systems.
- To advocate services for children that are inaccessible, non-existent or inadequate.
- To create a body of NGOs and Government organisations working within the national framework and policy for children.
- To be a nodal child protection agency in the country, providing child protection services to children.
- To contribute and work towards strengthening and participating in a global movement that addresses issues related to child protection and ensures that children's voices are heard.

PROGRAMMES AND ACTIVITIES

- Responding to calls on the national toll-free number 1098 and facilitating rescue and emergency outreach services for children in need of care and protection.
- Coordinating rescue and other outreach services with the help of relevant local departments like police, administration, labour, health, railways and others.

- Ensuring proper documentation of all children rescued to facilitate their rehabilitation and restoration, where necessary.
- Producing children before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) to ensure care and protection.
- Supporting the CWC in the long-term rehabilitation of children, wherever required.
- Supporting a national network for the tracking of missing children.
- Providing data related to children rescued and rehabilitated for the compilation of a national comprehensive database of child protection.
- Creating awareness and ensuring access to the 1098 helpline number.
- Establishing linkages with other child protection services, the community and local bodies to meet the immediate needs of children rescued.

PARTNERSHIP MODEL

CIF believes that for CHILDLINE to be successful and effective in reaching out and responding to the needs of millions of children across India, it is crucial to function in a partnership framework, one which recognises that:

- A helpline cannot operate in isolation.
- All service partners share a reciprocal relationship.
- Partners have clear and definite roles which lead to a feeling of joint ownership towards the model.
- All partners share the vision, mission and the success of the model.

CHILDLINE, therefore, is a unique partnership between the Ministry of Women and Child Development, State Governments, Department of Telecommunications, voluntary agencies, academic institutes, the corporate sector, the community and children. It is the crucial link between children in distress and in emergency situations, and a well-connected network of services that are already in place and working towards the care and protection of children. It acts as the single point of contact that facilitates instant access to support, advice, active intervention, and often, even lend a sympathetic ear.

OPERATIONAL STRUCTURE

CHILDLINE Contact Centre (CCC)

CHILDLINE Contact Centre (CCC) is a 24-hour, voice response facility using contemporary BPS (Business Process Services) technology. There are 6 centralised call receiving centres across 5 locations (Mumbai, Delhi, Kolkata, Chennai and Bengaluru), and all CHILDLINE cities/districts are connected to it.

CHILDLINE Advisory Board/District Advisory Committee

The CHILDLINE Advisory Board or District Advisory Committee is the principal policy-making body of CHILDLINE. Headed by the District Magistrate and Collector at the city and district levels respectively, it comprises of Government officials, NGOs, corporates, concerned individuals, and reviews the performance of CHILDLINE, sets new directions, recommends strategies for smartening up the service, and opens up mainstream systems for training and advocacy.

Nodal Organisations

Nodal Organisations are usually academic institutes or NGOs which anchor and facilitate the city service structure. They coordinate between 1098 service providers and ensure that service glitches are ironed out. They are charged with the responsibility of networking with and training members of the local allied system, coordinating and calling the CAB meetings.

Collaborative Organisations

Collaborative Organisations or Collab Partners function as the intervention units for CHILDLINE. Once a CCC responds to a call received on 1098, if it is deemed that the case requires emergency intervention, the case is transferred to a Collab Partner, who then sends personnel to the location to carry out the required intervention. Collab Partners also undertake outreach and awareness building.

Support Organisations And Sub-Centres

Support Organisations and Sub-Centres are typically located in city suburbs or in rural areas, and supplement the work of Collab Partners. Cases from the Collab Partners are referred to the Support Organisations/Sub-Centres, for on-ground follow-up. These are usually organisations with substantial community outreach at the grassroots.

Resource Organisations

Resource Organisations provide specialised services such as counselling, shelter, legal advice, sponsorship, adoption, etc, and extend their services to children referred by CHILDLINE.

ABOUT CHILDLINE 1098

CHILDLINE 1098 is the national, 24-hour, toll-free, emergency helpline and crisis response service for children in need of care and protection. It works in public-private partnership with the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India, and is mandated as a critical 'care and rehabilitation service' in the Child Protection Services Scheme.

The CHILDLINE 1098 service is built on a model of partnership with children, the government, local grassroots organisations, corporates and the community at large, to ensure that child protection becomes everyone's mandate.



CHILDLINE Contact Centres

All calls to 1098 are routed to one of six CHILDLINE Contact Centres.

If a case requires emergency intervention, it is transferred to the CHILDLINE unit closest to the location of the child.

CHILDLINE CONTACT CENTRE (CCC)

The CHILDLINE 1098 service is a 24-hour toll-free, emergency, phone-outreach service for children in need of care and protection. The voice of every distressed child reaches us through the CHILDLINE Contact Centres (CCC). The CHILDLINE service needs to reach every corner of the country to ensure that every distressed child's cry for help can be heard and responded to. It is with this aim that contemporary technology and systems are used at the CCCs to which calls are directed. There are at present 6 call receiving centres across 5 locations (Mumbai, Delhi, Kolkata, Chennai and Bengaluru), and all CHILDLINE cities/districts are connected to it. The CCCs answer calls round-the-clock, at the National level, to ensure that every child who calls 1098, is provided help through partners at the local level. CCC is staffed by CIF staff and the technology/infrastructure is outsourced to TCS using cloud-based connectivity.

HOW CCC FUNCTIONS

Once a call is received at the CCC on 1098, it is answered by a trained CHILDLINE Contact Officer (CCO). If the call resolution can be completed on the phone, it becomes a CCC operation. However, for calls requiring Direct Intervention, the CCO lists the details and makes an outbound call to the Collab Partners (the CHILDLINE Interventions unit) in the city where the call has come from. Then the Collab partner takes over and indicates to the CCC an estimated time of intervention and post the intervention, reports the complete case details to the CCC. This enables the CCC to complete the case documentation. Sometimes, the caller speaks in a local dialect. In such cases, the CCC facilitates a conference call with the local Collab Partner.

EXPANSION MODEL

- Remote-located primary data centre in Mumbai and disaster backup secondary data centre in Chennai.
- Data centre to host CRM software server, call recording server, Genesys platform server, Data backup server.
- These are connected via MPLS (Multi Protocol Label Switching) Cloud to each CCC location.
- CCC locations at TCS facility in each city are linked to data centers via MPLS cloud-based connectivity.
- Vendors include : Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) for hosted solution model (data centers and MPLS connectivity)

and for CCC facility in each city and Talisma for CRM software.

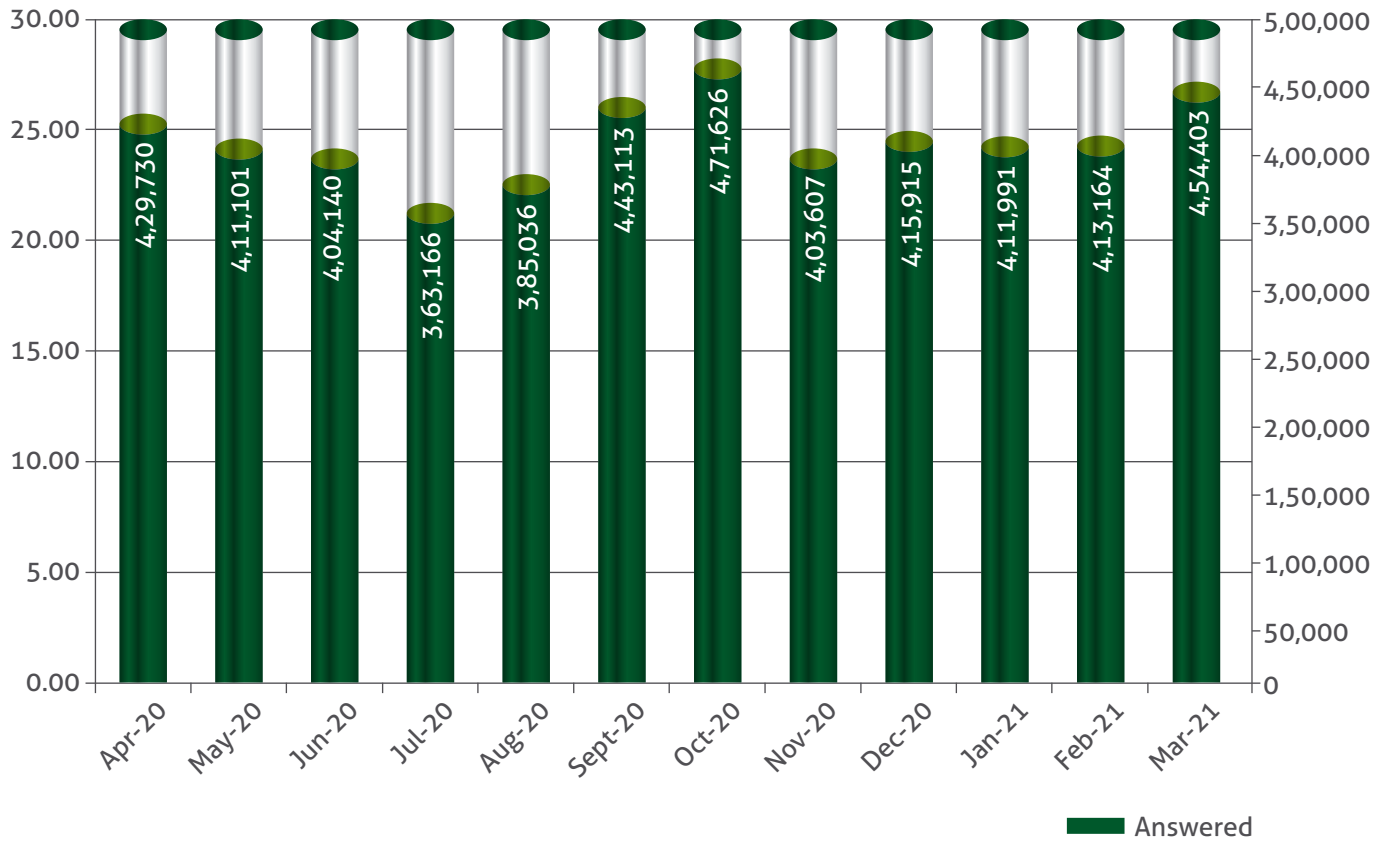

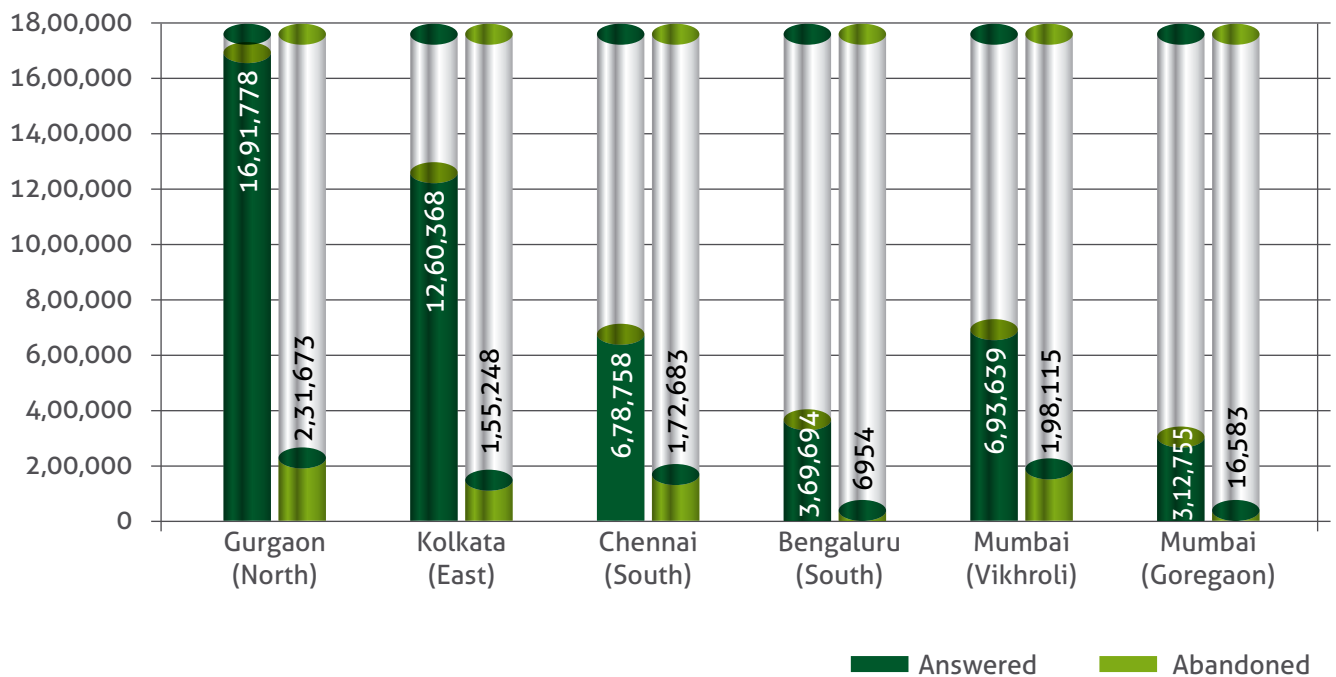

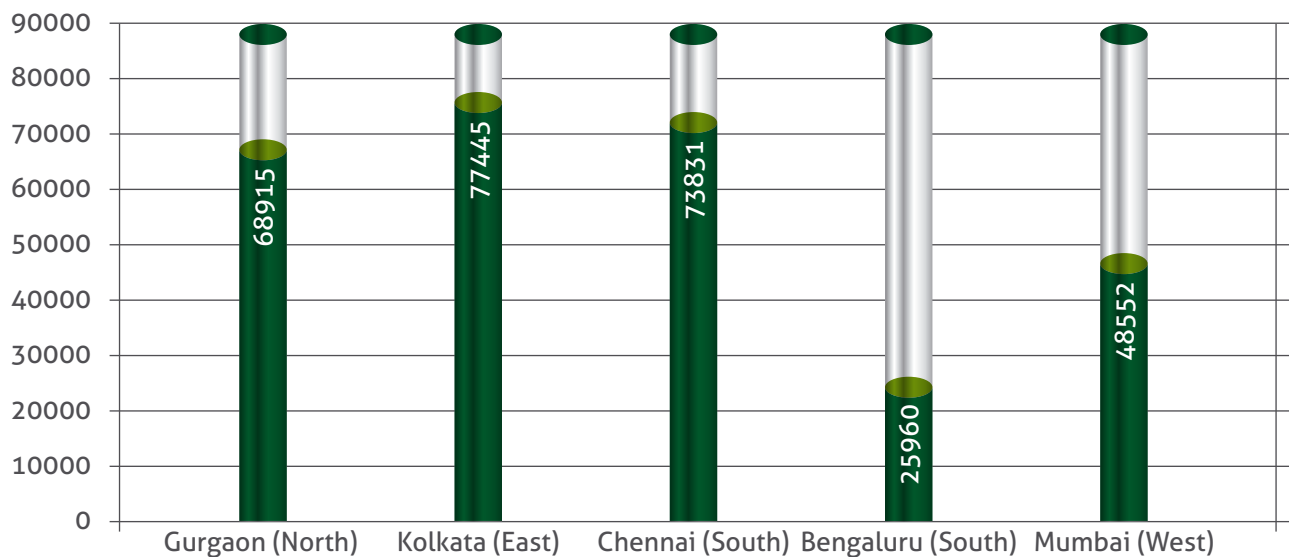

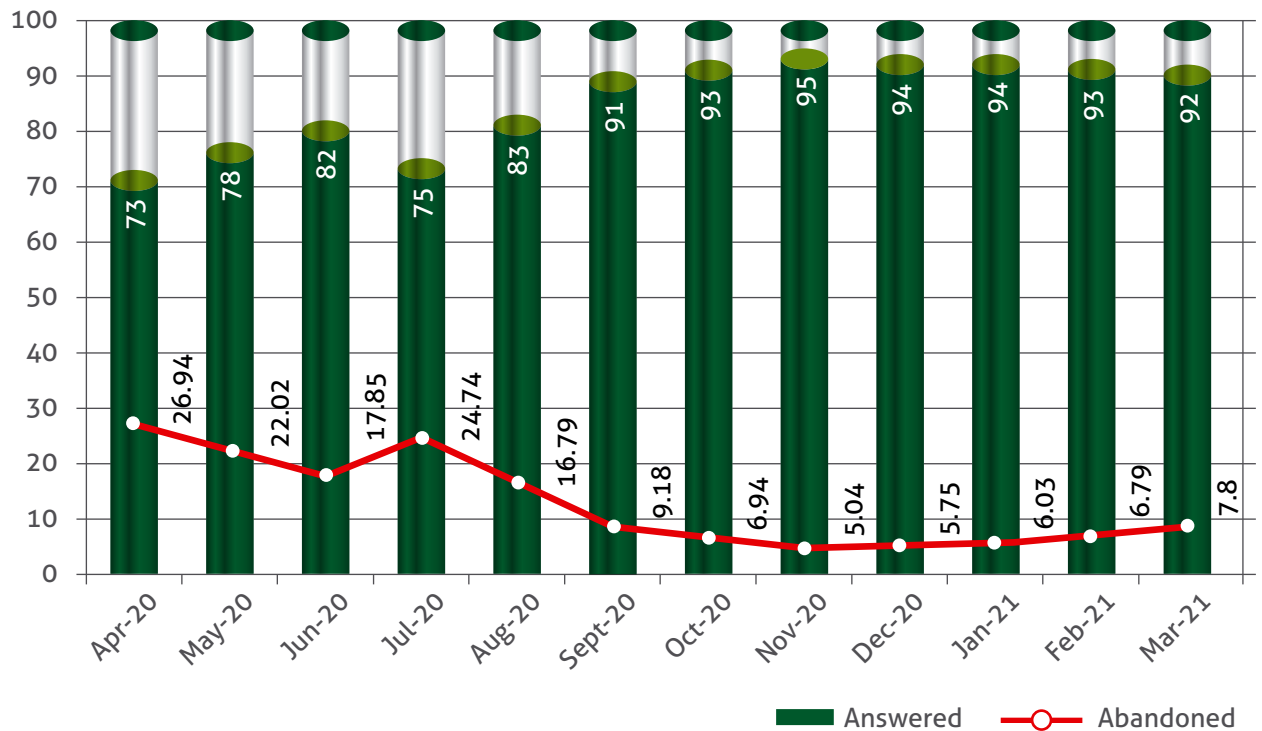
Graph of Answered calls & Abandoned Calls CCC site wise



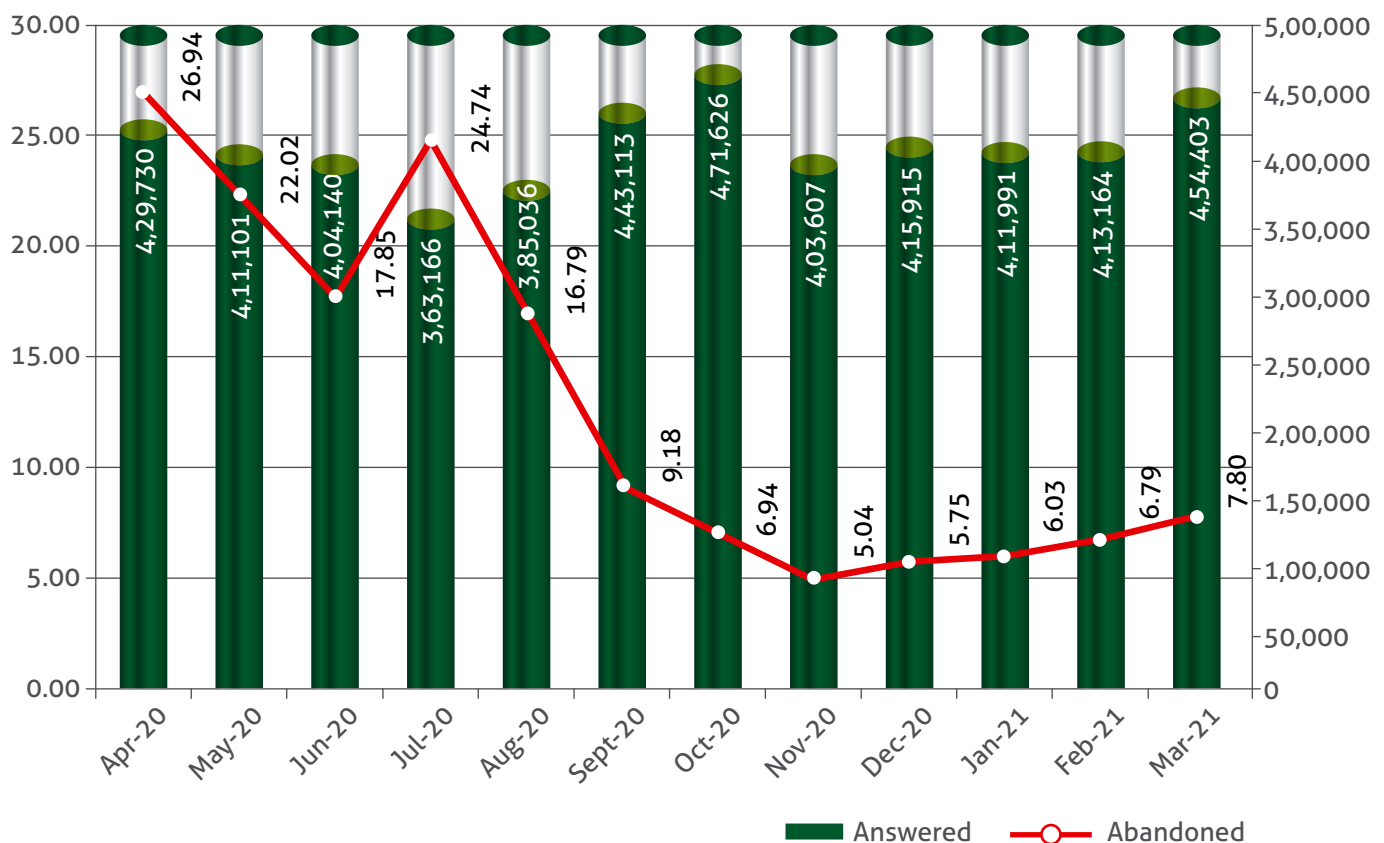
CCC Site wise Intervention cases

Answered v/s Abandoned Calls from April 1, 2020 to March 31, 2021

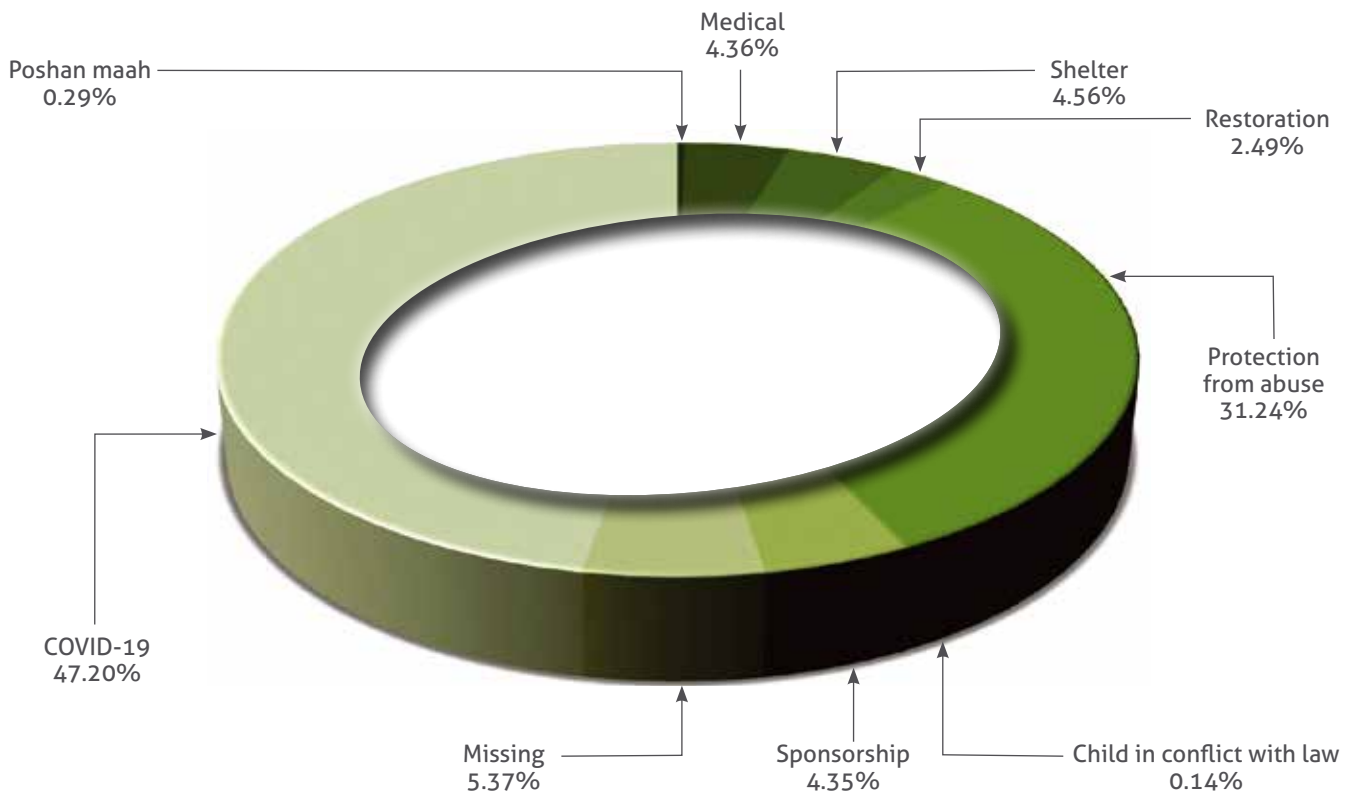


ANALYSIS OF CALLS

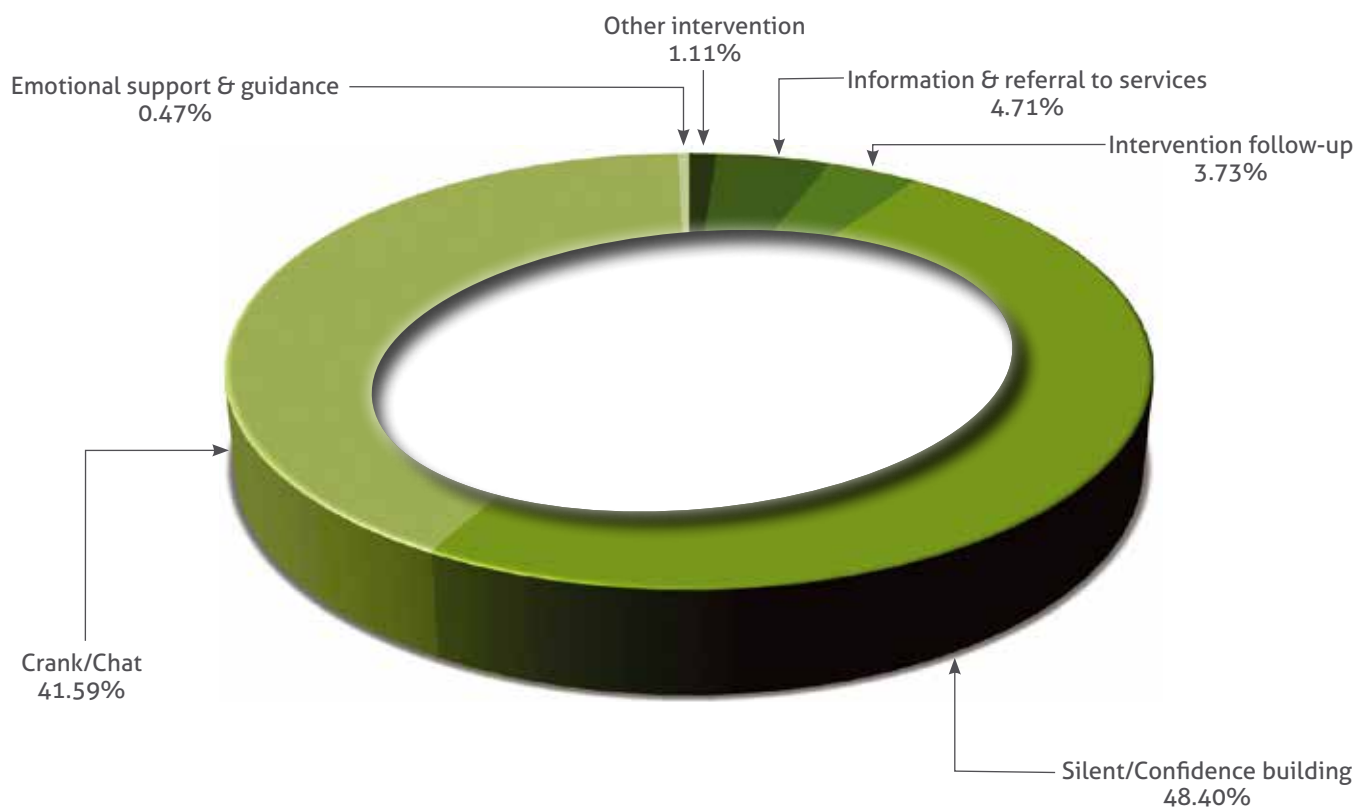

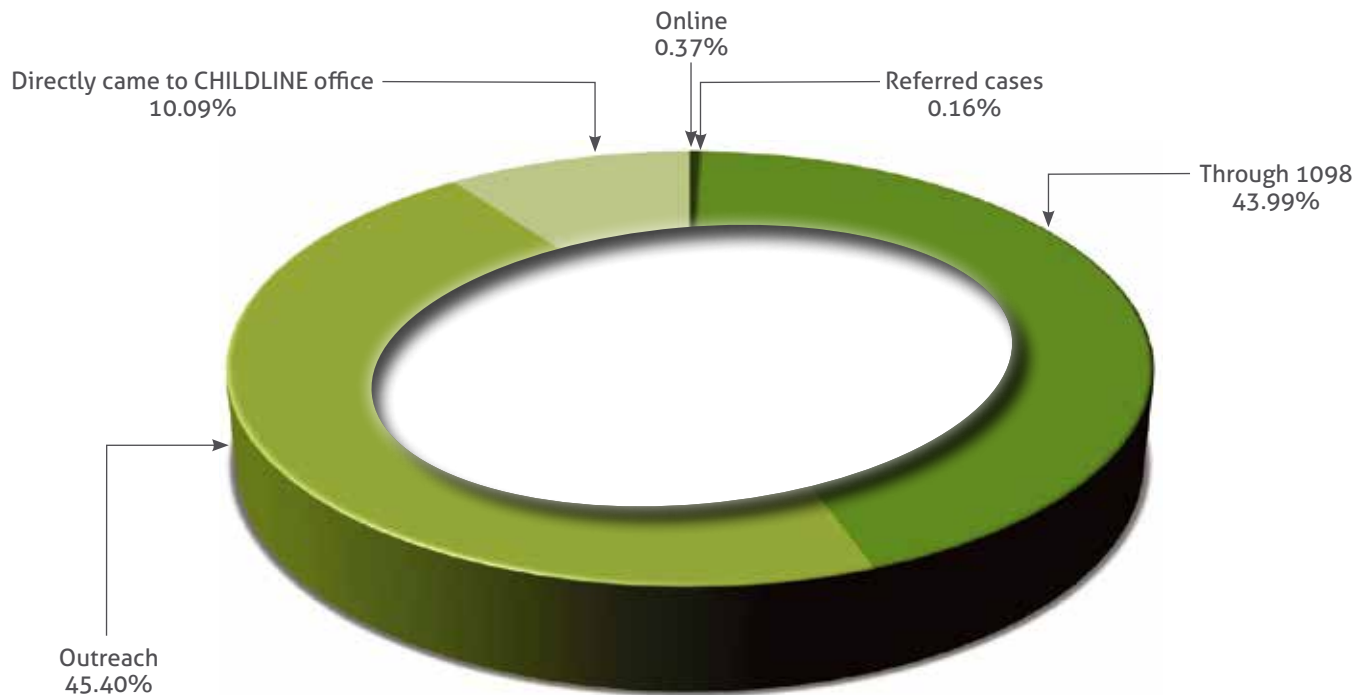
DIRECT INTERVENTION CALLS



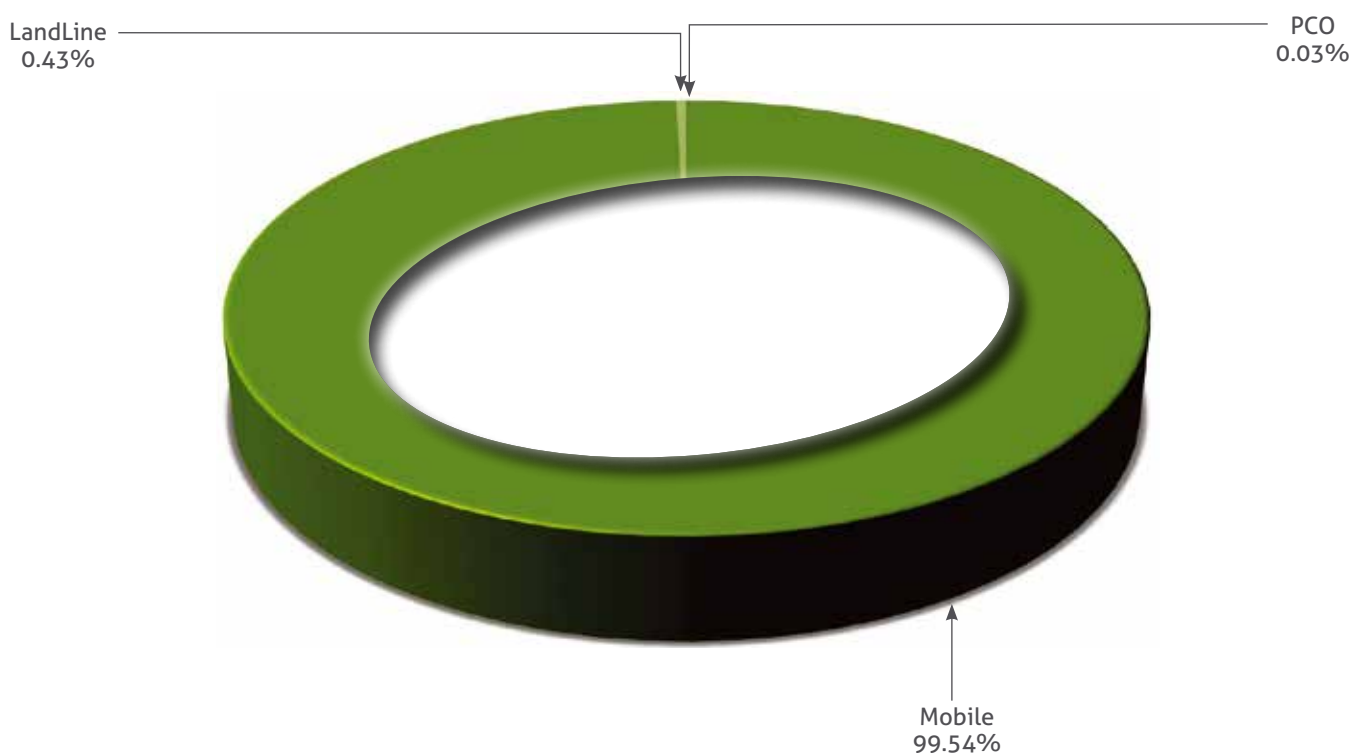
INDIRECT INTERVENTION CALLS



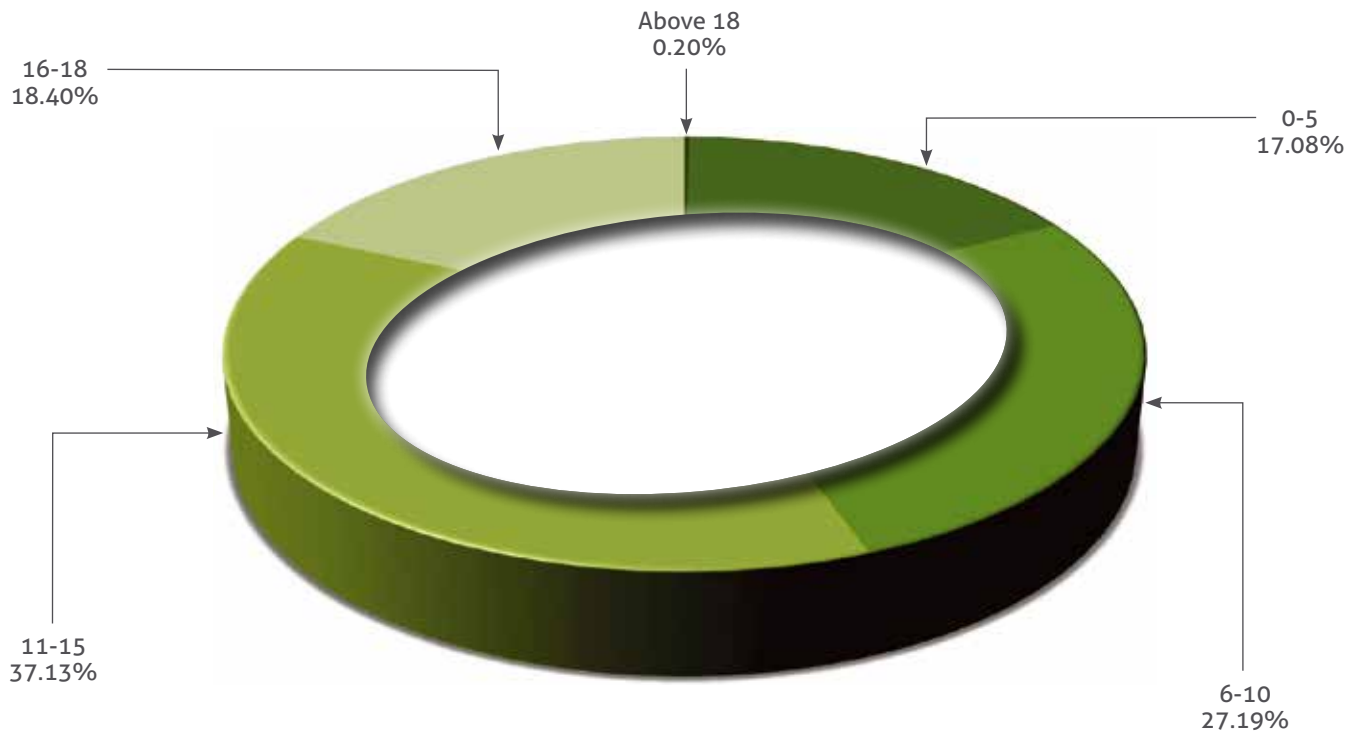
SOURCE OF CHILDLINE CASES



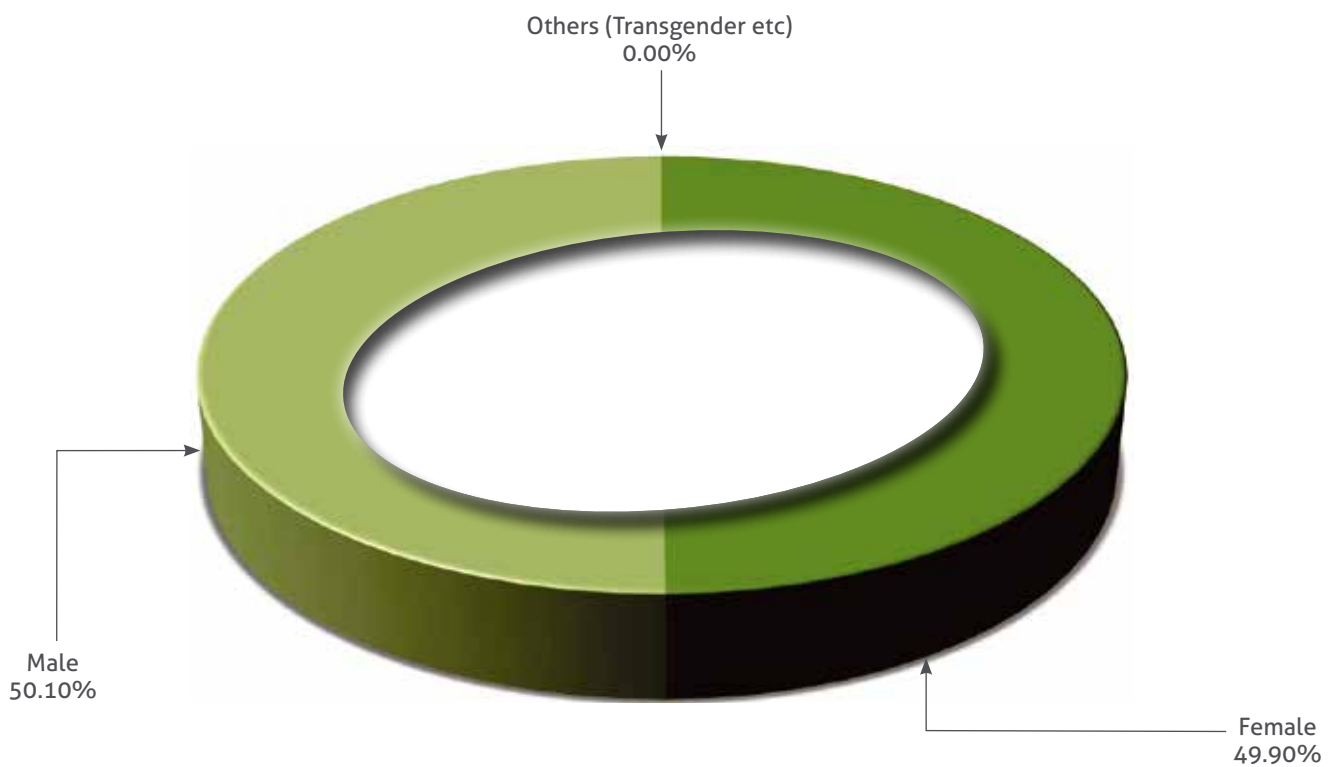
HOW CHILDREN CALLED CHILDLINE 1098?

CHILDLINE EMERGENCY SERVICES THROUGH CHILD HELP DESKS

India is home to largest population below the age of 18 years (39%) in the entire world. According to the conservative estimates, at least 40% children live in conditions that make them vulnerable to abuse and exploitation. A large segment of this population living in urban areas, have travelled from small towns and rural areas in search of livelihood, a means of existence, hope of a better life or to fulfil dreams of meeting film stars, they idolise. These children are often lost or run away from home or are brought to the railway stations or bus terminals by organised trafficking networks.

Railway Stations

The Indian Railway network is one of the largest networks in the world. It connects both urban and rural areas of the country and facilitates the movement of passengers and goods all around the year. It comprises of 1, 26,366 km of tracks over a route of 67,956 km and 7,325 stations. The network carried 10.5 billion passengers annually in 2020. (Source: Indian Railways Yearbook 2019- 2020)

In order to provide the vulnerable children with care and assistance, 'The Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for Railways to ensure Care and Protection for Children in Contact with Railways', was launched in March 2015 by the Ministry of Railways in collaboration with Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD) and the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), in accordance with the Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection) Act (2000). This SOP is currently being implemented at 141 railway stations (as of 31st March 2021) by CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF) and its collaborative NGO partners called 'Station-Level Partners (SLPs)'. The arm of CHILDLINE where partners operate Child Help Desks (CHDK) at railway stations, to deliver services to children in distress coming in contact with Indian Railways ecosystem, is referred to as Railway CHILDLINE.

The Child Help Desks provide immediate attention to children at railway stations who are found unaccompanied

by an adult or guardian, thereby addressing the issue of lost, runaway, missing, abandoned children as well as children in other difficult circumstances in a more systematic and institutionalized manner.

Since, Railway stations are typically overcrowded, frequented with mobile population with hordes of people on the move, there is also the possibility of children being accidentally separated from their parents on railway platforms and in trains. Well-equipped Child Help Desks can prevent abuse, restore children with their parents or link the child with statutory bodies and services. The railway CHILDLINE partners manning the Child Help Desks conduct daily outreach activities to spread awareness about CHILDLINE 1098 services and engage the stakeholders.

CHILDLINE services are provided to children who come in contact with the Railways, on the basis of calls received, cases reported to CHILDLINE 1098 or walk-in referrals by concerned adults. Assistance to children includes protection of children from exploitative situations, production before Child Welfare Committee and linkages to long rehabilitative services.

Bus Terminals

Recognizing that the buses are an important mode of transport and therefore key transit points for vulnerable children, CHILDLINE 1098 deems fit to establish Child Help Desks at bus terminals across the country. In 2020, the first Child Help Desk was inaugurated in Salem (Tamil Nadu). Subsequently, new Child Help Desks were established in Indore (Madhya Pradesh), Kathagodam (Uttarakhand), Lucknow (Uttar Pradesh) and Kolkata (West Bengal). While establishing the Child Help Desks at the bus terminals, strict compliance to the standard operating protocols and directions was maintained. CHILDLINE partners conducted several awareness workshops and sessions for the stakeholders in and around bus terminals to sensitize them about the child protection issues and importance of their role in rescuing children in distress.

CHILDLINE 1098 EMERGENCY RESPONSE

In India, CHILDLINE 1098 works with a phone outreach based intervention model where distress calls on 1098 are received round-the-clock. Any child or concerned adult calling 1098 helpline number is provided with emergency assistance. Based on the child's need he/she is referred to relevant organisation for crises intervention and long-term rehabilitation and follow-up. This includes a wide spectrum of options, ranging from rescuing a victim of abuse and offering SOS support to filing a case with the local police, taking up the matter with the concerned Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and then steering the case according to the subsequent steps as directed by them. The CHILDLINE operational module involves working closely with allied systems such as the Police, Municipality, Healthcare, Education and Transport Institutions along with the Judiciary, Child Care NGO's, Corporates Local, State and Central Governments.

Every case received by CHILDLINE 1098 is unique. Some are resolved within a day others may require follow up for months. CHILDLINE received a number of calls from worried parents, sensitive adults, the community, well-wishers and the distraught children of India. The below-mentioned interventions/cases are a mere drop in the ocean of the work done by the CHILDLINE team.

**The identities of children have been kept confidential in accordance with the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection) Act 2015.*

CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE

1) CHILDLINE rescues and rehabilitates a specially abled child abuse survivor

Rima, age 17, was living with her parents in Anantnag, Jammu & Kashmir. She would visit one of her relative's houses to help them with their household chores. At the relative's house, Rima was repeatedly sexually abused by an adult on the false pretext of marriage which resulted in pregnancy. Rima was traumatized and unable to express her ordeal as she was speech impaired. However, she managed to inform her parents who registered a complaint at a nearby police station and informed CHILDLINE 1098 simultaneously. CHILDLINE Anantnag rushed to the location and took cognizance of the matter. They also visited the police station and ensured that FIR was lodged and acted upon. Medical tests were performed on Rima and the reports revealed that she was eight and half months pregnant. Meanwhile, the accused was arrested by the police. Since Rima was speech impaired, a special sign language interpreter was appointed while recording her statement. The Child Welfare Committee (CWC) was informed about the case and all the relevant documents were presented before the committee. An undertaking document which mentioned that they will take care of Rima was submitted by her parents till the delivery of the child. Eventually, Rima delivered the baby which was put up for adoption. Rima was produced before CWC for the further due diligence process and counselled by CHILDLINE.

2) Rescuing two young girls who were being sexually assaulted by their father

Diane and Rosie, aged 13 years and 12 years respectively were being sexually assaulted by their father. On receiving the information, CHILDLINE Churachandpur, Manipur immediately headed to their residence and met the girls. The counsellor comforted them and once they were ready, took their statement. The girls stated that their father have been sexually assaulting them for the last three years and had even threatened to kill them if they disclosed the abuse to their mother or anyone else. After taking the children's statement, they were produced before the CWC and placed in a CCI for their safety. The team also lodged an FIR under the POCSO Act, 2012, after which the father was arrested.

3) Cyber Police and CHILDLINE work together to fight child abuse

A 26-year-old man was caught by the Cyber Police as part of Operation P-Hunt, a covert surveillance operation to prevent child pornography. Many photos of children were recovered from his phone, and it also came to light that he was sexually abusing his niece, a young girl of nine years. The police approached CHILDLINE Trivandrum, Kerala and requested support in counselling the child, as she was scared to talk to the police. When CHILDLINE counselled the child, she shared that her uncle used to harass her

when her mother and sister were not at home. He would also accompany her on the pretext of visiting the dentist and abuse her there as well. He also went on to blackmail the child, stating that he would get caught by the police if she revealed what was happening. CHILDLINE also provided emotional support and guidance to the child and prepared her for the case proceedings. The police also expressed their gratitude to the team for their child-friendly approach and professionalism.

CHILD MARRIAGE

1) One more child marriage stopped

Sneha, age 17, was living with her parents in Ambala district, Haryana. Since she had dropped out of school, her father had been forcing her to marry. A concerned adult noticed this issue and called CHILDLINE 1098 requesting immediate intervention as she was getting married on the same day. Upon receiving complete details from the caller, CHILDLINE Ambala informed the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and Child Marriage Prohibition Officer. After confirming the location of the marriage, CHILDLINE coordinated with the local police who reached the location and stopped the marriage. Sneha was counselled and rehabilitated by the CHILDLINE team after the completion of the due diligence process.

2) A 16-year-old's child marriage prevented and dreams of pursuing education restored

Seetha, age 16 was living with her parents and siblings on the border area of Palakkad district in Kerala. She was a student of Higher Secondary School in Tamil Nadu. Her family was from an economically poor background. Under the pretext of easing their economic burden, her parents had decided to get her married to one of their relatives. A concerned adult learned about this and called CHILDLINE on 1098. The CHILDLINE team cross verified the information and found the case to be genuine. They reached Seetha's house and informed the parents about consequences of child marriage and laws and legislations to prevent the same. The parents understood their mistake and assured that they will not force their child to marry unless she turns 18 years old. The case was also reported to the Child Development Project Officer (CDPO), Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and District Child Protection Unit (DCPU). While following up on the case, CHILDLINE found that Seetha was living happily with her parents and pursuing her dream of higher education.

3) Marriage of a 16-year-old COVID-19 positive child prevented

CHILDLINE Shivamogga, Karnataka received information from an ASHA worker about a 16-year-old girl whose

parents were trying to get her married after they found out that she was pregnant. CHILDLINE coordinated with the police, PDO, CDPO, ASHA workers and visited the child's home. On enquiring, it was found that she had been in a physical relationship with a 25-year-old man, following which the man's family and hers had agreed to get them married. Her parents were counselled and informed that the child required both emotional and appropriate medical support, following which she was put through a medical examination, which also included a COVID-19 test which reported negative. The CWC ordered that the girl be placed in a CCI. However, during a subsequent medical examination, she tested positive for COVID-19, which caused some panic among the people who had come in contact with the child, including the child's family, police personnel, CHILDLINE personnel, ASHA workers, DCPU staff, etc. While they have all tested negative for COVID-19 at the first level, they have been placed under home quarantine for 14 days. Additionally, 30 children who were also in the CCI that the girl was placed in have also been quarantined.

EMOTIONAL SUPPORT AND GUIDANCE

1) CHILDLINE counsels a 14-year-old and prevented her from an illicit relationship

Richa Kumari, age 14, was living with her parents in Ambala district, Haryana. She was studying in 9th class in a local girl's school. An adult boy from their neighbourhood had given her a mobile phone, on the pretext of friendship. When her father learnt about this was extremely upset as Richa was talking to the boy regularly. A concerned adult from the neighbourhood learnt about this and informed CHILDLINE 1098 requesting them to visit Richa at her home and counsel her. On the same day, the CHILDLINE team coordinated with the caller to know more about the case. Then, the team filed a case against the boy at the local police station. Then, the CHILDLINE Counsellor and other team members went to Richa's house and talked to her father who also requested CHILDLINE to provide Emotional Support and Guidance to Richa. During the counselling session, Richa mentioned that the boy gave the phone to one of her friends who gave it to her. Richa tried to give the phone back to the boy but he refused to take it. Then, Richa assured that she would give the phone back to the boy within a day's time and also apologized to the father. Richa's father thanked the CHILDLINE team for their help.

2) CHILDLINE provides Emotional Support and Guidance to a 14-year-old traumatized child

Suyash, age 14, was living with his mother in the Ambala district of Haryana. He was a student of class nine at a local school. Due to his father's demise, he was deeply traumatized. Suyash had stopped talking to people or going

out with friends. His mother was extremely worried about his mental health. She called CHILDLINE 1098 requesting help to counsel the child and help him understand that death was a part of life. During the counselling session, the CHILDLINE counsellor realized that Suyash is suffering from severe trauma and needed professional help. CHILDLINE team referred the case to the social counsellor for therapy. Suyash's mother thanked CHILDLINE for the timely help.

MEDICAL AID

1) CHILDLINE's emergency intervention provides respite to a physically disabled child

Rishab was living with his parents in Anantnag, Jammu and Kashmir. He suffered from physical disability and required continuous medication. His father was a daily wage earner and lived from hand to mouth. They were facing a lot of economic hardships. During the lockdown, they were unable to buy medicines for Rishab. Therefore, they called CHILDLINE on 1098 for assistance. The CHILDLINE team verified the case and asked Rishab's parents to provide the medical prescription. Further, they visited his home to collect more documents. Once the required medicines were arranged, they were administered to Rishab. The parents were happy and thanked the CHILDLINE team for timely intervention and arranging medicines.

2) CHILDLINE aid brings relief to one-and-half year old's family

Risha, age one-and-half, was living with her siblings and parents in Idukki district, Kerala. Her father was an auto-rickshaw driver and her mother was a homemaker. Risha and her parents were suffering from chronic illnesses. She was suffering from Psoriasis while her mother had breast cancer and her father too had contracted an unknown illness. They tried several medical treatments in Idukki, Kerala, but there was no improvement in Risha's health. Therefore, her parents desired to pursue Risha's treatment in Tamil Nadu. The parents sold off their properties, auto-rickshaw and other valuables to go to Tamil Nadu for treatment. However, due to the lockdown in the wake of the pandemic, the family came back to Idukki and was living on rent in the outskirts of the city. Unable to meet expenses, Risha's mother called CHILDLINE on 1098 for help. The CHILDLINE team visited their location to know more about their situation. Then, the team provided medical and nutrition support to Risha and her family and linked them with the Government sponsorship schemes.

RESTORATION

1) Child Labour survivor restored to his native place

Child Welfare Committee (CWC) Pulwama, Jammu & Kashmir had rescued a child engaged in child labour at a dairy farm and placed him in a Child Care Institution in Pulwama. The child had to be restored to his native place in the Reasi district of Jammu and Kashmir. CHILDLINE Anantnag received information from CWC Pulwama regarding the same. A COVID-19 test was performed on the child, CHILDLINE team members and other individuals involved in the restoration process and all of them had tested negative. All the necessary arrangements were in place to restore the child to its native place. The CWC Pulwama handed over the child to the CHILDLINE Anantnag as per the Standard Operating Protocols. The CHILDLINE team was all set and started their journey to restore the child. They faced a lot of hurdles en-route to Reasi but they left no stone unturned to ensure that everybody reached Reasi safely. The team completed their journey and the concerned Tehsildar arranged for the stay of the team along with the child. The next day, the child was handed over to CWC Reasi after completing all the required formalities. The child was sent to the quarantine centre as per the COVID-19 protocols. CWC thanked CHILDLINE Anantnag for their dedication and tireless work and making the restoration of the child a great reality.

LOST/MISSING/RUNAWAY CHILD

1) Railway CHILDLINE rescues 8-year-old missing child and restores with his parents

Zeeshan, age eight years, was living with his parents in Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh. His parents worked as labourers in the city. One day, after his parents had gone for work, he was playing with his friend at a park nearby his house. A stranger approached them and took them to the nearby railway station under the pretext of going for a walk. He took them onboard train to Mumbai. Upon reaching Itarsi station, the boys jumped off the train. The RPF staff rescued the children and brought them to the Child Help Desk. Both the children were given refreshments and counselled. Meanwhile, the RCL team member contacted the families of the children who were presented before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC). The children were placed safely in the shelter home, till their parents arrived. The next day, the families arrived and as per the order of the CWC, the children were handed over to their respective families, after the completion of the due diligence process. Both the families were extremely happy to take their children home safe and happy. Currently, the children are safe with their families.

2) A 4-year-old missing child rehabilitated

Shahbaz, age four, was living with his father and stepmother in the Mewat district of Haryana. His stepmother would beat him up regularly and even attempted to kill him. Shahbaz fraternal uncle learnt about the stepmother's cruelty, he immediately rescued the child and took him to his home. Meanwhile, Shahbaz parents called CHILDLINE on 1098 to report a missing child's case. The team asked the parents to file an FIR at the local police station but they were reluctant. When the CHILDLINE team reached the fraternal uncle's house, they found out the true story. The team asked the fraternal uncle to produce the child before CWC along with his real mother. The CWC asked CHILDLINE to counsel Shahbaz. During the counselling session, the child revealed his stepmother's cruelty towards him. Taking Shahbaz's safety into consideration, CWC handed Shahbaz's custody to his uncle.

3) CHILDLINE staff quarantined after assisting a runaway child

In July 2020, a cleaning supervisor at the Bikaner railway station found a young boy who had boarded the Howrah-Bikaner Special Express by himself, and brought it to the attention of CHILDLINE Bikaner, Rajasthan. During counselling, the child disclosed he was 10 years old, and that he lived near the Agra Fort railway station. He also had medical examination, where he was tested for COVID-19. The child was shifted to a juvenile home where he was to be quarantined as a precaution, on the orders of the CWC. All parties involved in the child's rescue were also asked to quarantine themselves. When the test results came out, it was found that the child was COVID-19 positive, following which he was shifted to PBM hospital for treatment. Team members were asked to stay in 14 days, and also take the COVID-19 test. Fortunately, all their test reports were negative. Meanwhile, CHILDLINE Agra, Uttar Pradesh assisted in tracing the child's parents. Once the child tested negative for COVID-19 in a subsequent test, the CWC ordered that he be escorted home by a security guard from the shelter home.

KIDNAPPING

1) Two and half-year-old abducted victim rehabilitated with his mother

Nikhil, age two and half years, was living with his mother in their maternal home in Mewat district, Haryana. His parents were separated. Two months ago, Nikhil was abducted by his father from their maternal house. The mother called CHILDLINE on 1098 requesting help to gain custody of Nikhil. Being away from her child, the mother was traumatized. She had also approached the police, but they did not take any action. Then CHILDLINE team member contacted the father

who confirmed that he had custody of the boy. The father said that he would return the child to the mother only after his sister's marriage. Since the mother's health was deteriorating, the CHILDLINE team insisted on returning Nikhil to the mother. But the father refused to return the child. Then, CHILDLINE informed the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) about the case. The CWC recommended conducting a rescue operation. The CHILDLINE team along with other relatives reached the father's house to take Nikhil's custody. After a series of discussions, the father handed over Nikhil to CHILDLINE. Then, Nikhil was presented before the CWC who ordered CHILDLINE to restore Nikhil with his mother. After completion of the due diligence process, Nikhil was reunited with his mother. They thanked the CHILDLINE team for their support.

CHILD TRAFFICKING

Child trafficking racket busted

Lavanya aged 25 years, was a resident of Vishakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh. She had conceived the child through a partner outside her marriage. Ms Jhansi resident of the same colony lured her and offered 2.55 lakhs and free hospitalization charges if she sold the baby to her after delivery to which agreed promptly. Lavanya delivered a baby boy in the local hospital in Visakhapatnam. As per the agreement, Lavanya handed over the boy to Ms Jhansi for money.

Soon, Lavanya longed for her baby boy and asked Jhansi to hand over the child with the promise of returning the money. But Jhansi threatened her with serious consequences, if she demanded to return the baby. She then approached CHILDLINE requesting support to get her baby back from child traffickers. CHILDLINE Visakhapatnam approached the local police to file FIR against Ms Jhansi and the local hospital. The SHO of the police station, directed Ms Jhansi to recover the baby and handover to the mother. Ms Jhansi returned the child to the mother. CHILDLINE Visakhapatnam brought this incident to the notice of the Child Welfare Committee for thorough inquiry on activities of the local hospital. Subsequently, Child Welfare Committee requested the police department to probe further. In the police inquiry, it was found that the hospital authorities have been conducting regular medical camps in northern Andhra Pradesh to identify destitute women with unwanted pregnancies through local agents and ASHA workers. They offered the destitute women free medical help and other financial benefits. After procuring the children, the higher authorities of the hospital had been selling these babies to rich childless parents and provided them with fake birth certificates from Municipal authorities. The police have arrested six persons including two ASHA workers and the MD of the hospital. So far it was found that the hospital administration has sold six babies and further probe is going on.

COVID-19 RELATED ASSISTANCE

1) CHILDLINE provides nutritional support to a family in need

CHILDLINE Anantnag, Jammu and Kashmir, received a call from a concerned adult informing about a child and his family in need of nutritional support. The father of the child was a daily wage earner and due to the extension of the lockdown, he was unable to find any work. This led to the deterioration of their financial situation. After verification of the case and collecting relevant information, CHILDLINE team visited the child's house and provided dry ration kit to the family. The child and his family were extremely happy to receive the food kit and thanked the CHILDLINE team.

2) Supporting a family whose medical treatment took a financial toll

On August 27th, CHILDLINE Pudukkottai, Tamil Nadu received information about a child aged 14 years, whose family was in financial distress and needed support with food. On enquiring, the team found out the entire family including the child, her three siblings and the parents (who were agricultural labourers) had tested positive for COVID-19, after which they had been admitted for treatment in Pudukkottai Medical College for over 10 days. While they had been discharged on August 20th, they had been asked to quarantine at home for another two weeks. However, with no work and what the family had already spent on hospitalization, the family did not have any money to buy food, and as a result were starving. CHILDLINE visited the family on August 28th and handed over rice and groceries. The parents and the children are in a happier situation now.

3) One more family of migrant labourers rescued from the brink of starvation

In May 2020, CHILDLINE 1098 received a call from a helpless father whose three children had been starving for 3 days. Hailing from Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh, Prashant Sinha came to Vapi, Gujarat nine years ago, to work in a company. Five months ago, he brought his 3 children, Samir age 11 years, Akash age 6 years and Vikram 4 years old to his residence in Vapi-Valsad. During the initial days of the COVID -19 outbreak, the factory owner gave the father some money and daily necessities. But soon the owner stopped helping them and they ran out of resources and the money. The CHILDLINE team member working on this case coordinated with the district administration authorities to arrange for ration and food items for the family. Within no time, the DSP of Valsad sent his team with all the ration and food items to the family. On receiving groceries from the police, the father immediately informed CHILDLINE and thanked for co-ordinating and arranging for food.

EDUCATION SPONSORSHIP

1) Aiding a special needs child in studying online

CHILDLINE Trivandrum, Kerala received information from the Kerala State Child Rights Commission about a 12-year-old child suffering from osteoporosis, a serious physical disability. Based on the information, CHILDLINE conducted a home study of the child. The child belonged to a poor family, and her father, who was a flower-seller, was the sole earning member of the family. The COVID-19 situation had made the family's financial condition more vulnerable. Since the child was under medical treatment, she hadn't been able to attend school for a long time. With classes being conducted online, she wanted to start studying again, and had reached out to the SCPCR via mail requesting for support with a laptop and internet connectivity.

One of the CHILDLINE coordinators was a member of a WhatsApp group called 'Each One Teach One'. He shared the child's predicament on the group, following which a sponsor from Botswana came forward to support the child. With the donation, CHILDLINE purchased an HP laptop worth Rs 20,000 and on August 7th handed over the laptop to the child. She has started attending classes now. The KSCPCR also congratulated the CHILDLINE team for mobilising aid for to support the child's education.

CHILD LABOUR

1) CHILDLINE Madhubani rescues 29 child labourers

On 20th May 2020, CHILDLINE Madubani, Bihar received information from CHILDLINE Jaipur, Rajasthan about a group of child labourers traveling in Jaipur-Madhubani train – a special train for transporting migrant labourers. The train was arriving in Madhubani on 21st May 2020. CHILDLINE Madubani immediately swung into action and informed the District Magistrate (DM), Assistant Director of Child Protection, Child Welfare Committee (CWC), RPF and GRP of Madhubani Railway Station. On 21st May 2020, CHILDLINE along with the team of district administration and health department, rushed to the railway station in the morning and rescued 29 child labourers. The NCPCR (National Commission for the Protection of Child Rights) and the SCPCR (State Commission for the Protection of Child Rights) have been actively involved in monitoring of the case. The rescued children were provided refreshments and given short-term shelter in the Child Care Institution (CCI). The children were counselled by CHILDLINE counsellor. Then, the children were produced before CWC who passed the order for the restoration of children. CHILDLINE is in touch with the children on regular basis for their rehabilitation and

reintegration. The coordination between CHILDLINE Jaipur and CHILDLINE Madhubani to rescue the child labourers has proved that CHILDLINE is the biggest child protection network and the safety net for the children of our country.

2) When a 14-year-old is made to work as the caretaker of a baby

CHILDLINE Faridabad, Haryana received information about a young girl who was working as a domestic worker. A joint team rescued the child from the house and counselled her. She shared that she was 14-years-old and had come to work as the caretaker for a baby around 15 days prior. She was in the 7th standard in a private school and lived with her parents, who were migrants. She also stated that she had not received any compensation so far. As per proceedings initiated by the police, an FIR was registered under Section 79 of the Juvenile Justice Act. CHILDLINE also ensured that the child underwent a medical examination, following which she was presented before the CWC. She was handed over to her parents after they were counselled.

3) Five children rescued from a bangle factory

On February 10th, CHILDLINE Mumbai, Maharashtra received a tip about five minor children who were working in a bangle factory. The team carried out a recce of the location to confirm the tip. A letter was submitted to the Labour Department and the SJPU was also informed so that the local police station could be alerted. On February 23rd, a rescue operation was carried out in coordination with the Labour Department, SJPU, local police and a local community member who knew the location of the factory. Five children were thereafter rescued from the factory and brought to the Malad police station. A Tamil translator was brought in to communicate with the children, who shared that there were from Tamil Nadu and had been sent by their parents to work. They also shared that their working hours were from 9 am to 10 pm and that were being paid between Rs 8,000-9,000 as monthly wages. While three children had been sent by their families to work, two children were brought in by the factory owner who was acquainted with their families in Tamil Nadu. As per the CWC's direction, the children were transferred to a Children's Home and an FIR was filed against the factory owner.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

All through the COVID-19 pandemic and during the nationwide lockdown, CHILDLINE 1098 was operational round-the-clock, to ensure that children in distress had access to protective services. For CHILDLINE, the past year was a reminder to remain steadfast in its mission to ensure the safety and well-being of children in need of care and protection.

CHILDLINE was also compelled to step beyond its mandate of child protection alone, to assist other vulnerable communities in distress. The reverse distress migration that followed the lockdown, saw hundreds of thousands of migrant workers desperately fleeing cities and towns, trying to return to their hometowns in rural India. With public transportation at a standstill, many attempted the arduous journey on foot, families in tow. Additionally, there were several disasters in the midst of the COVID-19 crisis which also caused large scale displacement – the gas leak in Vishakhapatnam, Cyclone Amphan in East India, the Bagjhan Oil Spill in Assam, monsoon flooding and landslides across many states, etc.

Due to the collaborative manner in which the CHILDLINE network functions, CHILDLINE teams were able to respond immediately to vulnerable populations affected by the COVID-19 crisis and other disasters, by working closely with district administrations, community health workers, other government departments and civil society organisations, to ensure that they had access to emergency relief services, including food and safety kits.

CHILDLINE Anantanag, amidst COVID-19 outbreak suspended all the outdoor activities including outreaches and open house programmes. However, CHILDLINE Anantanag was determined in providing help to all those who were affected due to the pandemic. They provided health check-up, medicines and dry ration kits and offered online counseling sessions to children who weren't able to cope up during the crisis. Face masks and hand sanitizers were provided to the communities and hospital authorities from time to time.

Awareness sessions on preventative measures against COVID-19 were conducted. The importance and steps of proper hand washing was being demonstrated among the masses. The use of face masks and importance of social distancing was also highlighted. Besides this an array of activities were conducted in order to keep children engaged during lockdown.

CHILDLINE KNOWLEDGE HUB

The CHILDLINE Knowledge Hub (CKH) is the research, training and policy advocacy hub at CHILDLINE India Foundation. It was set up in September 2016 with the objective to initiate and strengthen research; build knowledge and skills regarding protocols, laws and legislations that guide interventions through training; and provide policy inputs, through three primary functions - Capacity Building, Research and Policy Advocacy. The intent was to strengthen CHILDLINE's understanding of the existing protection needs of children, build knowledge and skills among the CHILDLINE network, and integrate the programme with the overall Child Protection Services structure.

This section captures the diverse ways in which the CHILDLINE Knowledge Hub has contributed towards strengthening the CHILDLINE network and the larger child protection ecosystem over the last year, with the support of partners such as UNICEF, HCL Foundation, NIMHANS and others.

1) PARTNERSHIP WITH UNICEF

A Brief History

UNICEF has been a key partner and strategic alliance of CHILDLINE India Foundation from July 2018 onwards. It has added enormous strength to CHILDLINE's efforts, specifically by extending support to strengthen the CHILDLINE Knowledge Hub, and in turn, the larger CHILDLINE network and child protection ecosystem.

From 2018 to 2020, the partnership with UNICEF helped CIF carry out Training Needs Assessment to understand the gaps in knowledge, skills and attitudes among CHILDLINE personnel, and create a cadre Training of Master Trainers (MTs) within CIF, who could be deployed to train the 11,000+ workforce of CHILDLINE functionaries, contact centre operators and others. A group of the MTs amongst these were trained on Personal Safety, post which they trained over 20,000 teacher trainers under Ministry of Education's NISHTHA (National Initiative for School Heads and Teachers' Holistic Advancement) programme.

Following the Delhi riots in early-2020, the CKH initiated discussions with UNICEF to provide psychosocial support to children impacted by the riots, following which UNICEF organised a training for a larger pool of CHILDLINE personnel, which resulted in the recognition of the need for a manual focused on Psychosocial Care and Well-being of Children. In March 2021, in the light of the burgeoning COVID-19 crisis,

CHILDLINE in collaboration with UNICEF and Protsahan developed the 'Manual for Parents and Caregivers to Provide Psychosocial Support for Children during COVID-19'.

2020-2021: The Year That Was

While the second phase of the partnership with UNICEF was intended to focus on the finalisation of the training manuals and handholding MTs as they rolled out the training for CHILDLINE teams, the onset of COVID-19 pandemic necessitated the addition of several activities to the plan. CHILDLINE needed to view programme activities from the lens of the health and socio-economic crisis that was unfolding and its impact on not only children, but also on CHILDLINE's frontlines teams who would be extending care and protection to these children. Accordingly, programme activities were tweaked to address the urgent needs brought to the fore by the pandemic.

COVID-19 Response

- **PSS Manual:** The 'Manual for Parents and Caregivers to Provide Psychosocial Support for Children during COVID-19' was translated into 18 languages, followed by zonal consultations in May 2020 to orient partners on using the manual. The manual has been used widely by child protection practitioners both within and outside of the CHILDLINE network in their engagement with children and other stakeholders.
- **PPE Material:** UNICEF extended in-kind support to CHILDLINE by providing nearly 33,000 sanitisers for all CHILDLINE personnel. Additionally, UNICEF also roped in IKEA, who supported CHILDLINE teams with 22,000 face masks and 11,000 face shields. This enabled CHILDLINE teams to take the necessary precautions during outreach and interventions, especially in the first couple of months of the pandemic.

Capacity Building

- **Virtual Training:** Given the restrictions on mobility due to which in-person training could not be held, CIF transitioned all its training activities to a virtual mode using the Zoom platform.
- **Training of Master Trainers:** 50 CIF personnel attended the Training of Master Trainers (MTs) for which New Concept was brought on board as the technical partner. The MTs were trained on five key child protection themes (Child Marriage, Trafficking, Child Labour, Psychological First Aid,

Ending Violence against Children), through the course of which training manuals on these themes were also finalised.

- **Partner Training:** New Concept thereafter handheld the MTs as they rolled out the training for CHILDLINE Partners. By end-March 2021, nearly 900 coordinators and team members from the CHILDLINE network had been trained by MTs across 16 training sessions.

Other Institutional Support

- UNICEF also connected CHILDLINE with NASSCOM Foundation, which under its Connecting for Good flagship programme in collaboration with Vodafone Idea Foundation, developed a technology solution in the domain of child protection, which is slated for launch around May-June 2021. This technology solution includes:

- **A Case Reporting System** which enables partners to enter case details into a mobile/ desktop-based application, which will automatically be updated on the CRM at the backend, allowing for more efficient response.

- **A Learning Management System** through which knowledge and skill can be built across the CHILDLINE network at scale through a virtual platform. With New Concept's support, eight e-learning modules (Understanding communication; Interpersonal & Group Communication; Communication with Children; Communication with Government/Agencies; Protocol/Call response/Case Management; Child Rights, Child Protection & Child Sexual Abuse; Acts related to Child Rights - POCSO, JJ Act and CPS; Role of CIF in Dealing with Children in Emergencies and Disasters) were also developed for the LMS.

2) PARTNERSHIP WITH HCL FOUNDATION

At the outset of the pandemic, CIF realised that it was essential to extend support to CHILDLINE staff with respect to mental health and self care, given the challenging times they were working in. With support from HCL Foundation, CIF roped in Counsel to Secure Justice (CSJ) and The Alternative Story (TAS) to build capacity for self care among staff and prevent burnout, through a series of webinars, training sessions and support circles.

Engagement with The Alternative Story (TAS)

The Alternative Story organised a series of webinars on various subjects related to mental health for child care practitioners from September 2020 to March 2021. A total of 25 webinars were organised across nine topics in multiple languages including English, Hindi Malayalam, Kannada and Marathi, which were cumulatively attended by over

6,000 participants from CIF and CHILLDINE staff. While the webinars were conducted on the Zoom platform, they were also streamed on CIF's YouTube channel for wider reach.

The Alternative Story also developed a Learning Management System, through which CIF personnel will have access to e-learning courses on topics related to mental health and well-being.

Engagement with Counsel to Secure Justice (CSJ)

Counsel to Secure Justice carried out training sessions for over 1,000 Contact Centre Operators and CHILDLINE Counsellors on Counselling and Self Care from October 2020 to January 2021.

CSJ also facilitated Support Circles for CIF staff across January and February 2021. These Support/Compassion Circles were based on the premise that creating spaces for people to talk about challenging experiences with others who have had similar experiences, would help reduce their adverse impact and promote emotional well-being. 60 CIF personnel including CICs and CCOs participated in these Support Circles.

3) PARTNERSHIP WITH NIMHANS

The National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS), under its SAMVAD (Support, Advocacy & Mental health interventions for children in Vulnerable circumstances And Distress) initiative that was supported by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India, organised a comprehensive online training programme on “Basic Child Psychosocial & Mental Health Care for Children in Difficult Circumstances”.

The main objective of this initiative was to integrate child and adolescent mental health and wellbeing into existing child protection intervention and policy of CHILDLINE and to equip the CHILDLINE team with skills to make decisions about the children’s care, protection, treatment, and rehabilitation. A total of 18 sessions were held between November 2020 and January 2021, with cumulative participation from 550 trainees.

The CKH team also undertook the following activities.

- Creation of a Data Analysis Plan piloted in West Bengal

CHILD PROTECTION CONCERNS MAP

CHILDLINE India Foundation had prepared the 'Child Vulnerability Map' - a district-wise map depicting problems faced by children across the country, which had been launched by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, as part of the National Plan of Action for Children in January 2019. At the time, it covered 409 of a total of 678 districts in the country, and mapped key child protection concerns including Child Marriage, Child Trafficking, Missing and Runaway Children, Child Labour, Child Abuse, etc. This was envisioned as a planning tool which would enable district officials to match services designed for children with the issues prevalent in their respective regions.

CHILDLINE India Foundation has since digitised the Child Vulnerability Map, which is now called the 'Child Protection Concerns Map'. It now depicts the district-wise child protection concerns across all districts in the country where CHILDLINE 1098 services are operational (598 districts as of 31st March, 2021). The list of child protection concerns has also been revised to include those additional concerns

which are being reported on CHILDLINE 1098. The Child Protection Concerns Map currently highlights a total of 18 child protection concerns or vulnerabilities including Child Marriage, Child Labour, Child Trafficking, Child Sexual Abuse, Commercial Sex Exploitation, Nutrition and Health, Physical and Emotional Well-being, Education, Online Safety, Children in Contact with the Street, Children Found Begging, Missing and Runaway Children, Children Affected by Disaster, Children Affected by Civil Unrest, Children Affected by Substance Abuse, Children in Conflict with the Law, HIV/AIDS-affected Children and Other Issues. The information on the child protection concerns is captured by CHILDLINE teams after they have assisted children and provided them with the necessary services based on their needs.

This Child Protection Concerns Map will be used as a planning tool by CIF and CHILDLINE teams to determine key child protection concerns that are prevalent at the district-level and prepare the district action plans accordingly.

SENSITIZATION OF ALLIED SYSTEMS

CHILDLINE's pledge and primacy is crafting a protective environment for the country's children. There is a dire need to ensure that Child Protection and Child Rights are understood and practised by all stakeholders. Catalyzing allied systems including the Police, Health Care Organizations, Educational Institutions, Transport Undertakings, Telecom, Media and NGOs who have a large stake in child protection is vital in order to create a more sensitive and proactive society.

RESOURCE MOBILISATION

The Resource Mobilisation team mobilised over Rs 2.64 crores of funds in FY 20-21, over and above the Government of India grant that CIF receives under the Child Protection Services Scheme (erstwhile Integrated Child Protection Scheme). In addition to the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India, other major donors/partners include UNICEF, Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives, HCL Foundation, NASSCOM Foundation, Omidyar Network India, British Asian India Foundation, Uber, among others.

The past year also saw the Resource Mobilisation grow to its full strength with individuals managers taking the lead on the fundraising verticals.

1) INSTITUTIONAL PARTNERSHIPS:

a) UNICEF supported CIF with a grant of INR 1.13 crore to strengthen the activities of the CHILDLINE Knowledge Hub and also its COVID-19 Response.

i) CHILDLINE Knowledge Hub: 50 CIF personnel were trained as Master Trainers on five themes (for which training manuals were developed) - Child Marriage, Child Labour, Trafficking, Ending Violence against Children and Psychosocial First Aid, as well as skill-based training related to Process Documentation and a Refresher TOT, post which the Master Trainers started organising thematic training sessions for the CHILDLINE partner network. The aid from UNICEF also enabled CIF to transition all its capacity building activities to a virtual mode.

ii) COVID-19 Response: UNICEF's support also enabled CIF to develop the 'Manual for Parents and Caregivers to Provide Psychosocial Support for Children during COVID-19' in collaboration with Protsahan. This manual was translated into 17 languages and has since been used widely by child protection practitioners both within and outside of the CHILDLINE network to engage with children and other stakeholders. Additionally, UNICEF (with support from IKEA) also made an in-kind contribution of PPE materials (masks, sanitisers and face shield) for the 11,000+ strong CHILDLINE workforce.

iii) Technology: Vodafone India Foundation and NASSCOM Foundation partnered with UNICEF and CHILDLINE to develop a technology solution in the domain of child protection, exclusively for CHILDLINE India Foundation. The solution includes a desktop and mobile-based solution for case reporting and a learning management

system, both of which would be rolled out among the partner network, to bring in operational efficiency in both case management and training. The solution will start being rolled out among the CHILDLINE network in 2021.

b) Azim Premji Foundation (APF), which has pledged INR 30 crore over a period of 6 years (up to 2023), continued to support the Programme for Children in Contact with Railway Stations. As a result, CIF was able to continue implementing the programme across 7 category A stations (in Mumbai, Delhi, Chennai, Bengaluru, Kolkata, Varanasi and Patna) and this went a long way in responding to the needs of vulnerable groups during the lockdown, especially migrant workers and their families who congregated at these stations in an effort to board the special shramik trains. APF's support of INR 20.8 crore over 5 years, has also been instrumental for CIF in its Organisational Development and for the expansion of the Resource Mobilisation team.

c) HCL Foundation's grant of INR 47.50 lakh enabled CIF to build capacity for self-care among staff during the pandemic, through a series of webinars, training sessions and support circles. Through this partnership, CIF brought on board The Alternative Story to organise a series of webinars on various subjects related to mental health for child care practitioners, and Counsel to Secure Justice to carry out special trainings for Contact Centre Operators and CHILDLINE counsellors on Counselling and Self Care .

d) Omidyar Network India's support to CIF through its Rapid Response Funding Initiative was instrumental in enabling CIF to meet the incremental operational costs during the lockdown. This allowed CIF to arrange for safe passage for its CHILDLINE Contact Centre officers, which in turn, ensured calls to 1098 were being answered round-the-clock.

e) British Asian India Foundation's support played a key role in enabling CHILDLINE to digitise operations such as Donor Management and Partner Management, thereby improving operational efficiency.

2) CORPORATE DONORS:

a) In October 2020, Uber came on board to extend mobility support to CHILDLINE personnel, including Contact Centre Officers. This included 30,000 free cab rides worth INR 63 lakh, that could be used by CHILDLINE personnel across 83 locations where Uber operates.

b) Burns and McDonnell's support enabled CHILDLINE teams in Mumbai to distribute emergency rations to vulnerable communities in and around Mumbai.

3) EVENTS:

a) The Hope Run: CIF partnered with The Hands of Hope Foundation to organise "The Hope Run - Run to Figh Child Abuse", the first pan-India virtual run to raise awareness on issues on child abuse. Over INR 10,000 was mobilised through the event.

b) Tata Mumbai Marathon: While the Tata Mumbai Marathon was cancelled due to the pandemic, several donors mobilised funds to the tune of over INR 40,000 through United Way of Mumbai for CHILDLINE's COVID-19 fundraiser.

c) Other events: On special occasions such as Daan Utsav, CHILDLINE Se Dosti, Christmas, etc, CIF brought in members of the public to host special events ranging from baking classes and music and dance workshops, to online plays and carol singing, to create awareness and raise funds for CHILDLINE. Of special note are the online

play on mental wellness, 'Confined in the Teenage Mind', performed by the students of the Theatre Club at RBK International Academy, Mumbai, and 'Sweet Treats', a baking workshop which was conducted by 14-year-old Renaya. Over INR 75,000 was raised through these online events.

4) DIGITAL:

CIF raised INR 23.16 lakh through online donations from a total of 2,260 individuals. Of the total online donations, INR 10.87 lakh was raised directly through the CIF website. By end-March 2020, being cognisant of the looming COVID-19 crisis, a special fundraiser was also created on the website, through which INR 1.9 lakh was raised for COVID-19 response. Additionally, the team also created fundraising campaigns on digital platforms such as GivelIndia, Ketto, ImpactGuru and Milaap.

5) HNI:

The HNI fundraising vertical kicked off in end-2020-21, and CIF raised INR 20.32 lakh through five individual donors.

PROGRAMME FOR CHILDREN IN CONTACT WITH RAILWAY STATIONS

SUPPORTED BY AZIM PREMJI FOUNDATION

In January 2016, Azim Premji Foundation (APF) expressed its desire to support CHILDLINE India Foundation towards the activities that will strengthen the CHILDLINE's initiatives. The scope of support ranged from prevention to long-term rehabilitation services for the most vulnerable children and for the strengthening of CHILDLINE India Foundation. APF is committed for supporting the activities across 20 Railway Stations across India, out of which 7 have been already supported in a phased manner.

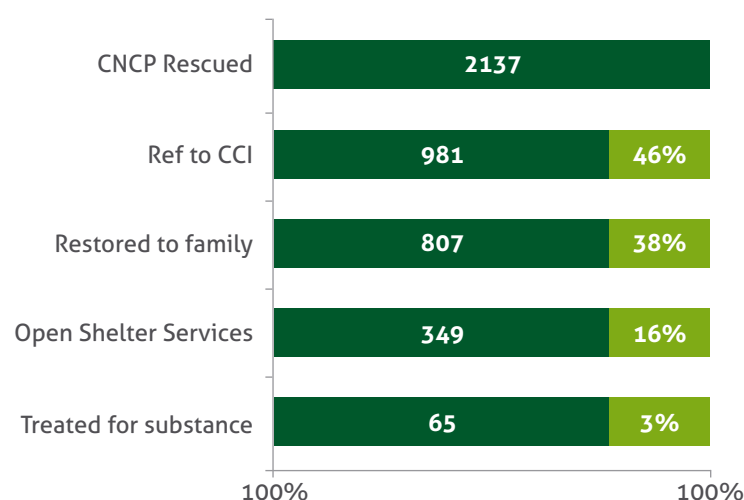
In 2017, the support was first extended to Howrah and Chennai Stations followed by 5 other stations including Old Delhi, Patna, Bengaluru, Varanasi and CSMT. Since inception of the programme, the team managed to reach and rescue 17508. Children in need of Care and Protection, as of 31st March, 2021. Year-on-Year our initiatives and strategies have expanded our reach, for instance 2017-18 = 1621, 2018-2019 = 6324, 2019 – 2020 = 7426, 2020 – 2021 = 2137 (Cumulative up to March 31, 2021 = 17,508 (our reach)

The following activities with 7 Station Level Partners, facilitated support in rescuing children with the stakeholders in 2020-20201:

- ✓ Sensitising and training RPF/GRPF officials
- ✓ Sensitising and training of railway commercial staff
- ✓ Conducting regular Child Help Group meetings with senior railway officials
- ✓ Creating awareness on Child Safety Net with commuters etc.
- ✓ Conducting Children Day Activities and other events
- ✓ Promoting Child Friendly Railway Stations

The programme specifically caters to children who need temporary shelter through its State of the art - Open Shelter Homes situated nearby the railway stations and Moving Satellite teams. Extending support for substance abuse and de-addiction services to children in need, and helping to foster social inclusion of children in society.

During the year 2020-2021, the PCCRS team managed to reach about 2137 children in need of care and protection during the pandemic.

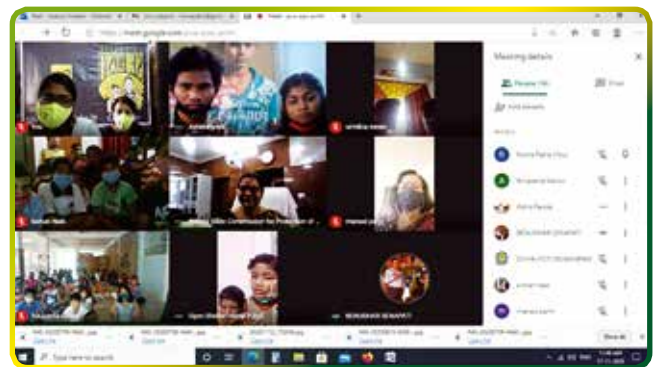

Significant Accounting Policies:

- a) The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India and the applicable Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

All Income and Expenditure items in the financial statement are recognised on accrual basis except of grant & donation.

- b) Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes all expenses relating to acquisition and installation of these assets. Fixed assets acquired out of the amounts received from donors towards specific projects are charged to the relevant project and accounted in the Fixed Assets schedule at a nominal value of Re.1 with a corresponding entry in sundry receipts of the same amount. Assets received free (as donations) are carried at nominal value.
- c) Depreciation is charged as per the method and rate as per the Income Tax Act, 1961. Depreciation on fixed assets has been charged to the Income and Expenditure Account.
- d) Assest purchased below Rupees Ten Thousand are expensed out during the year.
- e) Donations received for restricted revenue funds are taken to the 'Funds and Liabilities' in the Balance Sheet. Expenses incurred are disclosed under the head "Expenses on the Objects of the Trust" with an equivalent amount disclosed under the head "Transfer from Earmarked Funds" in the Income and Expenditure Account. Amount received towards purchase of Fixed Assets, are shown under 'Earmarked Funds' and expenditure incurred, if any, will be debited to such earmarked fund.

NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

- a) Block Grant received from the Government of India and recorded as liability at the time of receipt, is disbursed to Partner Organisations on the basis of signed agreements between Childline India Foundation and Partner Organisations.

The liability is reduced by disbursements made/payable to Partner Organisations. The expenditures of Partner Organisations are certified by professional accountants. The Management of Childline India Foundation relies on these utilization certificates and other related documents.

- b) Fees payable to Charity Commissioner amounting to Rs.1,17,14,081/- for the years ended 31st March 2009 to 2021 has not been paid, as the authorities under instructions of the Bombay High Court are not collecting the fees.
- c) With effect from 1st August 2012, the Governing Board of the foundation has established a Staff Welfare Fund for the benefit of employees with an initial contribution of Rs.25 Lacs by transferring the said amount from the Income & Expenditure Account.

Going forward, as per the decision of the governing board, 10% of the annual surplus would be transferred to the Staff Welfare Fund, subject to a maximum annual contribution of Rs.10 Lacs.

- d) Foundation has complied with the provision of EPF and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 w.e.f 01.02.2020. It has deposited PF contribution Rs.2,09,715 on behalf of employees (Employee's contribution) till 31st January ,2020 though the same has not been deducted from the salary of respective employees. Since Foundation followed "take home structure" instead of CTC it will be difficult for staff to bear the entire employee PF at one go, hence it is decided by the management to recover the same in next 2 years. During the financial year 2020-21, foundation has recovered Rs.1,08,148 and balance amount will be recovered in next financial year.
- e) Previous year figures are regrouped wherever necessary to conform to this year's classification.
